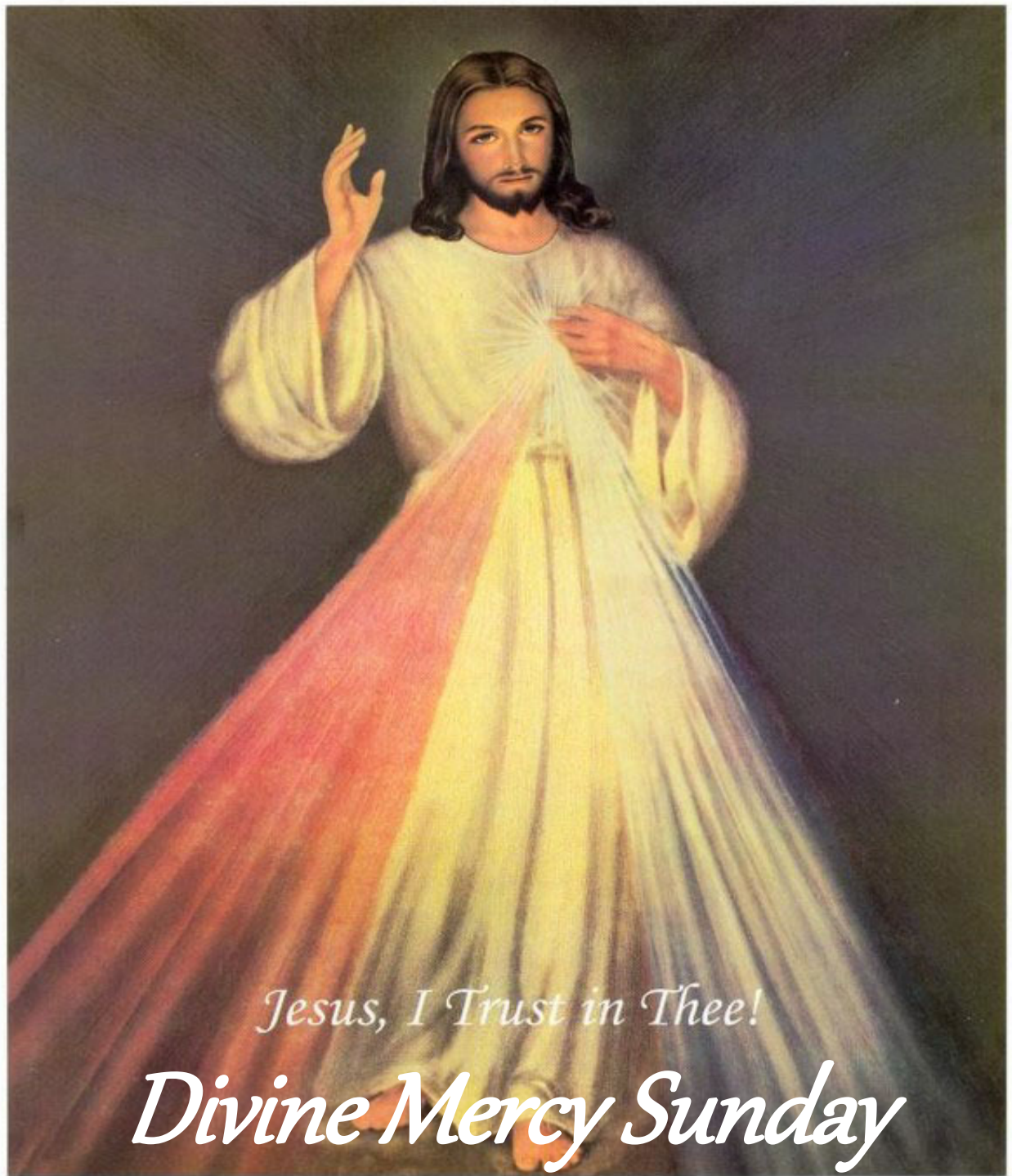

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Deacon's Corner - Divine Mercy Sunday (A) - 2017

“Mercy is the trait of those who realize their own weakness enough to be kind to those who are struggling with theirs. It is, as well, the measure of the God-life in us.” Sr. Joan Chittister’s “God’s Tender Mercy”

In 1938, in the middle of a swamp just outside Berlin, the Nazis established a concentration camp exclusively for women called Ravensbruck. By the kind of WWII, 50,00 women had died there. Some died from exhaustion in the slave labor camp. Others perished from the harsh, crowded living conditions. Still others died as a result of cruel medical and biological experiments too horrible to imagine.

When Ravensbruck was liberated, a piece of paper was found near the body of a dead child. Scrawled on the paper was this prayer:

***“O God, remember not only the women and men of goodwill,
but also those of ill will.***

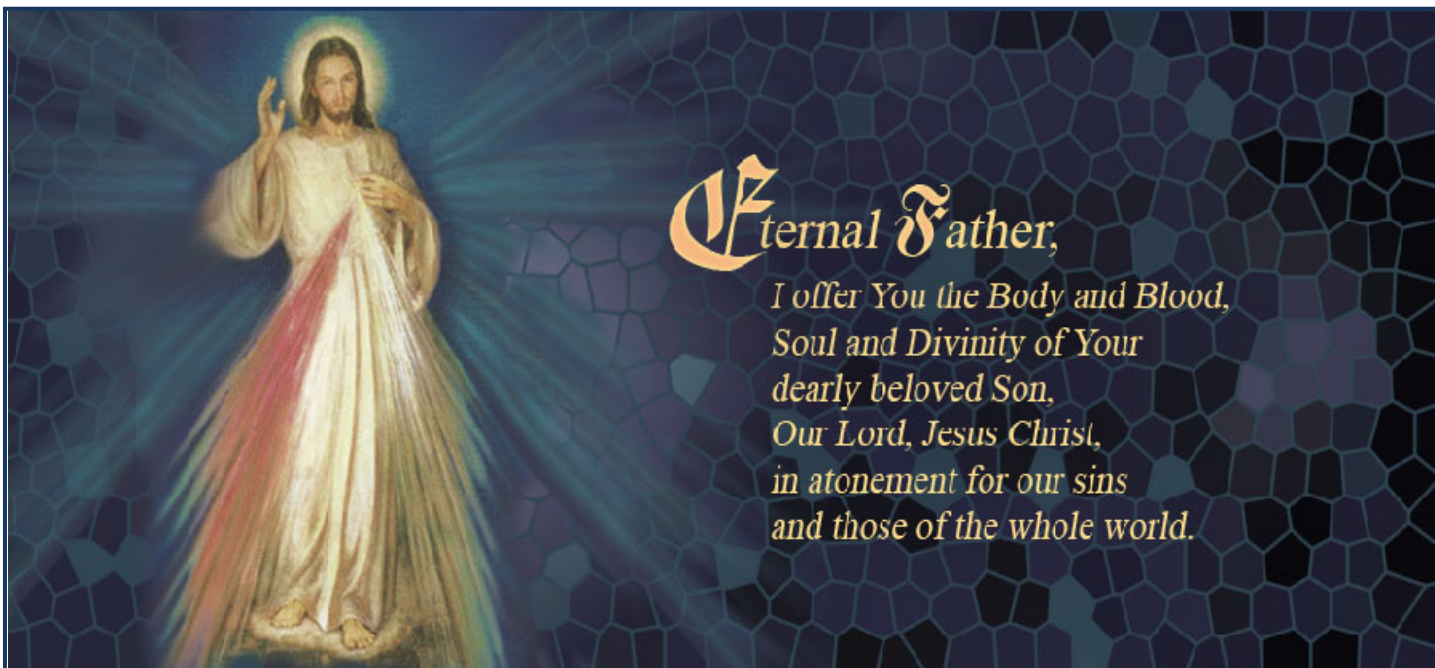
***Do not remember the suffering they have uninflected on us,
remember the fruits we bought thanks to this suffering:
our comradeship, our loyalty, our humility, our courage;
the generosity, the greatness of heart that has grown out of all this.
And when they come to judgment, let all the fruits that we have borne
be their forgiveness. Amen. Amen. Amen.”***

Whoever scribbled that prayer on that piece of paper at Ravensbruck had taken the message of mercy deep into her heart. Pray on this Divine Mercy Sunday that we commit ourselves more and more to such an ideal.

“Be merciful as your God is merciful.” (Lk 6:36)
