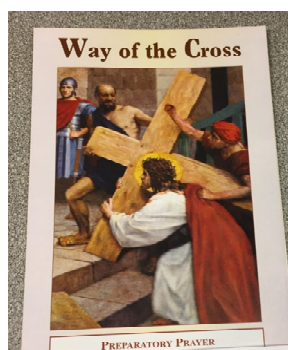

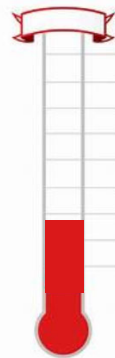

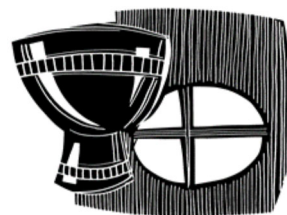

Liturgy Notes

Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

What is Liturgy?



Liturgy is the name for the official, communal prayer of the Church, which is comprised of the seven sacraments, the Liturgy of the Hours, and the liturgical year. The word “liturgy” derives from the Greek word “leitourgia” meaning public work, such as civil offices or judicial services. In the Christian tradition, liturgy means the work of God.

Christ continues his work of redemption for us and with us through liturgy. As members of his Body, we share in his work when we participate in his prayer to the Father in the Holy Spirit. Liturgy is the way we offer perfect worship to God and receive from him abundant graces for holiness.

The Eucharist is the heart of liturgy. In every celebration, we relive and keep in touch with the central mystery of our faith—the passion, death, and resurrection of Christ, the work of redemption. The other six sacraments draw from the grace of the Eucharist. The liturgical year and Liturgy of the Hours also draw from the Eucharist and are the means by which time itself is made holy.

At Our Lady Queen of the Apostles, we are fortunate to have many volunteers who assist with the celebration of liturgy in so many ways, from liturgical roles such as lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, altar servers, sacristans, greeters, and ushers to vital roles in decorating our worship space and keeping our church in order. Have you considered becoming a member of one of our liturgical ministries? Pray and think about it. We would love to see many more of our parish family members involved in our liturgical worship.

WANT TO LEARN MORE ABOUT YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH?

The School of Christian Formation for the Diocese of Palm Beach is offering a series of classes and programs for adult Catholics who wish to learn more about the rich traditions of their faith. Those who complete the entire three-year program earn a certificate of completion awarded by Bishop Barbarito at the school’s annual graduation ceremony. The Diocese strongly recommends these courses for all the faithful, especially those serving in liturgical, educational and spiritual ministries. The registration fee is \$10 and textbooks range from \$10 to \$20 per course.

Heart Health

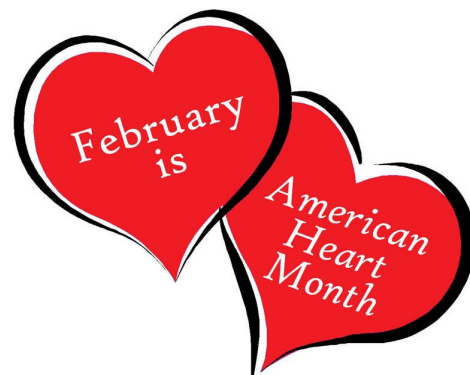

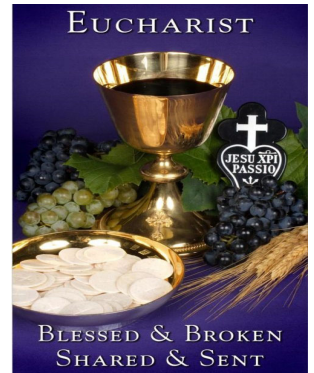

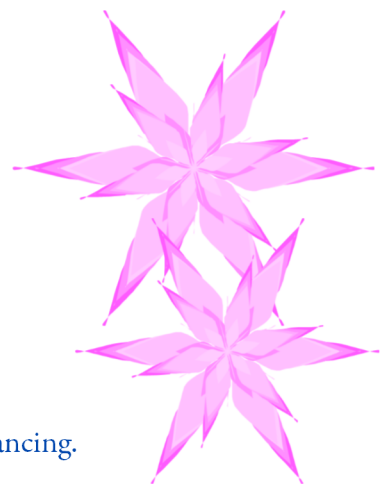
