SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

Deacon's Corner - 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time (C) -2016 Scripture:

"Rejoice with me, for I have found the sheep that was lost..."

"Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I lost..."

"... rejoice, because this brother of yours was dead and has come to life..." Luke 5:1-32

The parables taught by Jesus in today's Gospel reveal a God who never gives up on us; a God whose love is endless and whose forgiveness is eternal; a God who always seeks us out and offers new beginnings, endless chances and clean slates to all. So great is the mysterious love of God that no one is ever written off as lost or dead or hopelessly irredeemable. All God asks of us, in return, is to try to love and forgive one another as God loves and forgives us. Spiritual author Brennan Manning in his book, "The Ragamuffin Gospel," writes: "Often hobbling through our church doors on Sunday mornings comes grace on crutches - sinners still unable to throw away their false supports and stand upright in the freedom of the children of God. Yet their mere presence in church is a flickering candle representing a desire to maintain contact with God. To douse that flame is to plunge them into a world of spiritual darkness. The church is not a museum for saints, but a hospital for sinners." Our gospel acclamation paraphrased sums it all up: "God was present in Christ to reconcile us to himself." Well, if God copes with the likes of us, maybe we can cope with the likes of others, whoever and whatever they are.

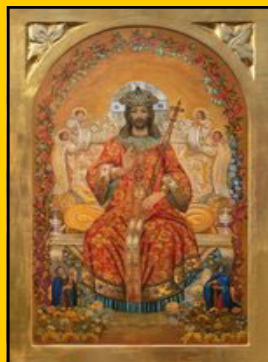

7. Rezar a Dios por los vivos y por los difuntos (continuación)

Las almas del purgatorio ya no tienen manos físicas para pedir auxilio y misericordia; no podemos, como a un mendigo en la tierra, mirar sus ojos tristes y cansados, dirigirle nuestras palabras y gestos, intentando ofrecerles un consuelo; pero eso sí, con la valentía de nuestra fe, podemos dirigir nuestras oraciones al Padre, para que cuanto antes esas almas reciban la Gloria eterna, el consuelo y la paz que tanto anhelan. Ofrecemos nuestras oraciones por las almas que están en el purgatorio porque creemos que el amor es más fuerte que la misma muerte. Nuestra fe nos da la certeza de que podemos seguir haciendo el bien a aquellos que amamos, y ni siquiera la barrera del sepulcro nos puede impedir manifestarles nuestro amor. Benedicto XVI, antes de ser Papa, dijo “el hombre no dialoga en solitario con Dios, el diálogo cristiano con Dios pasa precisamente a través de los hombres, este diálogo se da en el *corpo de Cristo*, en la comunión con el Hijo; comunión que es la que de verdad da al hombre la posibilidad de llamar a Dios su Padre” (cf. Joseph Ratzinger, *Escatología*, 176-177). Ejercitémonos en este *diálogo con Dios* por medio de nuestra oración por nuestros hermanos, los hombres. Hagámoslo con una actitud llena de fe en la acción de Dios en favor de aquellos por quienes pedimos, para que nuestra oración sea escuchada, y la misericordia del Padre se haga presente en sus vidas.
