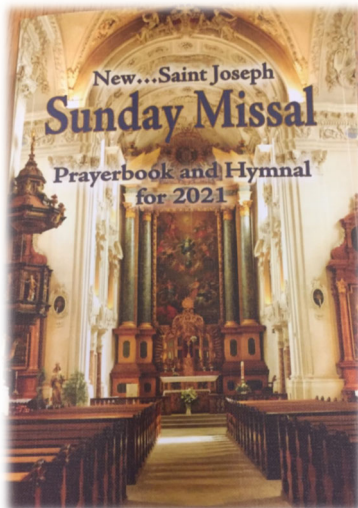

Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out-of-town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Liturgy Corner

Come, Open Your Hearts To Christmas

Our liturgy for this Sunday celebrates another aspect of the Incarnation of Christ ✠ his sharing in the life of a human family. The Feast of the Holy Family is an “idea feast,” like the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. It does not commemorate a specific event in the life of Christ, but rather fosters a devotion to the Holy Family as a model for all family life. Private devotion to the Holy Family dates back to the 16th century. The devotion became part of our liturgical calendar in 1893 and has been observed as part of the octave of Christmas since 1920.



The Christmas crèche, a beloved image of the Holy Family, was created by Saint Francis of Assisi on Christmas Eve 1223. He was a renowned preacher. Wishing to make the story of Christ’s birth real to people attending Mass, Francis had an actual manger, filled with straw and a figure of the infant Christ, as well as a real ox and ass placed before the people who gathered to hear his Christmas homily. We are told that ‘each one returned to their homes filled with holy joy.’ When we view the nativity scene, we too are reminded of the greatness of God’s love for us and reflect on the mystery of the Incarnation of God’s Son.

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

Sagrada Familia: El amor como respeto

Todos sabemos que hoy la familia atraviesa una gran crisis, con muchos problemas derivados de la incertidumbre acerca de cuál es el papel que deben jugar los padres, cuál el de los hijos y cuáles los límites de los derechos de unos y de otros. No es fácil la convivencia y por eso son cada vez más el número de familias rotas. El objetivo de esta semana es el de construir o reforzar las relaciones de amor partiendo del respeto a los derechos del otro sin que eso signifique abdicar de los derechos propios. Para ello conviene conjugar dos principios básicos. El primero es el de que toda convivencia implica sacrificio, aunque también lleva aneja la existencia de buenos momentos; no se puede pretender vivir en familia sin amor y no se puede pretender amar sin aceptar la cruz; si se elige no vivir en familia, hay que tener en cuenta que también ahí hay sacrificios, el de la soledad, por ejemplo. El segundo principio es el de que todo tiene un límite y cuando se sobrepasa se recurren a medidas extraordinarias que la Iglesia permite; pero hasta llegar a ese límite normalmente hay un largo camino que hay que recorrer, con paciencia, con generosidad, con inteligencia.

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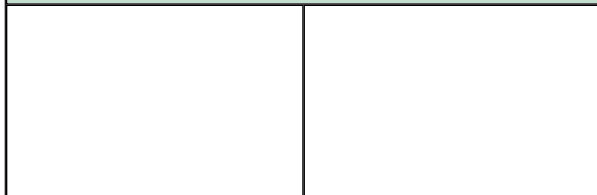
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
