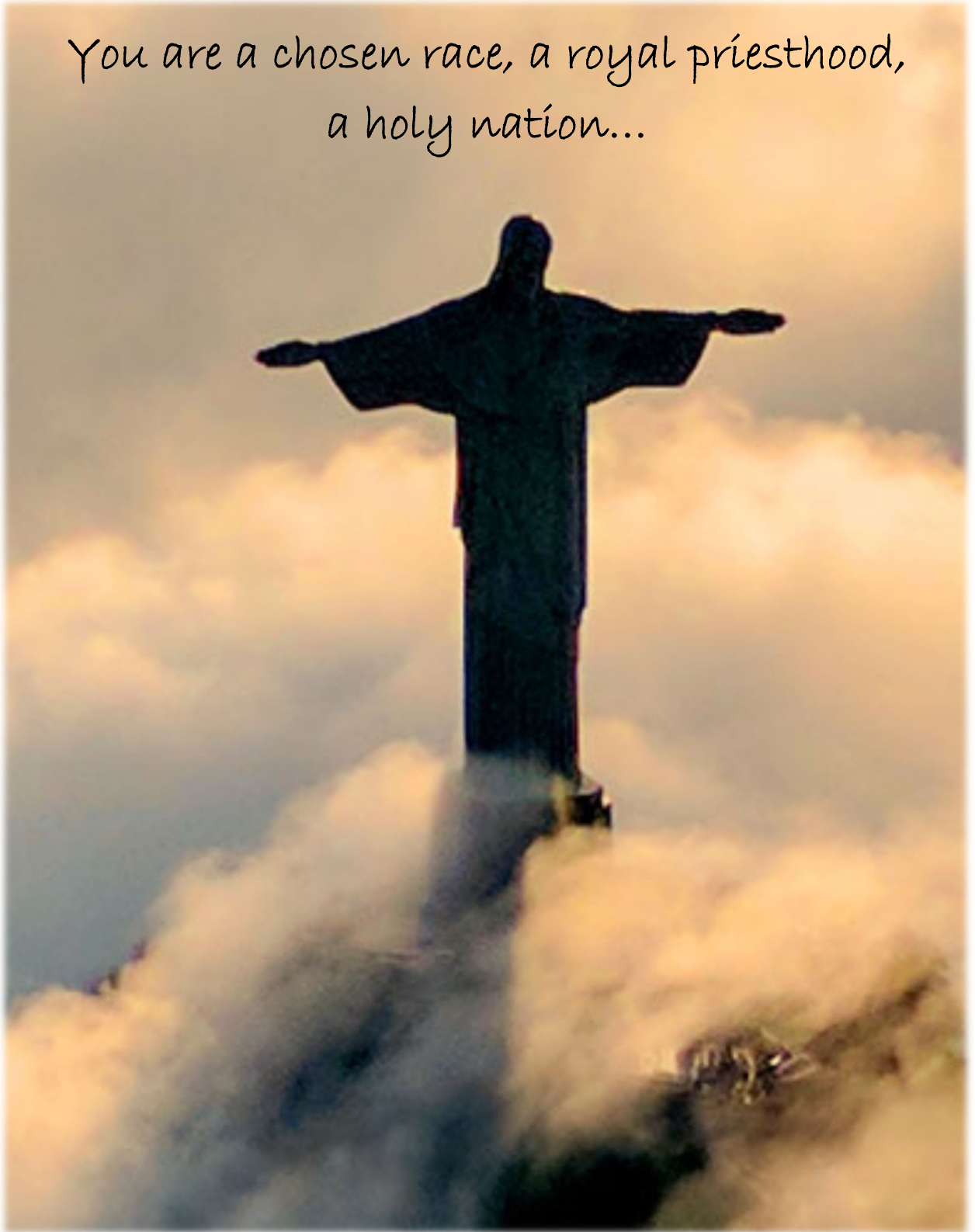

Para ello será útil que nos fijemos en el tiempo que dedicamos a cada cosa. Es natural que dediquemos más tiempo a trabajar que a rezar, pero no tanto que no quede nada para lo segundo. Y lo mismo pasa con el descanso. El valor que damos a las cosas y a las personas, se mide por el tiempo que pasamos con ellas. El tiempo que dedicamos a Dios nos da la medida de la importancia que para nosotros tiene Dios. Y después vendrá lo demás: actuar conforme a nuestra conciencia, aunque eso nos suponga algún problema. Pero, no lo olvidemos, poner a Dios en el primer lugar de la vida, que es el que le corresponde, no significa olvidar o despreciar al resto; significa que, por amor a Dios, vamos también a amarles a ellos, incluso cuando no nos apetezca. Él sí que tiene derecho a estar en el primer lugar de nuestro corazón, de nuestra vida e intereses, por ser nuestro Dios, Creador y Redentor.
