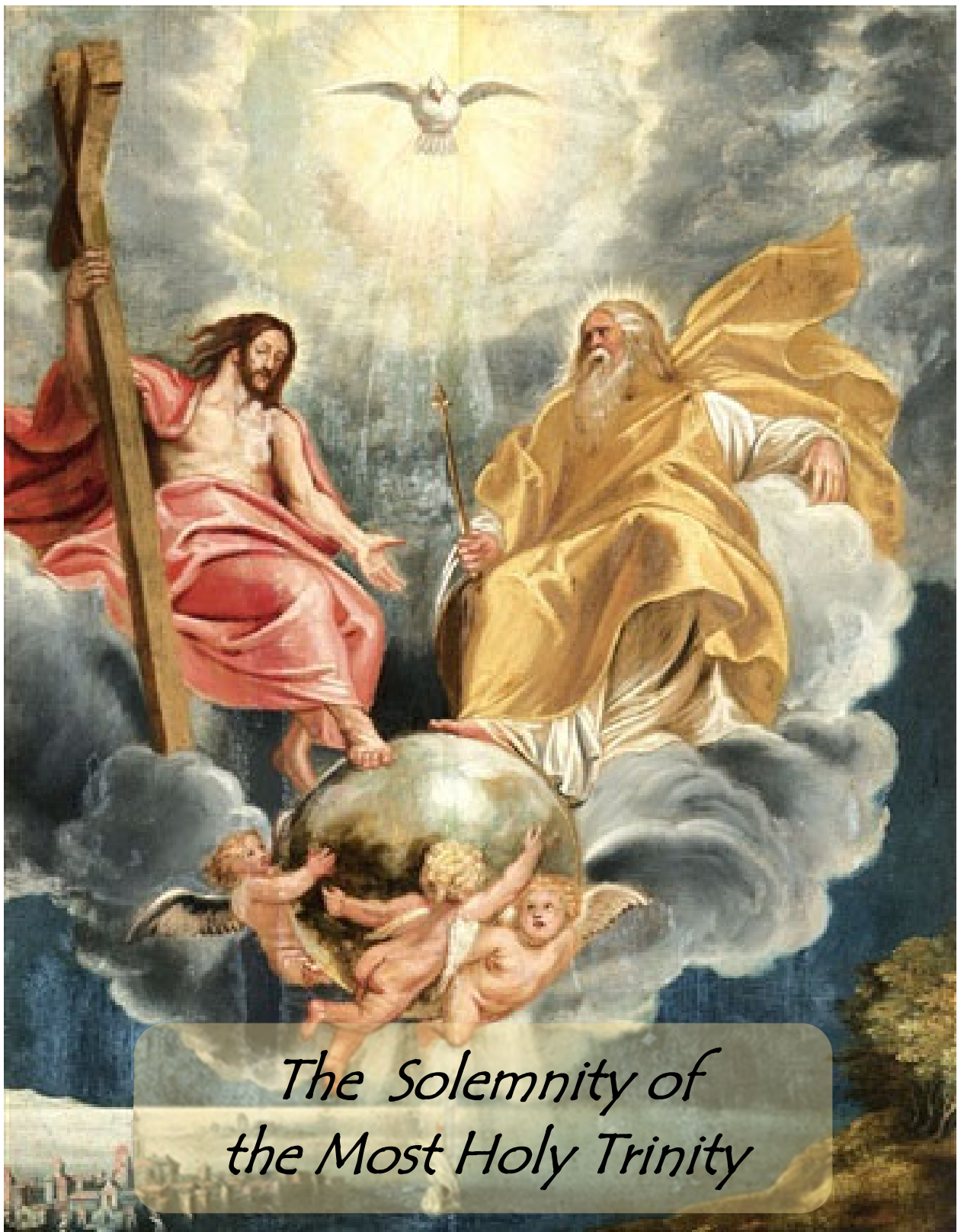

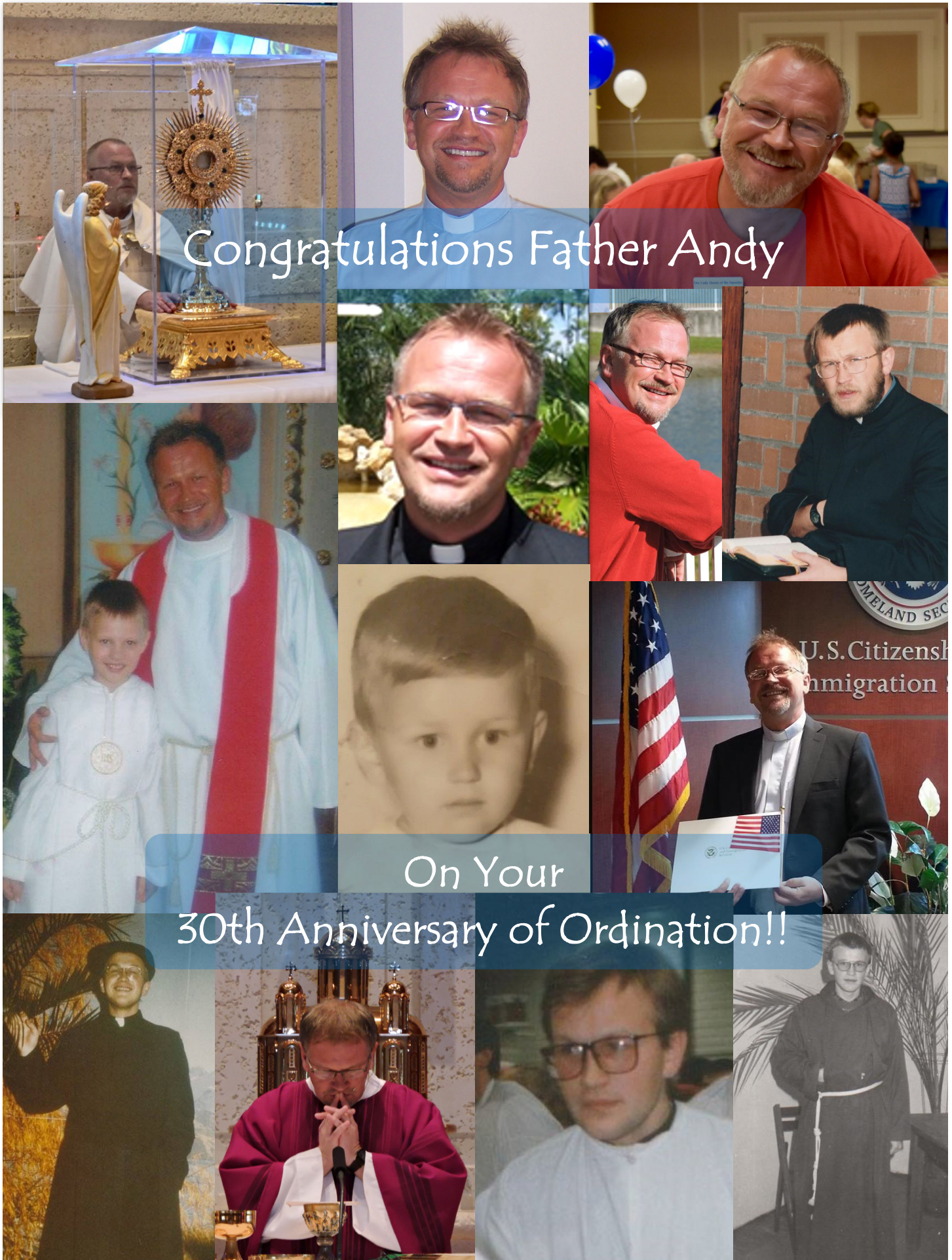

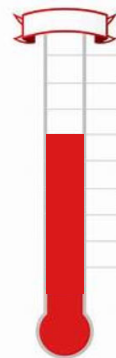

Make kindness the backdrop of my soul's life and substance.

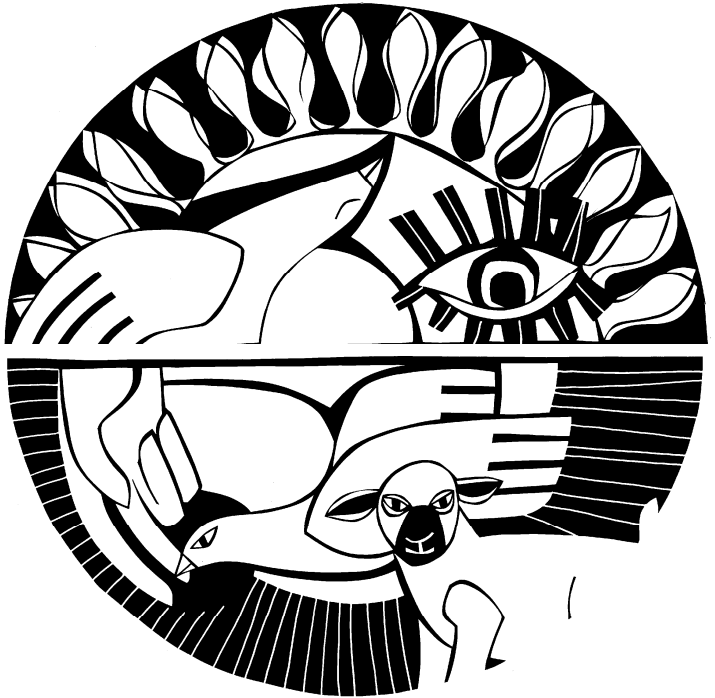

Liturgy Notes

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

With Pentecost Sunday, the Easter season comes to a conclusion. These weeks that follow, were once called “the Sundays after Pentecost.” Our current liturgical calendar calls them “Ordinary Time,” that is, measured or numbered time. Ultimately all liturgical seasons exist in relation to Easter. In these weeks after Pentecost, we discover how to live our faith day by day in light of the Risen Christ with the Holy Spirit as our guide.



This phase of Ordinary Time begins with two great solemnities...the Most Holy Trinity, followed by the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as Corpus Christi. After these two solemnities, the numbered Sundays flow without interruption for many months. The only break will be November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints, which falls on a Sunday this year.

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Santísima Trinidad: En la tierra como en el cielo

Por lo tanto: acepta las diferencias legítimas y busca la unidad. En todo y siempre: ama.
