


OUR LADY QUEEN OF THE APOSTLES



JOHN 19:39-40:7

39 Jesus said: "Take away the stone from the sepulcher." 40 And there came also Thomas, whom the first came to Jesus before night, and he said: "Behold, we have found the sepulcher is empty." 41 Then took they the body of Jesus, and wrapped it in linen cloths with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to bury. 42 Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new sepulcher, wherein was never man yet laid. Jesus therefore having seen

that stone laid, went and said to the women: "Go, tell his disciples that he is risen, and he will come to you in Galilee." 43 And when they heard him say this, they returned to the city, and said to the other disciples: "We have seen the Lord." 44 And when they heard that, they believed him. 45 And when they came back to the city, they told what had happened to them. 46 And when Peter and John heard that, they went to the sepulcher. 47 And when they came near, they saw the cloths lying, but when they went in, they saw a young man sitting on the right side, who said to them: "Be not afraid, go, tell his disciples that he is risen, and he will come to you in Galilee." 48 And when they heard him say this, they went out, and told the other disciples. 49 And when the other disciples heard that, they believed him. 50 And when they were coming out, they met Jesus walking in the garden, and he said to them: "Peace be with you." 51 And when they saw him, they were afraid, and said to him: "Rabbi, why art thou here?" 52 And he said to them: "Why are ye looking for him who is risen? He is not here, but is gone to Galilee, that ye may see him there." 53 And when they heard him say this, they went into the sepulcher, and saw what was said to them.

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Live in the Resurrection of Christ

Happy Easter! Alleluia! Jesus Christ is RISEN! Alleluia!

Without the Resurrection, all of our Christian belief is for nothing! The Resurrection of Jesus confirms who he said he was, and who he is: Jesus is the Son of God. Jesus has the power to forgive sins and the power over death, the consequence of sin. He forgives sins. He gives us eternal life in his glorious kingdom. We only need to respond, as Mary did, with our “Yes.”

He gives us an undeserved gift, and invites us to participate in the divine life with him through our baptism. It is through grace and by faith that we can enter into this life with him, as we are supported by the community of believers, our Church. Jesus wants us to live our lives, right here and now, as children of the Resurrection. We have a hope that is so far beyond anything the world can offer, that it drives us to a life lived in love; not a love of the things of this world, but a powerful, Christ-centered, eternal love that can only come from God himself.

Love rejoices in Christ who is present in his followers and in all of creation, and today creation celebrates his Resurrection. We who call ourselves Christian are called to live our lives on earth in the presence of the Resurrected Jesus. We are to be people of the Resurrection, which means our lives should reflect that we have died with Christ in the waters of baptism, when we ourselves received the light of Christ. It is this light that brings hope to our world. It is this light that should shine forth from each of us, as do the rays of the sun in the sky above. This light of Christ is present in our love for God and neighbor as we recognize his holy presence in each other, as we see that we are all created in his likeness and image and each possess our own God-given dignity.

We are on this journey together, and so we worship together as a community of believers, a people of faith, with hope in the Resurrection, as we journey through this life in love together. Our lives should reflect our belief in the Resurrection, or we are fooling ourselves. Today, we are reminded to live our lives in the Resurrection of Christ, to let his light shine through us.

So let's take time today to examine whether our lives, and how we live them, truly reflect the presence of the Resurrected Christ. Do we see him in ourselves? Do we see him in others? Do we love others, our family, friends, and neighbors, as he loved us? What is preventing us? He is already raised and seated at the Right Hand of God. There is nothing to fear. We are called to this same fulfillment.


Vacation Bible school will be June 19th-23rd. Mark your calendars! Registration will start May 1st.

Semana Santa 2017



Domingo de Ramos

Es una oportunidad para proclamar a Jesús como Rey y Centro de nuestras vidas. Debemos parecernos a esa gente de Jerusalén que se entusiasmó por seguir a Cristo. Decir "que viva mi Cristo, que viva mi rey..." Es un día en el que le podemos decir a Cristo que nosotros también queremos seguirlo, aunque tengamos que sufrir o morir por Él. Que queremos que sea el rey de nuestra vida, de nuestra familia, de nuestra patria y del mundo entero. Queremos que sea nuestro amigo en todos los momentos de nuestra vida.



Jueves Santo

Este día recordamos la Última Cena de Jesús con sus apóstoles en la que les lavó los pies dándonos un ejemplo de servicialidad. En la Última Cena, Jesús se quedó con nosotros en el pan y en el vino, nos dejó su cuerpo y su sangre. Es el jueves santo cuando instituyó la Eucaristía y el Sacerdocio. Al terminar la última cena, Jesús se fue a orar al Huerto de los Olivos. Ahí pasó toda la noche y después de mucho tiempo de oración, llegaron a aprehenderlo.



Viernes Santo

¿Cómo podemos vivir este día? Este día manda la Iglesia guardar el ayuno y la abstinencia. Se acostumbra rezar el Vía Crucis y meditar en las Siete Palabras de Jesús en la cruz. Se participa en la Liturgia de Adoración a la Cruz con mucho amor, respeto y devoción. Se trata de acompañar a Jesús en su sufrimiento. A las tres de la tarde, recordamos la crucifixión de Jesús rezando el Credo.



Sábado Santo

Es el día de la ausencia. El Esposo nos ha sido arrebatado. Día de dolor, de reposo, de esperanza, de soledad. El mismo Cristo está callado. Él, que es el Verbo, la Palabra, está callado. Después de su último grito de la cruz "¿por qué me has abandonado?" - ahora él calla en el sepulcro. Descansa: "consummatum est", "todo se ha cumplido".
