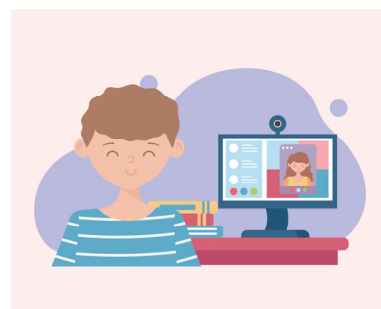

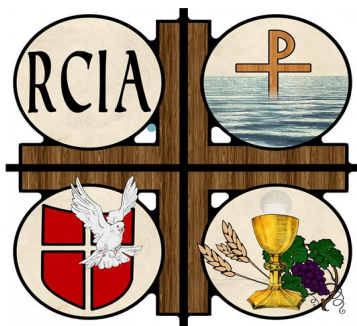

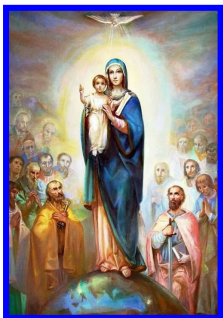

XXIII domingo: Jesús en medio de los discípulos

El Evangelio nos habla claramente del perdón y pone, en boca del propio Cristo, una medida que es una invitación a luchar por alcanzar el infinito: «perdonar hasta setenta veces siete», es decir, perdonar siempre. El perdón, por lo tanto, queda así instaurado como una práctica típica de la caridad cristiana. Más tarde, cuando veamos a Cristo en la cruz perdonando a sus enemigos, comprenderemos hasta qué extremos debe llegar el ejercicio de esta práctica. La duda está en saber si el perdón equivale al olvido o si perdonar implica no protegerse para las próximas ocasiones y que tiene muchas posibilidades de volvértelo a hacer. Pero hay que olvidar que perdonar significa, en cierto modo, olvidar y también arriesgarte a que te hagan daño de nuevo. Pero perdonar no implica ignorar el talante del que te ha herido, sino darle una nueva oportunidad siempre que él de muestras serias de querer aprovecharla. Significa ayudarle, aunque no se lo merezca. No vengarte, aunque tengas la oportunidad de hacerlo. Y significa ayudarte a ti mismo, pues la medida que uses la usarán contigo. Empezando por Dios y siguiendo por esos prójimos a los que tú has herido.
