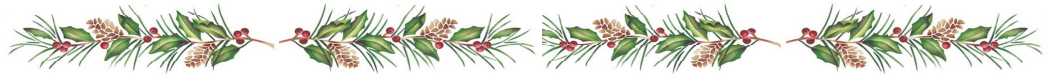

Dear parishioners,



I hope that everything is going well in your life at this moment. From the perspective of many of you, you are confused about how to approach the tomorrow of your lives. To help you, I ask that whenever you come to the church property, look at the statue of John Paul II and the inscription underneath of "Do Not Be Afraid". During this Advent season I ask that you ***Come, Open Your Hearts to CHRISTmas.***

During my homily this past Sunday, for the Second Sunday of Advent, I asked that each morning when you wake you try to promise to God that this will be a very joyful day. Advent is a very short season and invites us through the Prophet Isaiah to make our path straight. Very often because of our poor choices, we create many curves in our path. When I was preaching to you as well as myself, I realized that with this time of special grace when St. John the Baptist told us that we are sealed by the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, we have the power to come closer to the Lord. God doesn't want to be impressed by our actions. God is looking for our faithfulness and perseverance in faith. With all these difficulties in our lives today, we should only have one firm decision to make: Jesus, I want to be with you.

This Saturday, December 12, we celebrate the 11th anniversary of the dedication of our church. I strongly believe that this is the most important place for all those who are part of our worshipping family. This is a place where you come to be nourished, to be forgiven, to be baptized, to be married and to have a funeral Mass. Altogether, this is a place where we come to meet Jesus Christ.

I am very grateful for everyone who financially supports us to keep our parish up and running. I invite everyone who is able to contribute to continue to help keep our parish alive. The DSA (Diocesan Service Appeal) for 2020 has not yet been met and our parish is responsible for any shortfall, which currently is more than \$50,000. Our new goal for 2021 is \$244,000. These DSA goals and our overhead expenses to run the church, are completely reliant on you, our parishioners. We want to provide the best for you; for those who can come to the church and for the sick of the parish who cannot. We want to be here for generations to come, but we need your help to make this happen. We need your help to provide a special place to worship for you, for your children and for your children's children. I would love to see 100% participation, even if it's just a dollar or two.

Whenever I go out in public and I see crowds, I feel very uncomfortable. I wonder what people's practices are and what precautions they take. I can assure you that Our Lady Queen of the Apostles Church is 100% disinfected after any liturgical event. Know that this is a very safe environment. When you come to the parish office 100% of us are wearing our masks and we constantly disinfect our hands. During Mass, Communion is received in the hand, we practice safe social distancing and wearing masks is mandatory.

We are not sure how many people will be worshipping with us publicly for our Christmas Masses, but you need to understand that I have to keep these safety restrictions regarding keeping safe social distancing. Because of this, I encourage you to arrive earlier so you are able to be seated in the church. In case there is a need for overflow, we will direct those parishioners to Celebration Hall where the same Mass will be live-streamed and Communion will be distributed.

So, do not be afraid to come back to the church. Jesus is waiting for you. Father Laurent and I are waiting for you. We wish that the remaining days of Advent be very joyful in your hearts. We are praying for you. We are grateful for everything that you do for us.

So, during the remaining weeks of Advent please ***Come, Open Your Hearts to CHRISTmas!!***

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

Liturgy Corner

*Gaudete in Domino semper; iterum dico, gaudete.
Dominus enim prope est.*

The traditional name for the Third Sunday of Advent is *Gaudete Sunday*. The name is Latin for “*Rejoice*” and comes from the opening words of today’s entrance antiphon (a brief scriptural reading that is usually replaced with the gathering hymn) taken from Saint Paul’s letter to the Philippians. Because one of Advent’s tasks is to prepare us for Christ’s return at the end of time, the season has a penitential quality, which in earlier times was similar to Lent. *Gaudete Sunday*, like its counterpart at the midpoint of Lent, *Laetare* Sunday, with rose colored vestments and relaxation of austerities, provides a glimpse of its fulfillment. It is a day for rejoicing because we can see what lies ahead, Christmas joy. The readings and prayers for today make a shift from the end of times to the approaching Solemnity of the Nativity of our Lord. The liturgical color rose is used for vestments and the third candle of the Advent wreath as a sign of rejoicing.

In the final days of Advent, beginning on December 17, the Church prays the “*O Antiphons*” in the Liturgy of the Hours and the Gospel acclamations of the weekday Mass. Written by monks in the 17th century, each of the seven antiphons begins with a different title for Christ, which are familiar to us in our Advent hymn, **O Come, O Come Emmanuel**: “O Wisdom” (*O Sapientia*), “O sacred Lord” (*O Adonai*), “O Flower of Jesse’s stem” (*O radix Jesse*), “O Key of David” (*O clavis David*), “O Radiant Dawn” (*O Oriens*), “O King of Nations” (*O Rex gentium*) and “O Emmanuel”.

*Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice!
The Lord is near!*

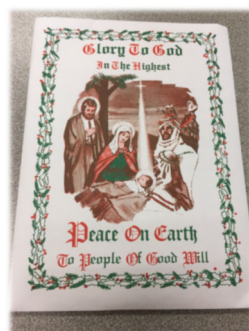

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. III domingo de Adviento: Descubrir al Cristo oculto

¿Quién es ese Dios desconocido que predicaba el Bautista que existía antes que él pero que venía detrás y del cual no era digno ni de servirle como criado?. Ese Dios era y sigue siendo solo uno: Cristo y Cristo crucificado. Recomendaciones de la Iglesia para vivir el Adviento

5.- Lecturas bíblicas que invitan a la conversión.

La Santa Sede recomendó profundizar en los pasajes bíblicos que se leerán durante el Adviento porque invitan a la conversión “mediante la voz de los profetas y sobre todo de Juan Bautista”. “Dios mantenía, mediante las profecías, la esperanza de Israel en la venida del Mesías” y que “está sólidamente enraizada en el pueblo cristiano la conciencia de la larga espera que precedió a la venida del Salvador”.

6.- Rezar la Corona de Adviento y preparar las Posadas.

El Vaticano indicó que el rezo de la corona y el encendido de sus cuatro velas se ha “convertido en un símbolo del Adviento en los hogares cristianos”, en el encendido de cada vela, se recuerdan “las diversas etapas de la historia de la salvación antes de Cristo”. También invitaron a participar en la celebración de las “Posadas”, una “tradición española y latinoamericana” que representa “el camino de José y María hacia Belén, y su búsqueda de un lugar acogedor para el nacimiento de Jesús”.

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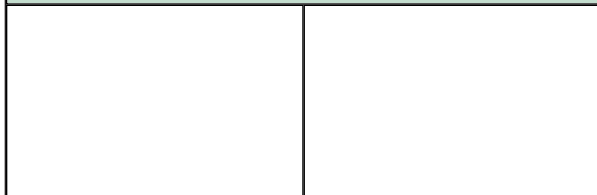
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
