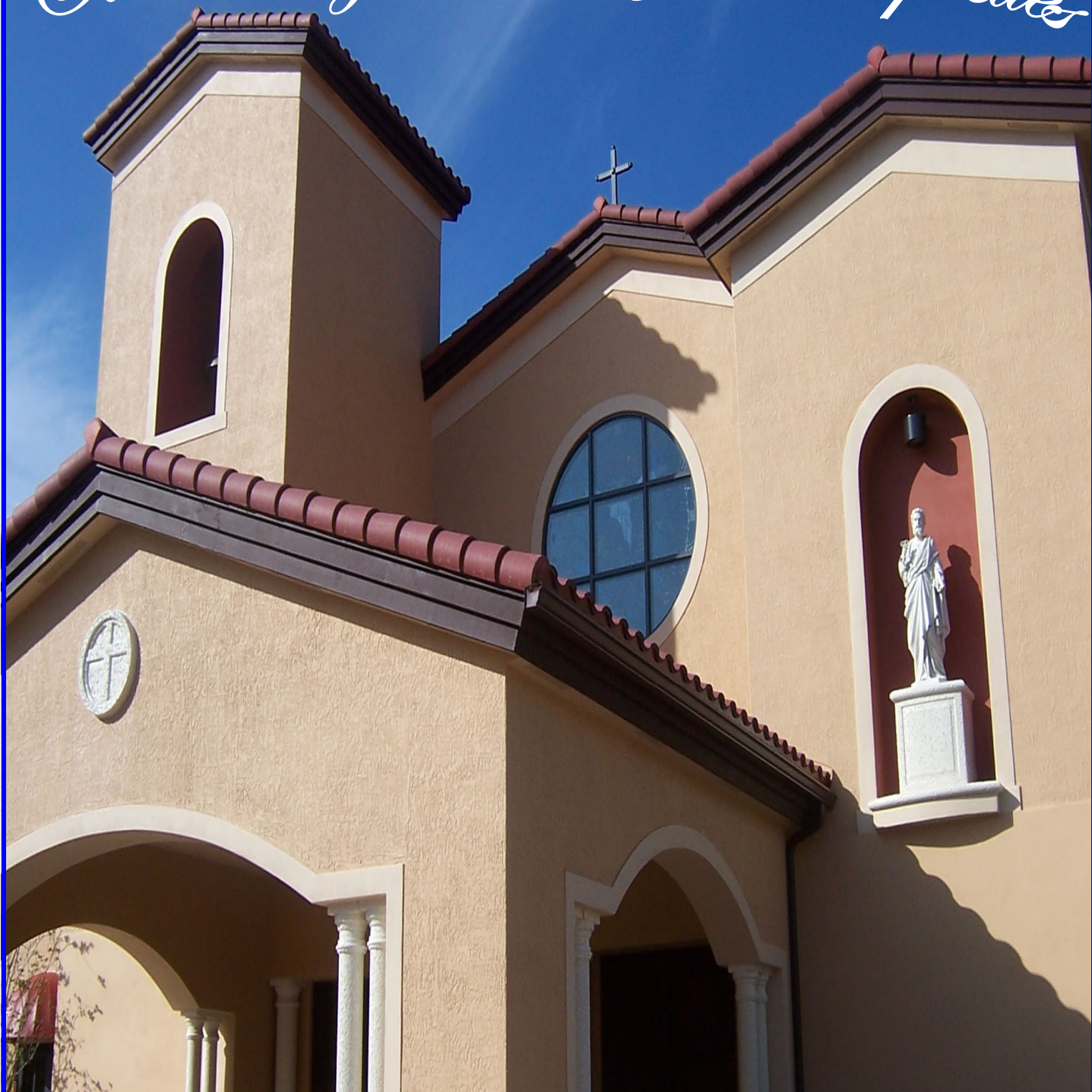

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

SUNDAY READINGS: 2 Kgs 5:14-17; 2 Tm 2:8-13; Lk 17:11-19

"And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him."

If asked, we could probably rattle off a long list of problems and difficulties in our lives - but to make a list of the things that are good and going well in our lives would probably take some time. Gratitude is a conscious and intentional perspective of looking at our lives and our world. Like the leper in today's Gospel, we realize that we have been cured despite the problems we still face, that our blessings far outweigh our struggles, that we have reason for gratitude and hope despite the sadness and anxieties we must cope with.

Sr. Joan Chittister writes in her book "Happiness" that researchers have found four simple actions that are effective in raising our personal happiness/gratefulness thermostat. **First**, simply smile more - at strangers, when being spoken to, when you see something you like. **Second**, spend some time every day remembering three things you are grateful for in your current life. This exercise requires us to realize consciously the continuing degree of gratuitous good that invades our life, too often unseen or unacknowledged, day after day after day. **Third**, when feeling stressed we should stop and remember one good thing that happened to you the day before that gave your life a fresh and unusual burst of happiness. Memory of past good things give rise to the hope that the present day, too, will provide the resources needed to make it a good one for us. **Fourth**, simply think about things you like - present or past. Flooding the brain with the little things that make life good - the smell of coffee in the morning, the feel of the breeze on the beach, the times spent with friends telling stories and renewing old friendships - keep open the doors of the heart to life in general when the particular weigh it down.

We need to be aware of God's gifts to us. Before we can say thank you, we have to live in awareness of what comes to us as gifts large and small. Every one of the ten lepers were gifted with healing, but only one recognized and named God's healing presence in his life. Only one realized, returned, and gave thanks.

Loving God, lead me into awareness of your gracious gifts to me today.

Pumpkins go on sale on Tuesday, October 11th.

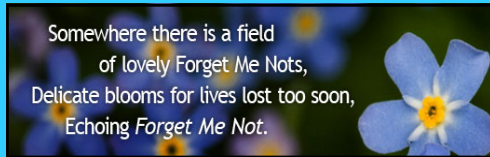
