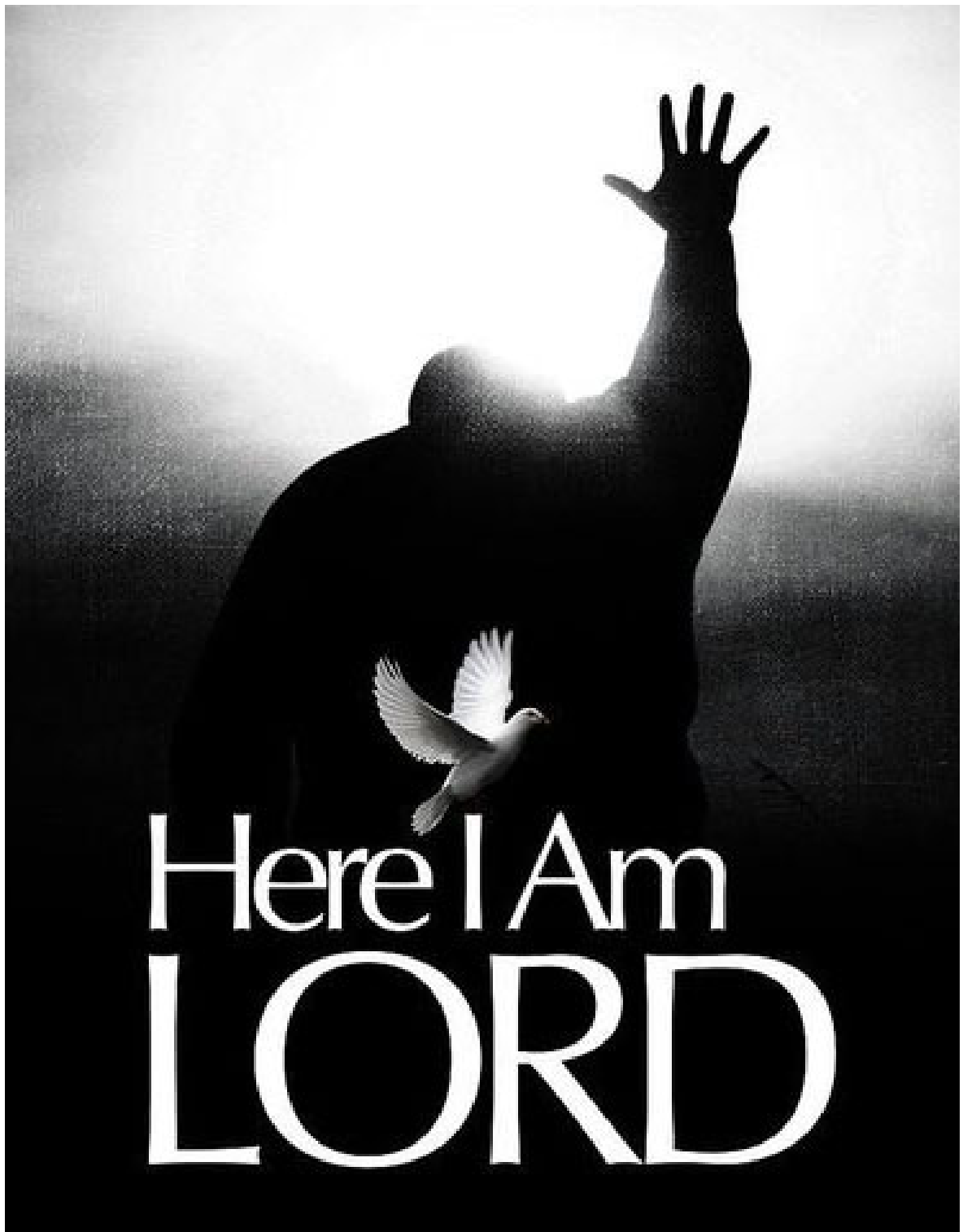

Sick and Homebound: We are blessed to have a group of volunteers in our parish who are happy to bring Holy Communion to the sick, the hospitalized and the homebound. Please call the parish office to make arrangements if you or your loved one would like a priest to visit with the Sacrament of Anointing.

Diocesan Services Appeal

Thank you to all who answered the call and supported our Diocese through your financial gifts to the 2020 Diocesan Services Appeal. Liturgy Corner

Liturgical Colors

A variety of color helps us to express the mysteries of faith celebrated in our liturgy as we journey through the liturgical year. About four hundred years ago, the Council of Trent decreed that certain colors should be used for specific liturgical seasons and celebrations. We continue to use those colors today.

- Green is used for the Sundays and weekdays of Ordinary Time. Used most often in the year, it symbolizes hope, growth, and immortality.
- White is the color for the seasons of Christmas and Easter, solemnities and feasts of the Lord and the Virgin Mary, and most saints' days. It symbolizes joy, purity, innocence, and victory.
- Red is seen on Palm Sunday, Good Friday, Pentecost, and on days that celebrate saints who are martyrs, apostles, or evangelists. It is the color of sacrifice (blood itself), charity, and the Holy Spirit.
- Violet or purple is used in Advent and Lent, as it symbolizes sorrow, penitence, and preparation. Hue variations allow us to differentiate the seasons by choosing a blue-violet for Advent and the traditional red-purple for Lent.
- Rose, an optional color, may be used on Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent) and Laetare Sunday (Fourth Sunday of Lent) to express subdued joy, and relieved repentance.

There are other optional colors in our liturgical rainbow. Gold or silver, symbolic of joy and victory, may replace white on particularly solemn or festive occasions. Black symbolizing death and mourning, may be used in place of white or purple for funerals and on All Souls Day.

2º Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario: La fuerza de la gracia

2021: Un año dedicado a san José Historia:



Hace 150 años, San José fue declarado Patrono de la Iglesia Católica a través del decreto Quemadmodum Deus, documento que fue firmado el 8 de diciembre de 1870 por el beato Pío IX. En la carta apostólica que escribe el papa Francisco y en la cual anuncia este año especial dedicado a san José, lo describe como un padre amado, tierno, valiente, creativo y discreto. Este año tiene además a la pandemia como el contexto que determina el contenido de la carta apostólica. Al respecto, el Santo Padre explicó que el COVID-19, reveló la importancia de la gente común, de las personas cuya vida está lejos del protagonismo, ejercen la paciencia y comparten la esperanza cada día, sembrando la corresponsabilidad y que como san José pasan desapercibidos. Se trata del hombre de la presencia diaria y oculta. No obstante, san José goza de un protagonismo sin igual en la Sagrada Escritura.

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
