Safe and Secure Initiative

As you may remember, we created a Safe and Secure Ministry which is comprised of law enforcement officers, teacher, and others. Our goal is to build a plan to assist the parish in ensuring that our campus remains safe and secure and to deter crime. We requested a *Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design Security Assessment* which was completed and the results discussed with the Safe and Secure Ministry members. There are various recommendations that we have already begun to work on, but there are several that require additional funding.

If our Safe and Secure Initiative is one that is important to you and you have the means to financially assist us, we would certainly appreciate your support. These are troubling times and over the past few weeks there have been churches burned, statues destroyed and tabernacles broken and the Holy Eucharist stolen. We understand that security initiatives might not deter all crime, but it's important for us to protect our campus and especially the Eucharist to the best of our ability.

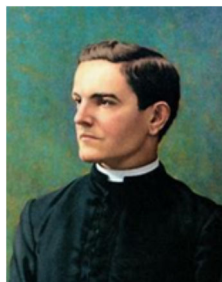
BEATIFICATION OF FATHER MICHAEL J. MCGIVNEY

XXX domingo: Un solo mandamiento

Jesús concentra toda la antigua ley moral judía y toda la nueva ley moral cristiana en un solo precepto, en un solo mandamiento: el del amor. Un amor que tiene que tener, dos dimensiones: la vertical -hacia Dios- y la horizontal -hacia el prójimo-. El amor cristiano tiene que ser a la vez un amor motivado religiosamente -por ti, Señor, quiero hacer las cosas- y también un amor que esté lleno de obras concretas. Pero en este fragmento del Evangelio el Señor indica otra cosa: establece prioridades. Habla de un "primer" mandamiento y de un "segundo" mandamiento. Los dos son necesarios e imprescindibles, pero sin el primero no existirá el segundo, aunque sin el segundo el primero quedará en el vacío, como un proyecto que no llega a culminar. Es imprescindible la motivación espiritual como punto de partida, para lo cual serán necesarias aquellas prácticas que la refuerzan: la oración personal y los sacramentos y que esa carga espiritual que se recibe en la oración, se transforme en vida, en obras. En nuestra época están fallando las dos cosas: la motivación espiritual y, como consecuencia, las obras concretas. Empecemos por regar la planta, y luego exijámosle que dé fruto.

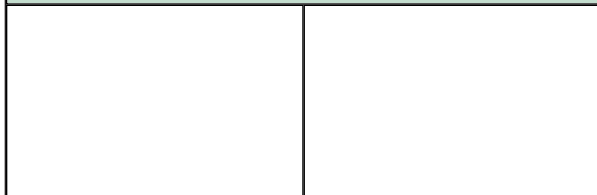
