The Gospel of the rich young man puts before us two good lessons. The first is that good intentions and following the laws of the Church are not sufficient for eternal life. We may be tempted to think that because we attend Mass every Sunday and have followed the Church's rules, we deserve heaven. In reality, nothing we can do of our own accord makes us deserving of heaven; salvation is a gift that God freely offers us. Receiving this gift of salvation that God offers requires that we have the proper disposition. We need to strive to love God above all things, love our neighbor as ourselves, and practice the teachings of Jesus in our lives.

The second lesson is that in order to love God and to live as a faithful disciple of Jesus, we must let go of things that hinder us from growing in our love for the Lord. Notice that, for the rich man, the purpose of selling everything and giving to the poor was so that he could follow Jesus. They were prerequisites for him being a disciple.

We may want to ask ourselves: What is keeping me from following Jesus wholeheartedly? What in my life am I choosing above Jesus? We can be more concrete: What in my is keeping me from prayer? What in my life is keeping me from loving my neighbor?

The Gospel says, Jesus looked at him and loved him. Do not imagine that Jesus is shaking his finger at the young man. Rather, he is inviting him and us into a deeper relationship with him. He invites us to let go of things that hinder us from growing in our love for him and following him more faithfully.

Bible Study

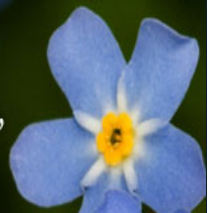

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

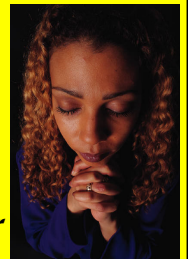
