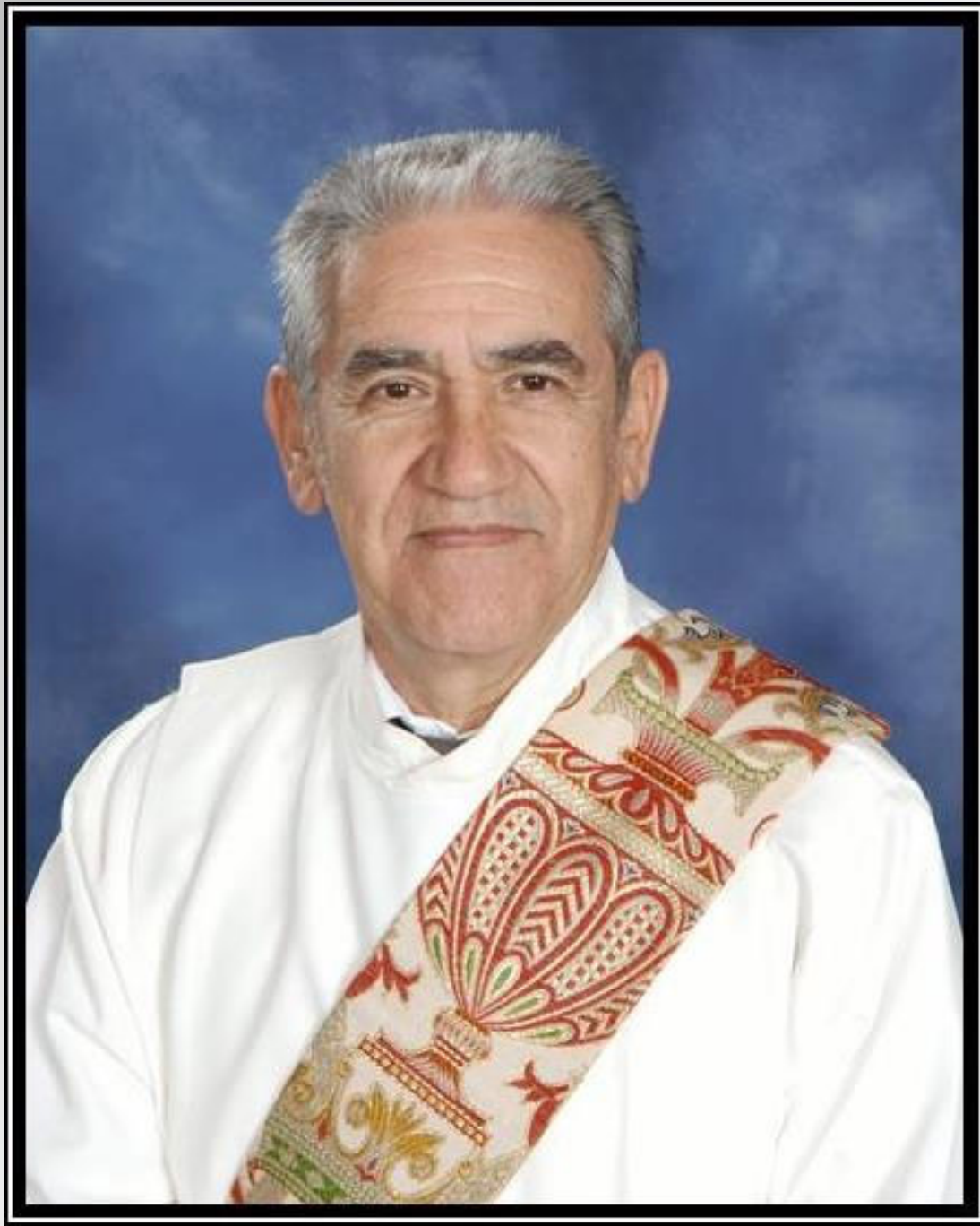

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

SUNDAY READINGS: Hb 1:2-3; 2:2-4. 2Tim 1:6-8, 13-14. Luke 17:5-10***Increase Our Faith***

In today's Gospel, the disciples make a heartfelt request of Jesus. They saw Jesus' faith in action. They witnessed the many miracles he performed. They listened as Jesus taught about God in new ways. And they hoped to live their lives just as Jesus did. They truly wanted to follow him and be one with Jesus. So they said to him, "Lord, increase our faith". The response from Jesus might unsettle us. He basically tells them that they have very little faith – not even faith as big as a mustard seed, and mustard seeds are extremely tiny. It takes about 20 of them lined up to equal just 1 inch. But Jesus tells his disciples that if they had faith the size of a mustard seed, they could do the impossible, they could live the life they seek.

Jesus then goes on to instruct the disciples on how to increase their faith. We are all called to be servants, just as Jesus served. In other Gospel passages, Jesus says that he did not come to the world to be served; rather, he came to serve others and give his life as a ransom for them. Today, Jesus tells us that we are to do what we have been commanded. Once we have done all that we are supposed to do, once we have fulfilled our responsibilities as followers of Jesus and in Christian love, we should realize that we are still "unprofitable servants". This isn't meant to make us feel bad about ourselves. It is to foster humility. It is through humility that our faith will be increased.

When we follow Jesus, we follow him who is meek and humble. When we imitate Jesus, we serve our sisters and brothers, not for our own pride and esteem, but in humility out of love for them. Our call of service is to bring God's kingdom to everyone we know and meet. This is done in love and charity, and gives hope for our eternal life. In one of his letters, St. Paul writes, "Faith is the realization of what is hoped for and evidence of things not seen" (Heb 11:1). In loving humility and service, we build up this faith that supports our hope of eternal life, life with the resurrected Jesus, who is our savior.

This can be the week of realizing our need for humble service. Who can we lovingly serve this week in a new way? How can we spend time serving Jesus in our neighbors, coworkers, family, or classmates? If we want Jesus to "increase our faith," we must be willing to use what little faith we have to humbly serve in his name. Jesus, in his infinite love for us, will take care of the rest.

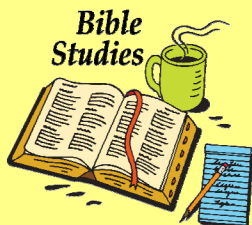
