2016 Diocesan Services Appeal

We want to thank you for your generosity in supporting our Diocese and Bishop Barbarito in our 2015 Diocesan Services Appeal. As you know the support of all the parishes throughout the diocese funds all their necessary activities and good works. Although we did not meet our goal, we did raise more funds for the Appeal than ever before. Once again it's that time of year where we begin our new appeal and our new commitment was \$217,000. After meeting with the Diocese and discussing our hard work and commitment to the Diocese, the Bishop approved a recommendation from the DSA Advisory Committee to not only reduce our goal to \$180,000 for 2016 but also to forgive our 2015 shortfall which as you can see below is \$32,543. (Assuming everyone fulfills their pledge). We are very grateful to the Committee and the Bishop for all their support and we truly trust that we will achieve our goal of \$180,000 in 2016!

"Jesus Christ is the face of the Father's mercy." With these words Pope Francis has called for an extraordinary year of mercy. The Pope is inviting us to spend the next year with mercy as a focal point of our spirituality.

As Catholics we've grown up with the word "mercy." At the Eucharist we repeat after the priest/deacon, "Lord, have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy," and just prior to receiving the Body of Christ we say, "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us." Thus many think of mercy as having to do primarily with forgiveness. Actually mercy comes from the Latin word "misericordia," derived from the two words "miserere" (pity or misery) and "cor" (heart). When we ask for God's mercy we are essentially asking the Lord to relieve us of a "heart that is in misery." And our hearts can be in a state of misery not just from sin, but from the deep hurt caused by a broken relationship, from the suffering and pain of physical or mental illness, from losing a job, from being betrayed or abandoned, from spiritual and physical poverty, and so on.

When we think about mercy as "relieving someone from a heart of misery," we can realize how often we have experienced God's mercy and also realize that we have given mercy to others in more ways than just forgiving someone who has wronged us.

The Holy Father indicates that he wants this special year of mercy to usher in a "revolution of tenderness." May we all pray to be empowered by the Holy Spirit with this gift of tender mercy towards all of God's people.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

Classes for Non-Second Grade Students Making First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

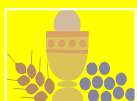

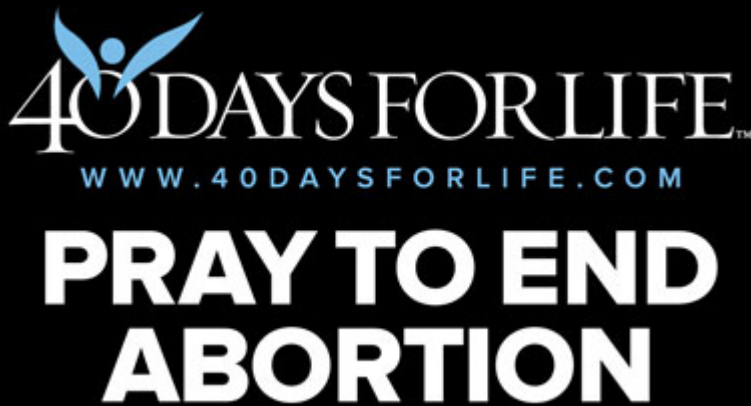
