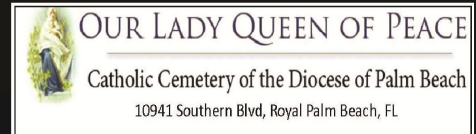
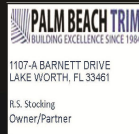

### **SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION**

**Baptisms:** Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

**Marriages:** You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

**Sick and Homebound:** Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

## **All Souls Day Novena**

**SUNDAY READINGS: Wis 11:22-12:2. 2Thess 1:11-2:2. Luke 19:1-10**

Most of us are good, decent people. We try to live our lives by doing what we believe to be right for our families and our community. We usually attend Mass regularly, we give money to our church and occasionally to our favorite charities, and we sometimes help out others who need us. Most of us can go through a reading of the Ten Commandments, and superficially claim that we don't sin. But becoming stuck in this spiritual rut can lead us down a path to spiritual complacency. This is when we become satisfied with our faith, our spirituality, and our relationship with God and neighbor. We become lukewarm, content with our spiritual status quo. However, in the Book of Revelation (3:16) we read, "Because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will spew you out of my mouth." There are also numerous times throughout the Gospel where Jesus warns us against the hypocrisy of presenting ourselves as righteous (or even holy) on the outside, while we are an absolute mess on the inside. Jesus cautions us about our lack of mercy, our lack of humility, our lack of justice, and our lack of divine love.

Over the past several weeks, our Sunday readings have presented a few examples of people who believed they were righteous, but who are exposed by Jesus for their hypocrisy. Their "inside" doesn't match their "outside." Today's Gospel, however, gives us a similar message about salvation and the need for repentance, but instead of presenting one who outwardly appears holy, Jesus uses the well-known sinner, Zacchaeus, the chief tax collector of Jericho.

Zacchaeus would most certainly have been known by the people of his town, since he was the one who obtained his income from the other tax collectors in the area. Tax collectors made their money by getting from the people what was owed to the emperor, and then adding something for themselves. They were generally looked upon as greedy sinners, who oftentimes lived lavish lifestyles. But Zacchaeus says that he gives half his money to the poor and repays those who have been cheated by him, many times over their losses. In the original Greek language, the sense is that Zacchaeus was already doing these practices while he was still seeking out Jesus.

Zacchaeus knew his own true character, and while he was already making attempts to remedy things with his neighbor, he also sought to remedy things with God. Zacchaeus doesn't deny that he had been unfair or acted sinfully in the past, but he acknowledges those facts through his actions to reconcile himself with man and God. His acts of repentance and seeking the master are met with Jesus' words to him, "Today salvation has come to this house.... The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." Salvation did enter the house of Zacchaeus, in the form of the Savior himself, Jesus Christ. And once more we see that it is the repentant sinner who is exalted by the Son of God by his very presence.

We desire that salvation. We want to welcome the Savior into our world, our churches, and our very lives. But do we recognize that we are "lost" and that we are in need of a Savior. The reality is that many Christians have become lukewarm when it comes to sin and the necessity for repentance. Recent polls, for example, reveal that 40% of Catholics say they **never** go to Confession, and only 2% receive the Sacrament regularly! We continue to refuse this incredible gift from Jesus by not seeking him out, by not taking the actions necessary to see him and to reconcile ourselves with neighbor and God. We are, in fact, refusing to receive the gift of grace, that essential element present in the Sacrament which aids us in our spiritual lives.

We need to recognize who we are in the story of Zacchaeus. There were many present as Jesus walked into Jericho. Some were following Jesus and loved him, and some didn't care much about him, but were wondering why others were so interested in him. And there were also those who hated Jesus and were simply waiting for him to mess up. But one person was seeking him, Zacchaeus, and that one received the presence of Jesus himself and the salvation that comes through him. I pray that each one of us learn the valuable lessons from Zacchaeus: making things right with others and with God, repentance, and wholeheartedly seeking Jesus in our lives – inviting Jesus to be a guest in our house.

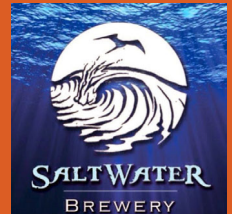

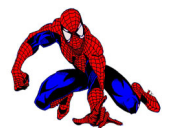

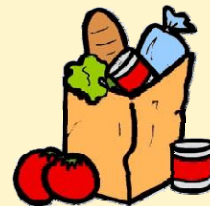
