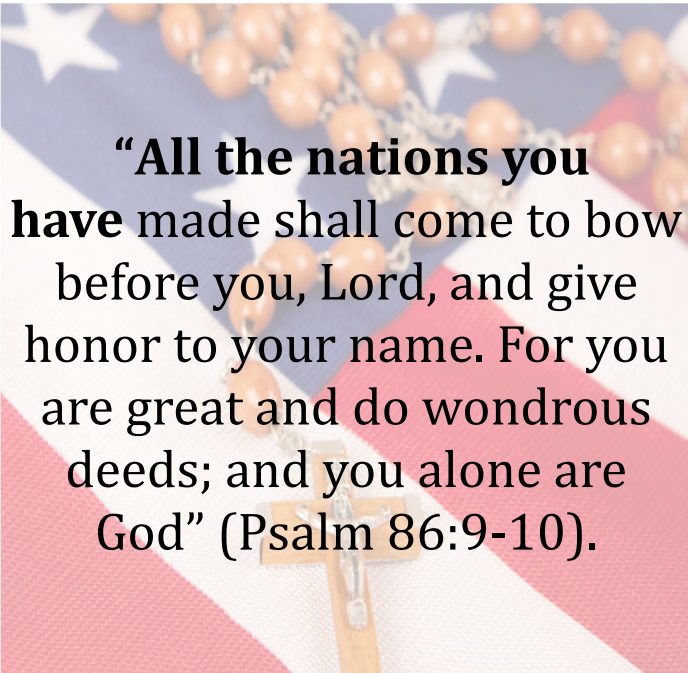

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out-of-town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: We are blessed to have a group of volunteers in our parish who are happy to bring Holy Communion to the sick, the hospitalized and the homebound. Please call the parish office to make arrangements if you or your loved one would like a priest to visit with the Sacrament of Anointing.

My dear parishioners,

Our life is a journey. When we were young we had our own ideas where this journey could lead us, but very often we get older and we are surprised—wow! Wow! In my case this happened when I started my journey to the priesthood. At that time there were ten of us and nine of us took English classes at the university. I was the only one who took Italian. Today, after 30 years of being a priest, I am the only one who works in an English-speaking country. So my question to God is why? You could have prepared me much early to speak English!

When I came to America in 1996 at age 33 I didn't speak English at all, and believe me it was a challenge. It really was a challenge. Slowly, slowly I fell in love with this country. The first thing I watched on American television was *The Price Is Right* and *Wheel Of Fortune* and I was picking up some words. I would take a Polish-English dictionary and I would try to understand what they were saying. Later I bought newspapers and took English classes at Prep Marianapolis High School in Connecticut.

Then I came to Florida. This was a challenge because I was exposed to preach to American people. I spoke to the Bishop of the Diocese of Palm Beach and I made the decision to stay in this country. Very quickly I received my Green Card and I was so happy. I loved it! But at the same time I missed Europe. I knew I had to make a decision regarding where I should practice my priesthood. After prayerful consideration I decided to invest myself in this country. For many years I just wanted to be a priest in this country, but I was also a little negligent with my full participation here. It took so many years for me to become a citizen. Not for even one minute of my life was I illegal here, but I thought that the Green Card would be sufficient to live here. Then I decided that I want to become a full citizen. I prepared myself for the citizenship test. This was not a burden for me but a pleasure to learn about American history. I read more books than I should to answer the questions correctly and I waited for a date for when I could pass my test and become an American citizen. And I did it on September 4, 2014!

Having been born in Poland, half of my life has already been spent in America. I love both these countries and I am trying to be responsible for everything that the United States provides for me.
