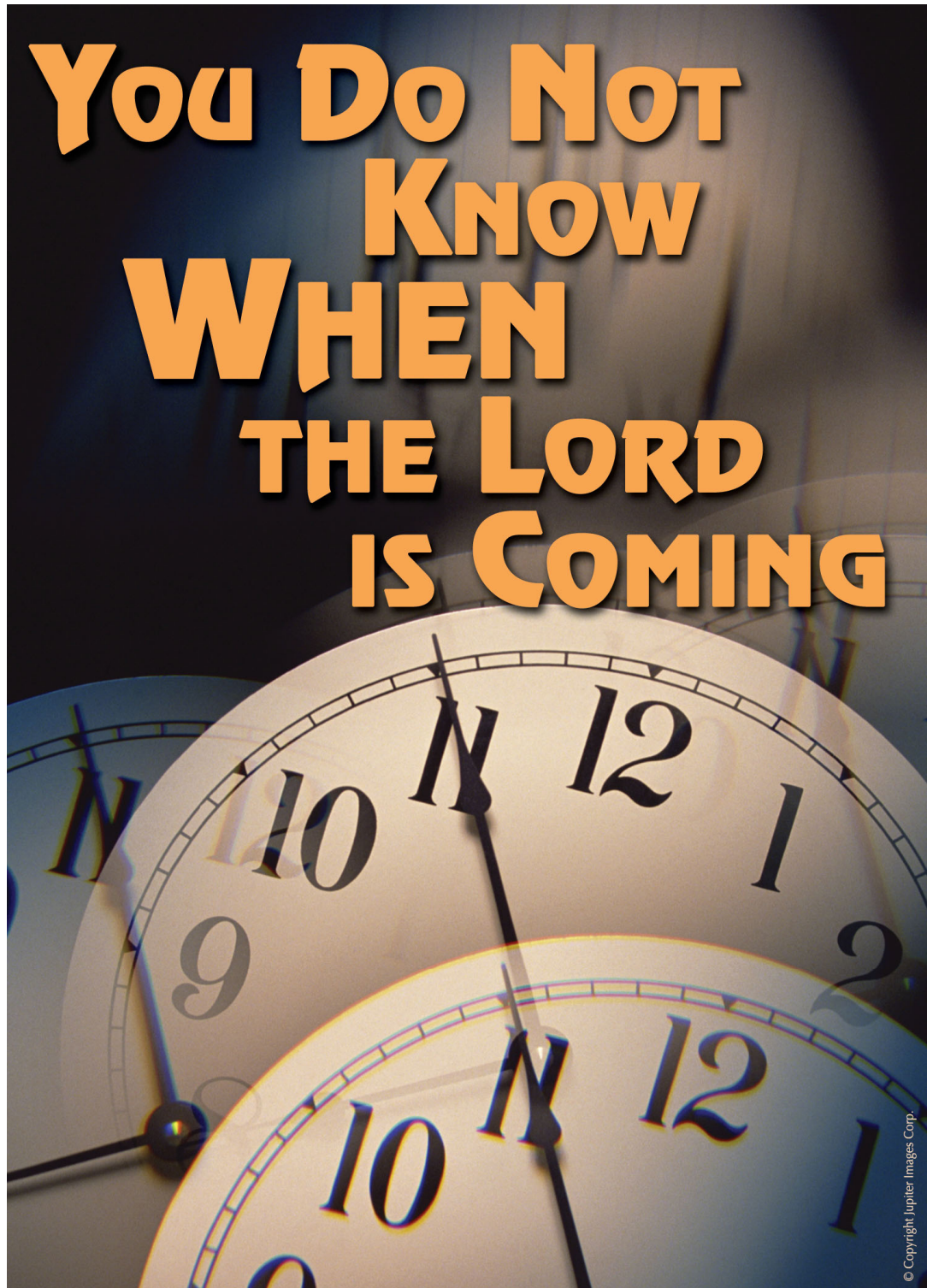

Liturgy Corner

Maranatha!

Come, Lord Jesus, Come!



Advent is a season of waiting, conversion and hope. It has qualities of a penitential season—such as the use of violet vestments, but it is also a time of joyous expectation—we continue to sing *Alleluia*. The prayers, readings and symbols of liturgy during this season stress not only penance, but hope, light, joy, and surrender.

As in the season of Lent, we omit the singing of the *Gloria*, however, not for the same reason. We save our hymn of praise so that on Christmas night the song of the angels may ring out again in all its newness.

During Advent, we look to the future, the Second Coming of Christ, and to the past, his coming at Bethlehem. Let us actively listen to God's Word, which shows us what we should hope for in this changing world. We are encouraged to set our hearts on the place where our true joy lies.

In the blessing of our Advent wreath, we pray: ***May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May he come quickly and do not delay.***

THE SYMBOLISM OF THE ADVENT WREATH

1. THE FOUR CANDLES REPRESENT THE 4,000 YEARS PRIOR TO CHRIST'S COMING AND THE FOUR WEEKS OF ADVENT.
2. THE THREE PURPLE CANDLES SIGNIFY PENANCE AND THE ROSE ONE JOY.
3. THE UNLIGHTED CANDLES REPRESENT THE DARK AGES BEFORE CHRIST'S COMING.
4. THE LIGHTED CANDLES REPRESENT CHRIST, THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD.
5. EACH WEEK WE LIGHT ONE MORE CANDLE REPRESENTING THE IDEA THAT THE COMING OF CHRIST IS CLOSER.
6. THE CIRCULAR FORM OF THE WREATH SYMBOLIZES THAT GOD HAS NO BEGINNING AND NO END.
7. THE GREEN OF THE BOUGHS INDICATES HOPE—JUST AS THE GREEN OF SPRING INDICATES NEW LIFE.
8. THE WORD ADVENT MEANS THE "COMING" OF PROMISE.

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

I domingo de Adviento: Despertar la conciencia

El Adviento empieza con una llamada de advertencia, con una invitación a estar preparados. Si el Señor, en la parábola de las vírgenes sensatas y las vírgenes necias, nos decía que no sabemos cuándo será el día o la hora en que nos llegará la muerte, en esta ocasión nos habla de la ignorancia en que está el empleado acerca de cuándo llegará el dueño de la casa. Se trata, pues, de estar preparados, pero para cosas distintas; aquella advertencia era para que estuviéramos preparados para la muerte -que es la vida definitiva- y para el juicio. Ésta es para acoger aquí en la tierra al Dios de la vida, a Cristo. ¿Cómo prepararnos? Evidentemente, el mejor modo de hacerlo es tener la casa bien dispuesta para cuando llegue el dueño a vivir en ella. Eso significa que debemos tener nuestras cosas en orden, la tarea hecha, las obligaciones cumplidas, las grietas reparadas, las heridas curadas. Y todo eso lo podemos hacer, antes que nada, haciendo una visita de inspección por el lugar para ver con detenimiento qué está fallando, qué va mal, qué necesita arreglarse. Es decir, tenemos que despertar la conciencia para, con ella como luz, poder revisar nuestra vida, nuestra alma. Para hacerlo es preciso escuchar la voz de Dios a través de su Palabra y también a través de la Iglesia. ¿Qué nos dice Cristo en el Evangelio, qué nos enseña la Iglesia?.



Recomendaciones de la Iglesia para vivir el Adviento:

1.- Meditar sobre la fe y humildad de María:

El Vaticano nos recuerda que durante el Adviento “la Liturgia celebra con frecuencia y de modo ejemplar a la Virgen María”, especialmente en la solemnidad de la Inmaculada Concepción, que se celebra el 8 de diciembre, reflexionar sobre “la actitud de fe y de humildad con que María de Nazaret se adhirió, total e inmediatamente, al proyecto salvífico de Dios”. La Iglesia recomienda rezar la novena a la Inmaculada Concepción, iniciando hoy 29 de noviembre.

2.- No caer en el consumismo:

La Santa Sede advirtió que en la actualidad los valores del Adviento se ven “amenazados por la costumbre de convertir la preparación a la Navidad en una ‘operación comercial’. Nos recomienda orar y meditar para no olvidar el sentido del Adviento y celebrar el nacimiento de Jesús “en un clima de sobriedad y de sencillez alegre, y con una actitud de solidaridad para con los pobres”.

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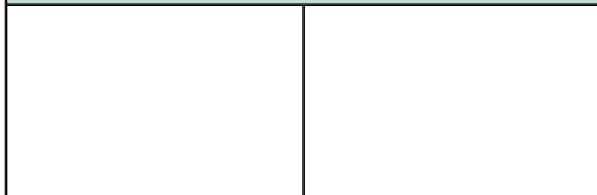
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
