## **SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION**

**Baptisms:** Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

**Marriages:** You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

**Sick and Homebound:** Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

**SUNDAY READINGS: Isa 8:23-9:3. 1Cor 1:10-13, 17. Matt 4:12-23*****Let There be No Divisions***

*In today's Second Reading, St. Paul urges us, "in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree in what you say, and that there be **no divisions** among you, but that you **be united** in the same mind and in the same purpose." It is a good reminder for us in our marriages and in our families, that we try to heal those things that separate us and divide us, that we become more closely united together, because it is in our unity that others will see the love of our Father, the love of Jesus Christ. Jesus also prays for us in the Gospel of John, that we might be one, as he and his Father are also one, so that the world will know him. Jesus is present and is revealed in this unity, not in our divisions. This is true in our relationships with others, and also within the full community of believers.*

*This Third Sunday of Ordinary Time happens to fall during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity for 2017. This "week" is always scheduled to run from January 18<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter (the first pope), through January 25<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul. These two celebrations have significance for us as Catholics, as they help us to recall our beginnings as an Apostolic Church, with Peter our Rock, as well as the universal and missionary nature of our Church, that it is a Church for all people in all times. We are reminded of this by the Feast of St. Paul, who carried the Gospel message to the Gentiles, establishing churches and communities of believers throughout the world.*

*This past Thursday, members our church, along with parishioners from several other Catholic churches and Protestant communities, gathered together for an evening of prayer, reflecting on the theme of "Reconciliation – the Love of Christ Compels Us." This theme was chosen by the organizers, because this year marks 500 years since the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. In a Church that began as One over 2,000 years ago, we now see somewhere between 30,000 and 50,000 different Christian communities and churches. The separation among Christian believers hurts all of us, and the only means for re-establishing right relationships, to heal the pain of this separation, is through reconciliation. The division we all feel, even in our own families, is real and painful. Reconciliation is truly the only means to resolve and heal this division within the Christian communities, and to move closer to the unity to which Christ calls us.*

*Let's take time this week to reach out to those in our families, or perhaps some of our friends, coworkers, or neighbors, and begin the process of healing by demonstrating to them the love of Christ that we find through our faith. Let's recognize and emphasize what we share in common, and use that to build up our relationships, not dwelling on only that which is different and divides us. And let's earnestly pray for our marriages, our families, and the entire community of believers, that we will seek and foster all of that which can bring us closer and ultimately unite us as one in Christ Jesus.*

## **THE PRESENTATION OF JESUS IN THE TEMPLE AS IT IS WRITTEN IN THE BIBLE**

*The story of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple is told in the book of Luke chapter 2: 22-29. Mary and Joseph were faithful Jews and observed their religious customs. One of the important customs is for the couple to take their first-born son to the Temple. The Baby was taken to the Temple forty days after his birth and was dedicated to God. In addition, if the parents were wealthy, they were to bring a lamb to be offered as a sacrifice at the Temple. The custom provided that if the parents were poor, they were to offer two pigeons or two turtle doves for the sacrifice.*

*When Jesus was forty days old, Mary and Joseph took Him to the Temple in Jerusalem. They were not wealthy, so they brought two turtle doves with them to offer as a sacrifice. As they arrived in the Temple, a very old man name Simeon met Mary and Joseph. He was a holy man and was noted as a very intelligent scholar. Simeon spent much time studying about the prophet of Israel. It was during his studies that he learned of the coming of the Messiah. The Jewish people were waiting for the Messiah to come and deliver Israel from their conquerors. From that time on, Simeon spent many years of his time, praying for the Messiah to come. In praying, he heard the voice of God. God promise him, he will not die until he had seen the Messiah. Simeon was at the Temple; filled with the Holy Spirit, he took Jesus in his arms, blessed God saying: "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your words, my eyes have seen your salvation, **A LIGHT** for revelation to the Gentiles and Glory for your people Israel."*

*After Jesus was presented in the Temple, the family returned to Galilee to the town of Nazareth. The Bible tells us that, Jesus grew, became strong and filled with wisdom.*

*This feast, celebrated on **February 2**, is known in the Orthodox Church as the Presentation of Christ in the Temple. Another name for the feast is the meeting of our Lord. Roman Catholic and Protestant Christians call the feast: The Purification of the Holy Virgin. About 450 AD in Jerusalem, people began the custom of holding lighted candles during the Divine Liturgy of this feast day. Therefore, some churches in the West refer to this holy day as Candlemas (meaning, after childbirth, according to Jewish law, candles were traditionally blessed on February 2, at this festivities.)*
