SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

Our Lady of Mount Carmel (Feast day, July 16)

Our Lady of Mt. Carmel is one of the many titles of Mary, the most Blessed Mother of our Lord, Jesus.

The apparition of Mount Carmel mainly focuses on the brown Scapular given to Simon Stock by Our Lady. Simon was 82 when he was elected as superior general of the Carmelite order. He lived in Aylesford, England where the apparition took place. At this time, the order was experiencing turmoil within the community and also outside the community.

In the year 1251, Simon intensely requested Our Lady for her special guidance, counsel and intervention and assistance. The Virgin's answer was revealed to the prior general: "... Apply fearlessly to Pope Innocent, for they will receive from him an effective remedy for these difficulties." Following the counsel of the Virgin, the prior obtained a letter of protection from Pope Innocent IV against any abuses or assaults (Papal letter dated, Jan 13, 1252, Perugia.)

Our Lady appeared to Simon Stock, July 16, 1251, of the same year, holding in her hand, a Brown Scapular and the child Jesus in the other arm. She said to Simon: *"Take beloved son, this Scapular of thy Order as a badge of my confraternity and for thee and all Carmelites a special sign of grace; whoever dies in this garment, will not suffer everlasting fire. It is the sign of salvation, a safeguard in dangers, a pledge of peace and of the covenant."*

Saint Simon Stock lived a holy life for 100 years! He died in the Carmelite monastery at Bordeaux, France on May 16, 1265. The feast of "Our Lady of Mount Carmel" was instituted between 1376 and 1386 to celebrate the victory of the Carmelite Order over its enemies on obtaining the seal of approval of its name and constitution from Pope Honorius III on January 30, 1226. But the feast day was assigned to July 16th because of the apparition date.

In the year 1582, Pope Sixtus V officially approved this apparition.



Take out a one-dollar bill and look on the back. There you'll see the Great Seal of the United States. One side of the seal features the American eagle clutching in its talons both arrows and an olive branch and 13 stars clustered above its head.

Now look at the reverse side of the seal, the circle on the left of the dollar bill. There, under the eye of God, is a pyramid - but the pyramid is unfinished. The designers of the seal did that purposely. America is a country that always remains incomplete, its work never finished. Building a nation of justice and peace envisioned by our founders is a never-ending task that began 240 years ago and continues to our day and will continue over the next 240 years - and beyond. And, in the words of the great seal, the building of the American pyramid takes place under the eye of God with the prayer "Annuit coepis" - "May Providence favor our undertaking."

In today's Gospel, Jesus commissions seventy-two to go ahead of him to every household and community. The work of the seventy-two disciples has been passed down to every generation of Christians, including our own. Both the work of building America and establishing God's kingdom continue. On this weekend's celebration of our nation's founding, may we recommit ourselves to the work of building the pyramid that is America: life, liberty, and justice for all; as baptized in the life of Christ, may we continue the work of the seventy-two: to be messengers of God's reign of peace, compassion and reconciliation to all. 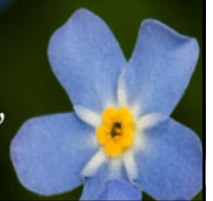

Dar buen consejo significa hacer memoria de nuestra misma vida y experiencia, de nuestro sufrimiento, necesidad, incapacidad y limitaciones. Hacer memoria no con tristeza, lamentaciones y hasta amargura, sino con gran confianza; reconociendo que Dios estaba presente también en esos momentos de nuestra vida. Recordar que él nos acompañaba y nos decía: estoy aquí y te amo. Una vez que hemos hecho memoria, conviene preguntarnos qué hemos aprendido de estas experiencias y qué puede ser útil para los demás?. Cómo les podemos ayudar a descubrir la mano de Dios y aprovechar las circunstancias duras o confusas de la vida para encontrar a este Padre que camina a nuestro lado.

Se trata, en fin, de extender la mano, sabiendo que aún con mis buenas intenciones, no tengo todas las respuestas, ni puedo resolver todos los problemas.

Aconsejar es echar mano de esta sabiduría vivida, haciéndolo con humildad y sencillez. Es ofrecer y no imponer, es compartir y no pontificar (exponer opiniones con tono dogmático y suficiencia). Se trata, a fin de cuentas, de llevar a otros a tener la seguridad de que Dios está cerca y Él será su luz y fortaleza siempre. En la oscuridad y confusión de una tempestad sobre el mar, como en el brillo de un amanecer de paz y serenidad, Dios está presente.
