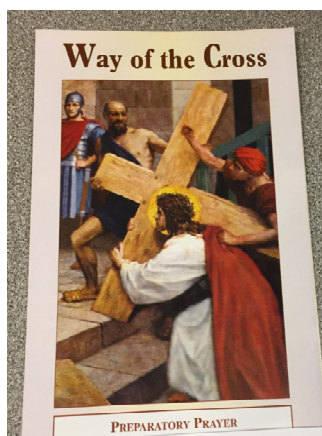
Sacramental Information

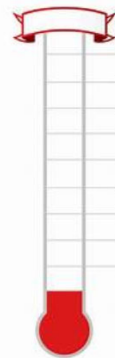

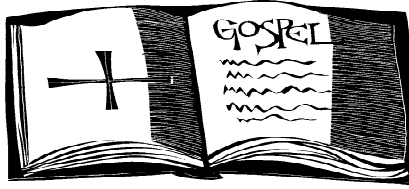
DSA Offering Weekend—February 22 and 23

Liturgy Notes



Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time—ordered time—is comprised of 33 or 34 weeks (Solemnity of Christ the King) in the liturgical year that are not part of either the Advent and Christmas or Lent and Easter seasons. It consists of two phases: the first falls between the end of the Christmas season, (Baptism of the Lord) and the beginning of Lent (Ash Wednesday), while the second and longer phase begins on the Monday following Pentecost Sunday and continues until the First Sunday of Advent. While these seasons have distinctive character, the weeks of Ordinary Time, especially the Sundays, are devoted to the mystery of Christ in its entirety.

Women and Heart Disease

Women are less likely to experience chest pain during a heart attack. Women are more likely to have "atypical" symptoms such as nausea, indigestion, shortness of breath, and fatigue.

Common Symptoms of a Heart Attack:

- Chest Pain
- Shortness of breath

- Pain in arm
- Pressure or tightness in chest

Pre Heart Attack Symptoms: (can occur 4 to 6 months to 1 week before a heart attack)

- Back, neck, or jaw pain
- Nausea
- Vomiting
