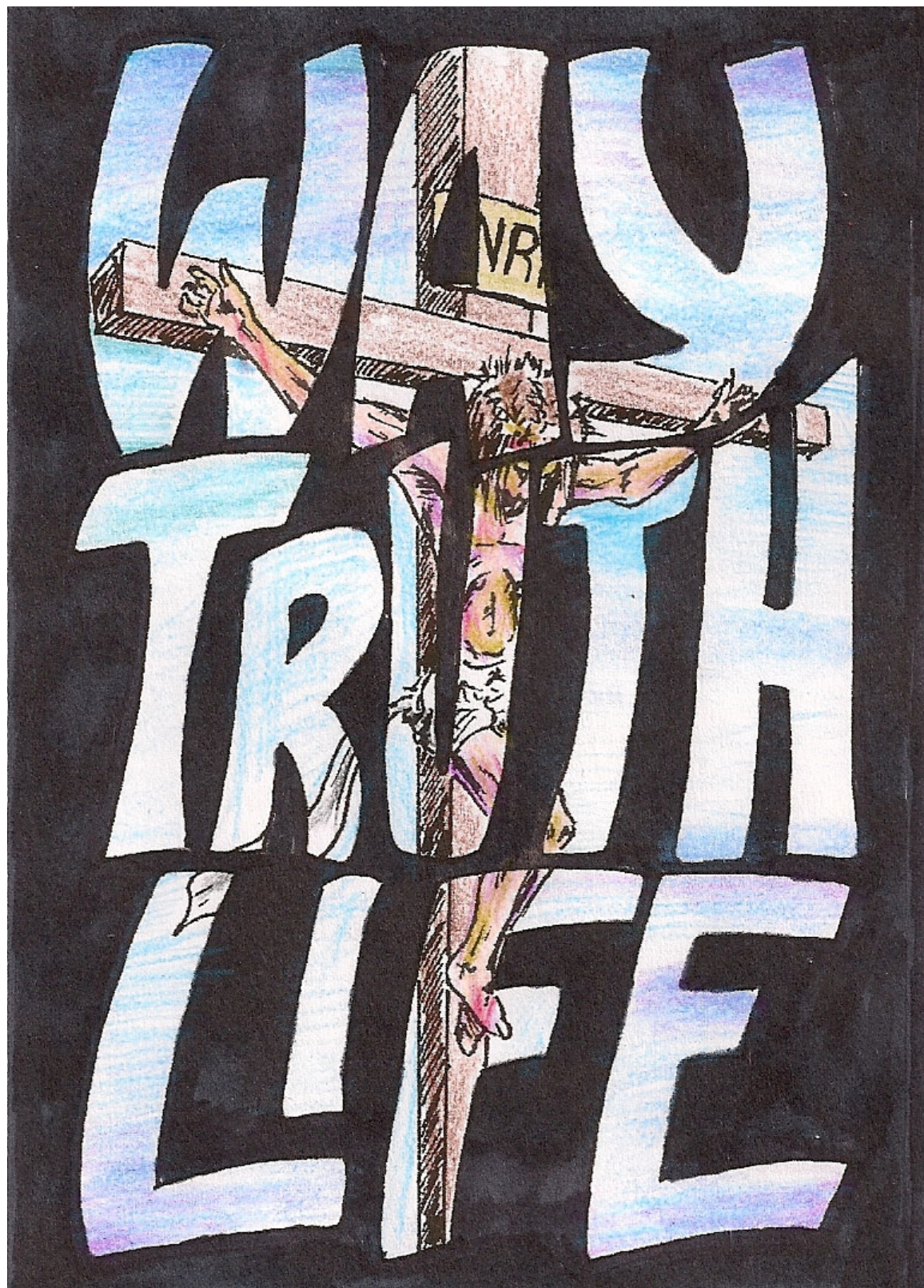

Please call the parish office to make arrangements if you or your loved one would like a priest to visit with the Sacrament of Anointing.

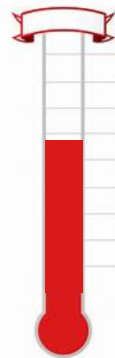

If you are sorting through paperwork, just wanted you to know that CCW has already scheduled the Shredder Truck to be onsite at OLQA this year on:

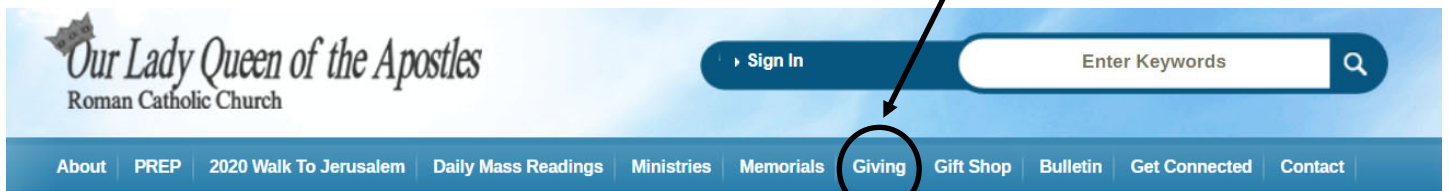
October 3, 2020 (safety permitting)

Alégrate de que en la Iglesia haya caminos distintos y ama el camino del otro como si fuera el tuyo.
