

## Liturgy Notes



Ordinary Time was interrupted this past Wednesday as we begin the most important phase of our liturgical year, the Lent-Triduum-Easter cycle. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a season of preparation for the celebration of Easter. Lent provides two important themes for reflection, baptism and penance. Along with catechumens preparing for baptism, we have the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of our baptismal call to live as disciples of Christ.

We begin our Lenten observance by marking our foreheads with ashes as a visible sign of our desire for inner conversion. Why ashes? In the early Church, those who committed serious sin and sought to be forgiven and reconciled to the community would perform public penance. Sometimes the penitents were required to sprinkle ashes on the heads, as did the penitents of the Old Testament, to signify their condition. After public penance ceased to be practiced, Christians developed the custom of going to church on the Wednesday before Lent to receive ashes. In a simple ritual, men's heads were sprinkled with ashes, while women received a cross of ashes on their foreheads. Today, we continue the custom of receiving ashes as a sign of our desire to return to the Lord and be reconciled to each other.

**Lord, bless the sinner who asks for your forgiveness and bless all those who receive these ashes. May they keep this Lenten season in preparation for the joy of Easter.** *(taken from the Blessing of Ashes)*
