Most of us would cringe at being called “holy” - that is only for people with a visible halo. Yet St. Paul opened his first letter to the Christians at Corinth saying we are all “called to be holy.” The Vatican II document *Lumen Gentium* insists that every member of the church is called to holiness, a holiness “expressed in many ways,” which is “a source of edification from others.”

A great definition of a saint is “someone who makes goodness attractive.” Such a perspective puts holiness of “sainthood” more within the reach of the ordinary believer. It counters the sense of Unattainability that so often characterizes the holiness of the canonized saints we are invited to venerate. Canonized saints are like the prominent stars in our night sky: named and charted and grouped into familiar constellations. But this limited view of our sky, awesome as it is. Fades to insignificance when we now glimpse our star studded universe through the Hubble Telescope. There is so much more than we ever imagined and each one of us have our own unique call to holiness in God’s universe. The varieties of holiness, the countless ways that persons show forth their goodness, reflect the individuality and uniqueness of each of God’s children.

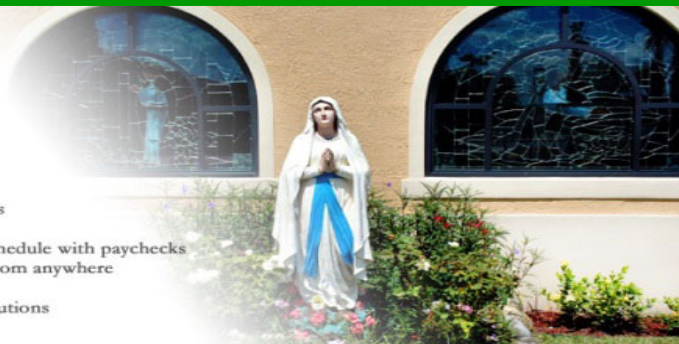
A Person’s holiness may strike us as wisdom, piety, generosity, justice, forgiveness, love, or any other virtue. The saints in our daily life may never be authenticated by canonization, but they are no less precious and helpful.

The Gospel reading for All Saints is the Eight Beatitudes from the Gospel of Matthew. Did you notice that Jesus addresses the crowd as he begins to speak? Jesus expects not only his disciples, but also the crowds to hear his words. The beatitudes are the new law issued by Jesus; they can also be seen as a list of qualities that define a saint. If you find yourself connecting to some of them, you can be assured you are showing others what it means to be a living saint.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptisms: Baptisms are celebrated twice each month. You need to come into the parish office to register for class. Ideally, preparation should begin during pregnancy. No confirmed dates are given before approval by the priest. In order to avoid disappointments, do not book travel plans with family, godparents, etc., until a confirmed date has been assigned at the conclusion of all stages of preparation. Parents needing annulments of marriages, or those not married, or those not married in the Church, will be assisted in addressing those issues before receiving a Baptismal date.

Marriages: You must be a registered and a supporting member of the parish for at least six months prior to your marriage. The date should not be set until a priest has been consulted.

Sick and Homebound: Please call the parish office to inform us of anyone hospitalized, homebound, or in need of the Sacraments.

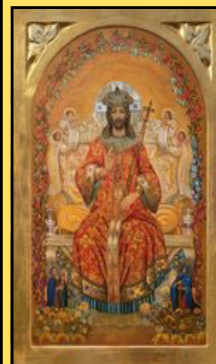

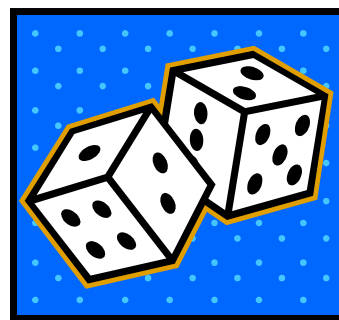
