SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

SUNDAY READINGS: Sir 17-18, 20, 28-29; Heb 12:18-19, 22-24a; Lk 14:1, 7-14

"When you give a luncheon or a dinner, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind. You will be blessed because they cannot repay you. Your payment will come at the resurrection."

Suppose Bill Gates offered you \$10,000,000 to throw a dinner party at your house for the local street people, the LGBTQ in your community, the bag ladies and the shopping cart guys, the "special" people from the local group home, and people from that "high crime" neighborhood on the other side of town. 2015-16 Financial Report

Our financial performance for the fiscal year 2015-2016 was much better than previous years, albeit supported through the agreement with the Diocese to pay *interest only* on our church debt for one year. This was carried over from last year and ended in November of 2015. In addition, we were able to negotiate the DSA shortage of over \$32,000 with the Diocese, which they forgave and they also reduced our 2016 goal from \$217,000 to \$180,000! This total of \$69,000, would have had a major negative impact on our finances this year, as well as next year, and we are very appreciative of our Diocese for working with us. (Currently, we are just under \$18,000 short of goal so if you haven't made your gift yet, please do so as soon as your means allow.)

As you know, our offertory drives our parish operating budget and although we were short of budget by \$22,000, we were blessed this year with generous donations as well as a large bequest of over \$90,000! In addition, our hall rental continues to drive significant revenues to our parish. This past year our hall yielded a profit of over \$96,000.

Additionally, we continue to monitor expenses and are diligent in reducing them as appropriate. This was the third straight year we reduced employee expense and we forecast additional savings in 2016-17 as we reduced staff by one part time position. Also, you'll remember we upgraded to LED light bulbs in the church and hall and our savings in 2015-16 were over \$7,000! Our total expenses were reduced by \$42,660 over last year and we forecast reduced expenses of \$36,000 this year.

Although our income was strong and our expense reduction focus yielded good results, we did have many issues as our campus continues to age. These were all covered through our operating income and we did not dip into our reserves to cover any of these expenses.

We have reduced our long term debt by \$119,203 and increased our reserves by \$127,000. By increasing our reserves we will not need to ask the Diocese for debt relief this year which is the first time in three years. (As our offertory dips during the summer months making the monthly payment of over \$22,000 had been challenging. These will be paid through reserves during the summer slower months, and the reserves rebuilt throughout the remainder of our year).

We would like to thank all of you for your continued support and generosity to our parish. In addition, we want to thank all of you who continue your increased offertory commitment. We ask everyone each year to review your personal commitment to our parish and proactively plan what you want to share with our parish, not only your Gifts or Treasure, but also your gifts of your Time and your Talents. It is in giving back to the Lord for all that He has given us that we truly practice our Catholic faith!

We would like to thank the continued efforts and guidance of our Finance Committee, Mr. Joe Deithorn, Ms. Sue Dolingo, Mrs. Sue Hutcheon, Mrs. Kathy Hanson, and Mrs. Deb Admason. In addition, thanks to Diane Lanctot and Chris Winters who serve as Ad Hoc staff members.

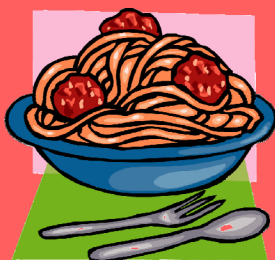

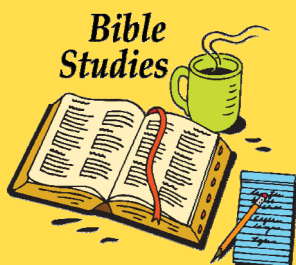

Papa Francisco, *Misericordiae Vultus*, n. 9). La externa consistirá en cosas como sonreír cuando alguno nos importuna, responder de buena forma cuando quisiéramos mostrar enojo, ser pacientes con los molestos... La interna, trata de formar un corazón compasivo y misericordioso, que sabe no sólo soportar, sino hacerlo con verdadera paciencia. Un corazón así hace vida lo que San Pablo escribía en el himno a la caridad: «El amor es paciente, es bondadoso» (cf. 1 Co 13, 4). Aprovechemos este tiempo en que Dios nos ofrece una gracia especial para vivir la misericordia. Confiemos en que su promesa se cumplirá: «Bienaventurados los misericordiosos, porque alcanzarán misericordia» (cf. Mt 5,7).
