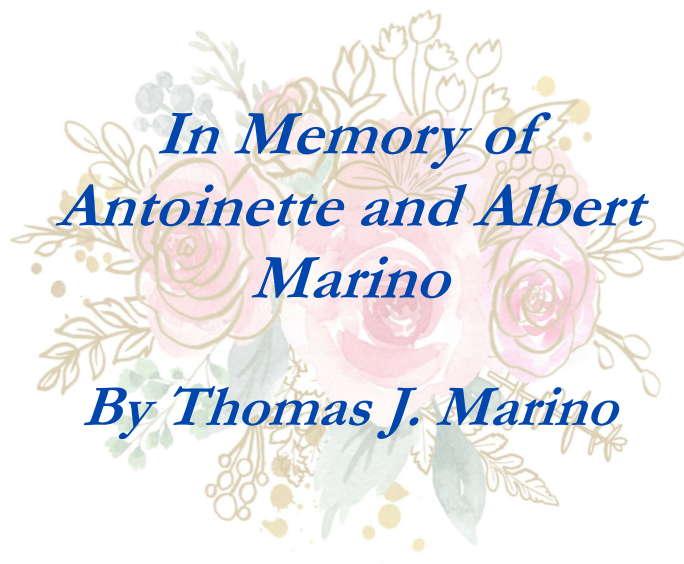

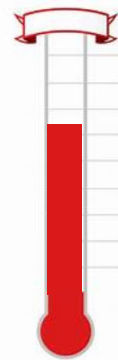

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## Liturgy Notes

### Ordinary Time

“Besides the times of the year that have their own distinctive character, there remain in the yearly cycle thirty-three or thirty-four weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness, especially on Sundays.” *(from the Universal Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar)* During Ordinary Time, rather than focus on particular aspects of Christ’s life, we see the big picture of his public life and ministry as given to us by the evangelists. This year, we capture a glimpse of Christ as the fulfillment of the Law through the lens of the Gospel according to Matthew.

Ordinary Time affords us a good opportunity to focus on Sunday, the original Christian feast day. For some two-thousand years, Christians have gathered on the first day of the week to hear the words of Scripture and break bread together in the celebration of the Eucharist. This first day of each week is also referred to as the eighth day, an eschatological distinction that marks the beginning of a new era in Christ.
