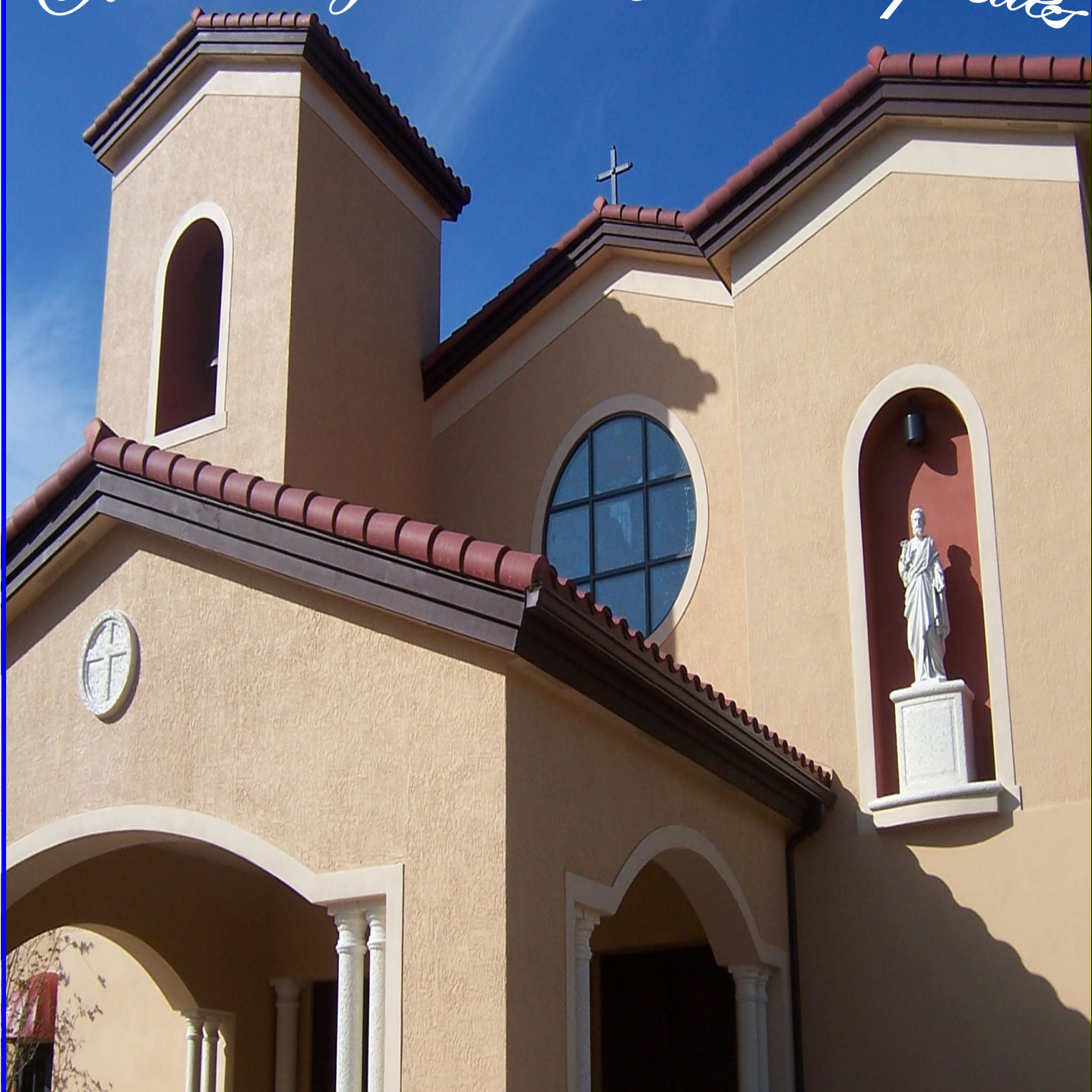

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

SUNDAY READINGS: Exod 17:8-13. 2Tim 3:14-4:2. Luke 18:1-8

Persistent Prayer

At the time of Jesus, when people wanted to bring a case before a judge, they had to go to the city gates, push their way through the mass of people there, and shout out their case over the noise of everyone else. This pushing, shoving, and yelling meant that cases to be heard were almost always brought to the judge by men. Women were generally silent and did not make appeals for themselves, and those who had no husband, brothers, or sons to speak on their behalf were particularly vulnerable. Yet the widow in today's Gospel is persistent in her petition to the unjust judge. She shows up each and every day, making her way through the crowds, to yell out her complaint to the judge. The judge eventually gives this widow a just decision, not because he fears God or respects people, but in order to avoid public shame and embarrassment. Jesus makes the point that if an unjust and corrupt human judge will render a just verdict because of persistence, how much more will our Father, the most perfect and honest judge, hear and respond to our pleas when we are in need.

Persistence, however, is not easy. There are so many things in our world and in our personal lives that are disturbing and troubling, that it is sometimes easy to lose heart. Oftentimes, we can feel emotionally and spiritually depleted, disappointed, and discouraged, but Jesus is telling us to take courage and continue to pray. Prayer is that act of love we make with God where we share ourselves with him, openly and honestly. When we are seeking answers, we put our concerns, questions, fears, and sorrows at the feet of Jesus, and when answers don't come immediately, we can only continue in prayer through faith. Prayer doesn't change God; it changes us. Our faith grows and the depth of our spirituality expands when we are able to be persistent in our petitions and prayer and cultivate our relationship with God. As we consistently and honestly expose our innermost thoughts and feelings to him, it will eventually be God himself who speaks through us in our prayer. When we are troubled or having difficulty in our prayer life, it is refreshing for some to reflect on the prayer of St. Teresa of Avila:

Let nothing trouble you. Let nothing frighten you.

All things are passing. God never changes.

Patience obtains everything. Whoever has God lacks nothing.

God alone suffices.

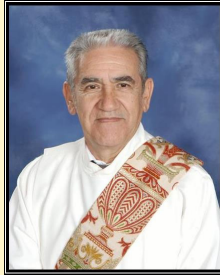

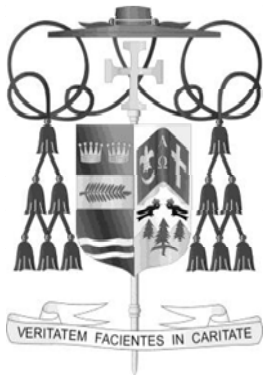

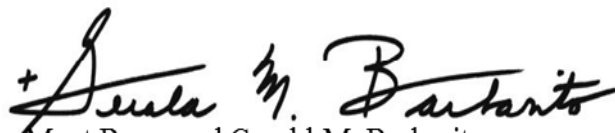
