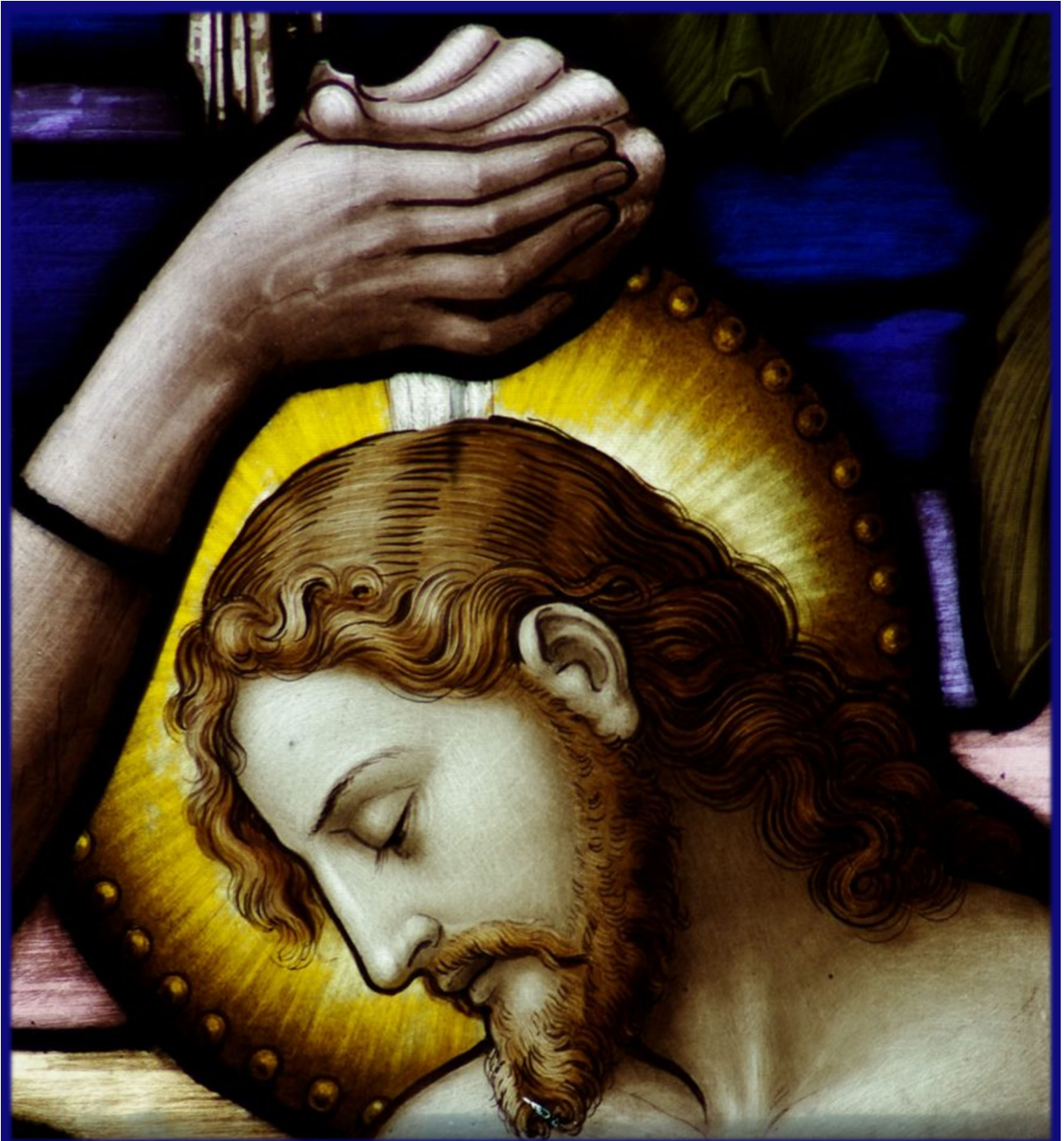

Liturgy Corner

This is he of whom John said: *I have seen and have given witness that this is the Son of God.*

(from the Communion antiphon for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord)



*Come, open your hearts
to **Christmas**.*

Today's feast, the Baptism of the Lord, is the first Sunday of Ordinary Time and concludes the Christmas season. In the 8th century, when Epiphany, like Christmas was given an octave, the gospel assigned for the celebration was the account of the Lord's baptism. Only in 1960 did the Baptism of the Lord become a feast in our liturgical calendar and in 1969 was assigned its current place, the Sunday following January 6 or the Monday following Epiphany if it falls on that Sunday.

Ordinary Time - ordered time- is comprised of 33 or 34 weeks in the liturgical year that are not part of either Advent/Christmas or Lent/Easter seasons. It consists of two phases: the first falls between the end of the Christmas season and the beginning of Lent; the second, and longer phase begins on the Monday following Pentecost Sunday and continues until the First Sunday of Advent. While these seasons have a distinctive character, the weeks of Ordinary Time, especially the Sundays, are devoted to the mystery of Christ in its entirety.

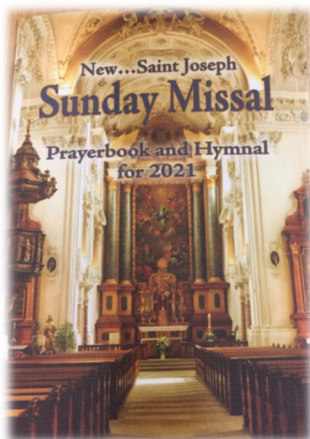

On January 3 we celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany (or Feast of the Three Kings). An ancient tradition has parishioners bringing home packets of blessed chalk, using the chalk to inscribe the initials of the legendary Three Kings over the doorway, and invoking their protection of the home.

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out-of-town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: We are blessed to have a group of volunteers in our parish who are happy to bring Holy Communion to the sick, the hospitalized and the homebound. Please call the parish office to make arrangements if you or your loved one would like a priest to visit with the Sacrament of Anointing.

Bautismo del Señor: Creer en el amor de Dios

Como todos los años, el primer domingo del Tiempo Ordinario se centra en la figura de Juan el Bautista y del Bautismo de Jesús. En el acto del bautismo Juan predica que ha llegado el momento anhelado y Dios ha venido a estar en medio de su pueblo. Este mensaje nos invita a meditar esta semana sobre el amor de Dios, y hacerlo a la vez que atravesamos el desierto de la vida –como Juan atravesó el desierto de Israel-. En el desierto se pasan momentos difíciles, lo mismo que en la vida. Es en esos momentos cuando tenemos que utilizar los recursos que llevábamos para sobrevivir. El agua que nos salvará es la fe en el amor de Dios –alimentada por el recuerdo de los momentos buenos en que nos sentíamos seguros de esa fe- y también la gracia de Dios que continuamente nos llega a través de los sacramentos. Se trata, por lo tanto, de creer en el amor de Dios y de acercarnos a ese amor mediante los sacramentos para que la fuerza que en ellos se nos comunica nos sostenga en la lucha diaria. Se trata de creer que a través de los sacramentos nos llega la fuerza y también de tener humildad para aceptar que no siempre podemos entender a Dios y que, por lo tanto, debemos estar preparados para aceptar el “silencio de Dios”.

2021: Un año dedicado a san José

El papa Francisco convocó a la Iglesia a vivir un año dedicado a san José. A través de la Carta Apostólica “Patris Corde” el Santo Padre anuncia este año especial para conmemorar los 150 años de la declaración del santo como patrono de la Iglesia Universal. La dedicación se extenderá hasta el 8 de diciembre. Se anuncia el decreto de la Penitenciaría Apostólica: **el don de la indulgencia plenaria especial para los días 19 de marzo y 1 de mayo**, es decir, aquellos que tradicionalmente se dedican a la memoria de san José y quienes cumplan los requisitos específicos se dará especial prioridad a los enfermos y ancianos, dadas las condiciones de la pandemia.

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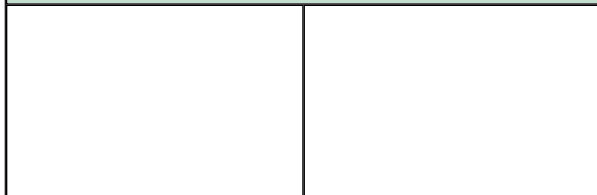
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
