Liturgy Corner

O Radiant Dawn, splendor of eternal light, sun of justice, come and shine on those who dwell in darkness and in the shadow of death.

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent the liturgy focuses on the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose story embodies the essence of Advent. Her "yes" to God made Christ's first coming possible. In the Opening Prayer, we remember that when Mary placed her life at the service of God's plan, His eternal Word became flesh on earth.

The season of Advent ends with the Vigil Mass of Christmas on the evening of December 24. Like Easter, Christmas is too important for just one day; it overflows into an octave, an eight-day celebration that ends with the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God, as well as its own season that ends with the Baptism of the Lord on January 10.

The date of Christ's birth is not mentioned in the Gospels. In its earliest days, the Church had only one feast, the Resurrection of the Lord, celebrated weekly on Sunday and annually on Easter. During the 4th century, the Church began to celebrate the Lord's coming and sought to counterbalance the pagan feasts of the winter solstice with a Christian feast. With many scriptural references to Christ as the true light of the world as inspiration, the Church chose to "baptize" the pagan Birthday of the Unconquered Sun celebrated on December 25 as the Christian birthday of the true Light of the World.

Come open your hearts to Christmas.

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

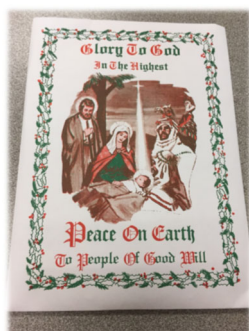


Gift Shop

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out-of-town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: We are blessed to have a group of volunteers in our parish who are happy to bring Holy Communion to the sick, the hospitalized and the homebound. Please call the parish office to make arrangements if you or your loved one would like a priest to visit with the Sacrament of Anointing.

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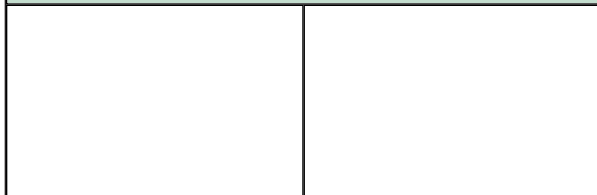
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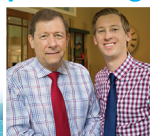
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
