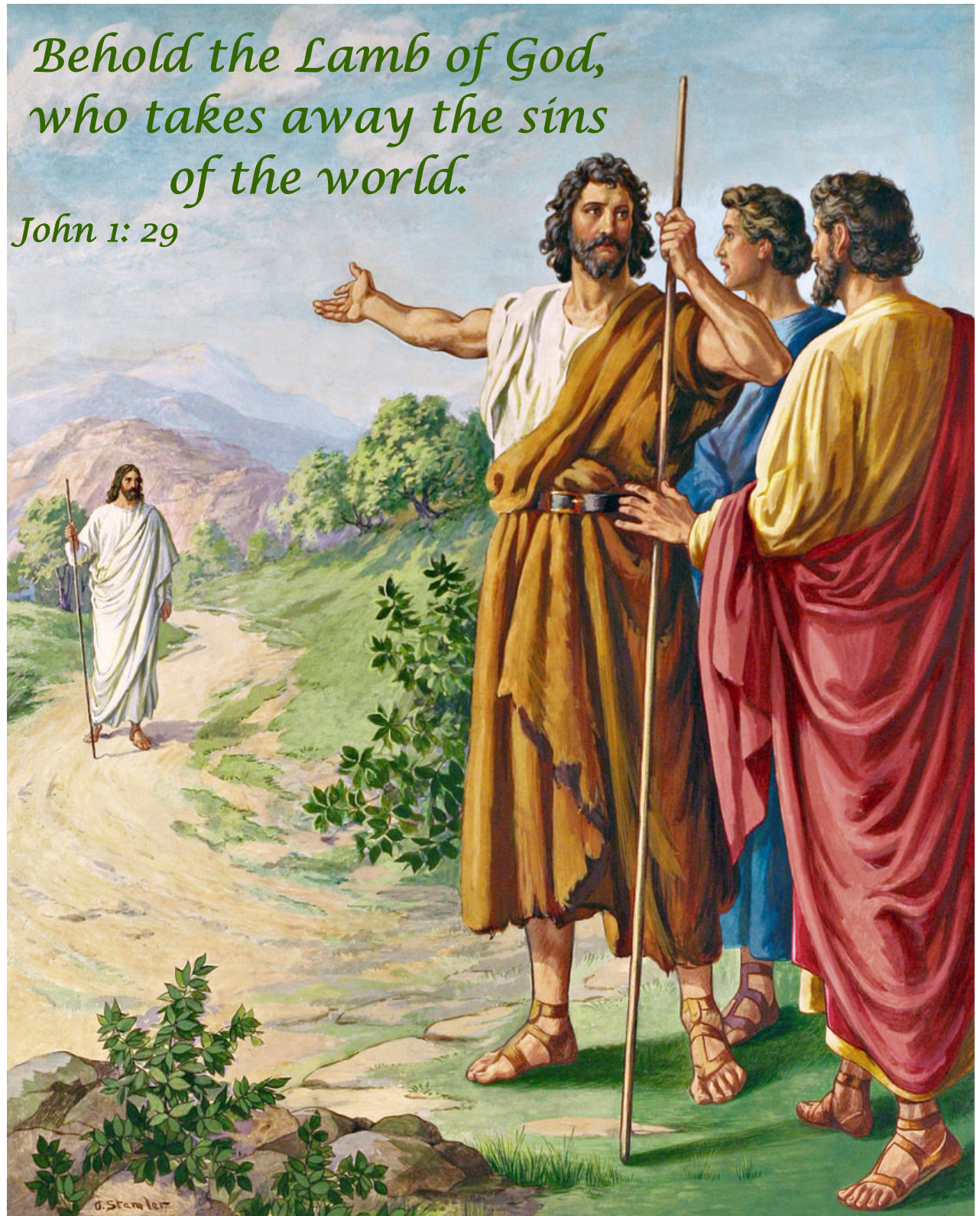

The Health And Wellness Ministry Presents...

7 Healthy Foods That Are High in Vitamin D

Vitamin D is the only nutrient your body produces when exposed to sunlight. However, up to 50% of the world's population may not get enough sun, and 40% of U.S. residents are deficient in vitamin D. This is partly because people spend more time indoors, wear sunblock outside, and eat a Western diet low in good sources of this vitamin. The recommended daily value (DV) is 800 IU (20 mcg) of vitamin D per day from foods. If you don't get enough sunlight, your intake should likely be closer to 1,000 IU (25 mcg) per day.

Salmon - Wild salmon contains about 988 IU of vitamin D per serving, while farmed salmon contains 250 IU, on average. That's 124% and 32% of the DV, respectively.

Herring and sardines - Herring contains 216 IU of vitamin D per 3.5-ounce (100-gram) serving. Pickled herring, sardines, and other fatty fish, such as halibut and mackerel, are also good sources.

Cod liver oil - Cod liver oil contains 448 IU of vitamin D per teaspoon (4.9 ml), or 56% of the DV. It is also high in other nutrients, such as vitamin A and omega-3 fatty acids.

Canned Tuna - Canned tuna contains 268 IU of vitamin D per serving. Choose light tuna and eat 6 ounces (170 grams) or less per week to prevent methylmercury buildup.

Egg Yolks - Eggs from commercially raised hens contain only about 37 IU of vitamin D per yolk. However, eggs from hens raised outside or fed vitamin-D-enriched feed contain much higher levels.

Mushrooms - Mushrooms can synthesize vitamin D₂ when exposed to UV light. Only wild mushrooms or mushrooms treated with UV light are good sources of vitamin D.

Fortified foods - Foods such as cow's milk, soy milk, orange juice, cereals, and oatmeal are sometimes fortified with vitamin D. These contain 54–136 IU per serving.

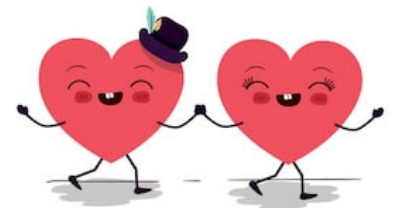

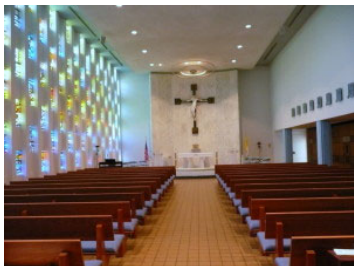

II Domingo Ordinario

“Este es el cordero de Dios, que quita el pecado del mundo” (Jn 1, 29). Juan Bautista presenta a Jesús con un título y una misión que han servido después para identificar a Cristo a lo largo de los siglos. Le llama “cordero de Dios”, con todo lo que lleva consigo ese apelativo y que anuncian ya, mucho antes del Viernes Santo, cuál será el final del Maestro. Y dice de Él, que ha venido “a quitar el pecado del mundo”. No debemos olvidar esta definición, no conviene perder de vista algo que lentamente tendemos a oscurecer: que Cristo es el salvador, el redentor, el libertador de la humanidad. Y que esa liberación se ha hecho mediante la lucha contra el pecado. Hay un pecado que podríamos llamar estructural-social, que tiene terribles consecuencias sobre multitudes. Pocas veces podemos hacer algo contra ese pecado, pues casi todos nosotros somos muy pequeños. Hay otro pecado que nos cae más a mano y es el nuestro; contra ese sí podemos luchar. Y resulta que este pecado fastidia enormemente a los que nos rodean, haciéndoles con frecuencia la vida difícil e incluso imposible. Dejemos a Jesús que quite el pecado del mundo, el estructural y el personal. Colaboremos con él luchando contra ambos pecados, con todas nuestras fuerzas, por nuestro bien y el del prójimo.
