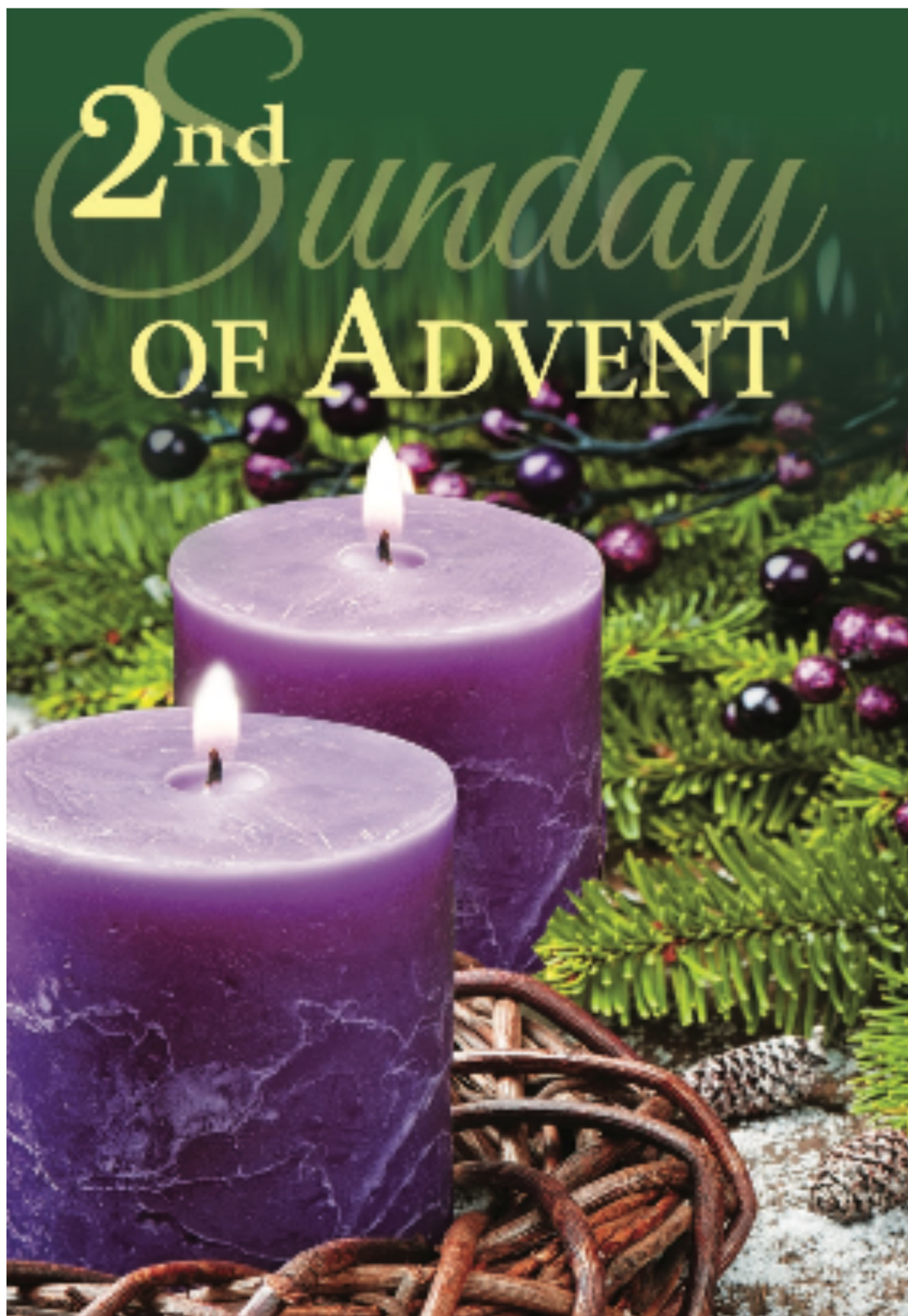

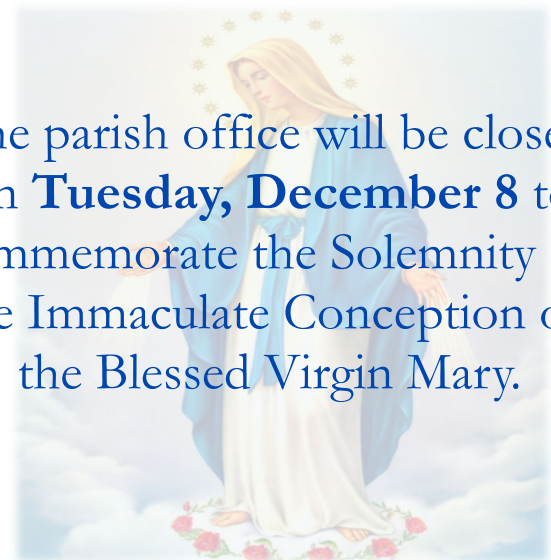

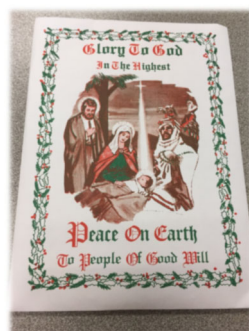

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out-of-town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Come, Lord Jesus, Come!



Did you know that “**Advent**” derives from the Latin word **adventus**, which means “**coming**”? It is a Christian word with a pagan origin. In the imperial courts of the Roman Empire, it signified the first official visit of an important person at the time of his accession to the throne. There are ancient coins commemorating Adventus Augusti (“The coming of Augustus”). Early Christian writers adopted the term to describe the coming of Christ among us, both his coming in the flesh in human history and his coming in glory at the end of time.

On Tuesday, December 8, we celebrate the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Because it is a solemnity, we pray the Gloria and the Creed. This solemnity is a fitting celebration for the season of Advent because we see the hand of God preparing the way for His Son, choosing Mary and keeping her free from sin from the very moment of her conception. She is our model of holiness.

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

II domingo de Adviento: Creer en la gracia

El Evangelio de hoy nos invita a tener fe en la gracia de Dios, la fe en que Dios no nos deja solos en la lucha contra el pecado, la fe en la fuerza de Dios capaz de intervenir en nuestra vida para vencer las tentaciones. La fe en la gracia nos hace ser intrépidos, arriesgados, a veces pacientes, pues creemos que si algo está sucediendo es porque Dios, aunque sea misteriosamente, lo permite. Por último, creer en la gracia nos ayudará a practicar los sacramentos, la confesión, que es un hermoso acto de fe en que Dios, además de perdonar los pecados, puede ayudarnos a que no los repitamos. Recomendaciones de la Iglesia para vivir el Adviento:

3.- Que toda la familia arme el pesebre de Belén:

La Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos de la

Santa Sede también propuso que toda la familia participe en el armado del pesebre porque es una oportunidad para que "entren en contacto con el misterio de la Navidad". Invitaron a que "se recojan en un momento de oración o de lectura de las páginas bíblicas referidas al episodio del nacimiento de Jesús".

4.- Rezar la novena de Navidad:

El Directorio sobre la Piedad Popular y la Liturgia indica que la novena de Navidad es un ejercicio de piedad valioso que ayuda a preparar el corazón en los días previos a la celebración del nacimiento del Niño Jesús. Destacaron que es una práctica antigua que "nació para comunicar a los fieles las riquezas de una Liturgia a la cual no tenían fácil acceso". La novena de Navidad inicia el 16 de diciembre y termina el 24 de diciembre

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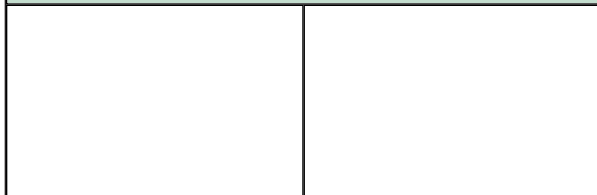
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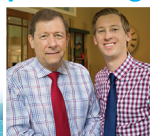
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
