

A LETTER FROM FATHER LAURENT

Dear parishioners,

As we all know, when our Lord Jesus Christ began His public ministry, He invited the people to repent and believe the good news/Gospel that the kingdom of God/reign of God, is at hand. He challenged the people to make a radically change their lives to accept Jesus and His message and therefore be open for the reign of God in them. This is the reign of God or kingdom of God which Jesus came to inaugurate from the time of his public ministry onwards.

The kingdom of God is a spiritual kingdom in which we accept God's reign in our lives and lead our lives according to His will. Since this kingdom of God is a spiritual kingdom, we cannot see it with our own physical natural eyes as we can see the ordinary kingdoms in the world with geographical area and space. To understand well the kingdom of God requires a lot of spiritual insight/revelation. That is why our Lord, Jesus Christ tried His best in different methods to make this understood and accepted.

One of the methods Jesus used in teaching about the kingdom of God was parables. Parables are stories which Jesus (as well as other rabbis) used in teaching. It was a common method of the time. Jesus used parables to expose some truths of the kingdom of God through images or pictures from the ordinary life situations of His people to challenge them to think seriously, to decide wisely, and to act accordingly in connection to the kingdom of God.

Why did Jesus turn to this method of using parables in His teaching about God's kingdom? In the Gospel according to Matthew, chapter 13, we find a group of parables which the evangelist put together, showing Jesus' teaching on the kingdom of God through parables. (Remember our Sunday Gospel for three consecutive Sundays, the 15th, 16th and 17th Sundays of Ordinary Time, are from this chapter).

When we follow the Gospel account according to Matthew up to chapter 12 we find Jesus teaching about God's kingdom, inviting people to accept Him and His kingdom. But many refused to accept Jesus and His kingdom through His teaching about the Kingdom of God. So Jesus' shift to the method of using parables (Mt. 13) was His attempt to make the kingdom of God more understood and more valued. Jesus clarified that those who refused to accept Him and His message/kingdom did so because of their hardness of their hearts. The use of parables showed that disciples were granted knowledge to understand and accept Jesus and His teachings and therefore the kingdom of God continued to grow in them.

In the course of learning, the disciples who thought they understood everything Jesus taught them, gave the impression that disciples of Jesus (the Church) is a perfect community. Some parables were given to correct this misunderstanding. The parables of wheat among weeds or net thrown in the sea that collects all sorts of fish throw light to understand that the Church of Christ is of righteous and wicked whose separation will take place on the day of judgement.

Praise be Jesus Christ.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

July 2020

Natural Family Planning Awareness week is the annual national educational campaign sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) to promote Natural Family Planning (NFP). This year, NFP Awareness week will be celebrated from July 19 through July 25 under the theme: *Live the truth and beauty of God's plan for married love!* The campaign offers us a wonderful opportunity to share the good news about God's perfect design for marriage and responsible parenting.

In sacramental marriage we are called to live with Christ-like love; to freely give of ourselves as a gift to our beloved. Married love is fundamentally a call to fruitfulness and, in response to this call, the Church proposes Natural Family Planning. Today's NFP provides a modern, scientific method available to couples for planning their families by enabling them to participate in God's creative action without breaking the inseparable link between the unitive and procreative meanings of the conjugal (marital) act. As NFP becomes a way of life, husbands and wives cooperate with each other and with God in responsibly planning their family and avoid the devastating spiritual and physical harm caused by artificial contraceptive methods.

During Natural Family Planning Awareness week, we also celebrate the 52nd anniversary of the papal encyclical *Humanae Vitae*. Issued in 1968 by Pope Paul VI, this encyclical prophetically articulates the grave consequences of the use of artificial and illicit means of birth control, including a general lowering of morality, increased infidelity, and devaluing of women (*HV*, no. 17). Unfortunately, today's headlines confirm the devastating accuracy of his predictions and demonstrate the destructive consequences for our families. In contrast, couples who practice NFP enjoy greater marital stability and suffer divorce at only a fraction of the rate of divorce among first time marriages overall.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank those married couples who live out their marriage commitment to free, total, faithful and fruitful love. I encourage all married couples and those preparing for marriage to reflect on their current or future marriages and how they can authentically and responsibly fulfill their commitment to fruitful love. 
