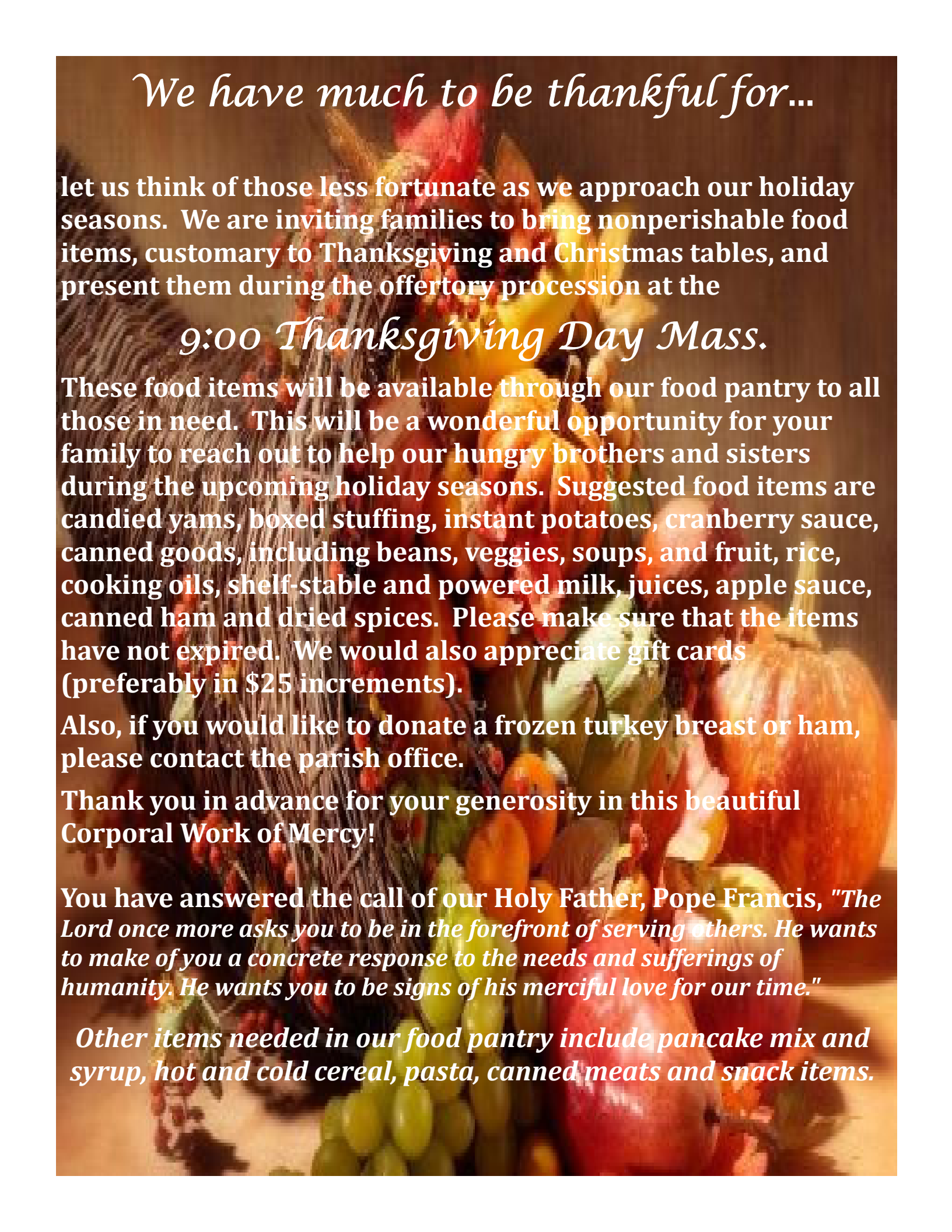

You have answered the call of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, *"The Lord once more asks you to be in the forefront of serving others. He wants to make of you a concrete response to the needs and sufferings of humanity. He wants you to be signs of his merciful love for our time."*

Other items needed in our food pantry include pancake mix and syrup, hot and cold cereal, pasta, canned meats and snack items.

Are You Interested In Year End Giving?

What the CARES Act means for charitable giving

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act bill provides increased tax incentives for charitable giving for both individuals and corporations.

Are you itemizing deductions?

The adjusted gross income (AGI) limit for cash contributions was increased for individual donors. For cash contributions made in 2020, you can now elect to deduct up to 100 percent of your AGI (increased from 60 percent).

Interested in corporate giving?

The AGI limit for cash contributions was also increased for corporate donors. Corporations can now deduct up to 25 percent of taxable income (increased from 10 percent).

Not itemizing?

The CARES Act allows for an additional universal, “above-the-line” deduction for charitable gifts made in cash of up to \$300. Married filing jointly taxpayers will get an above the line deduction of up to \$600. If you are not itemizing on your 2020 taxes, you can claim this new deduction.

What about IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD)?

The CARES Act did not change the rules around the QCD, which allows individuals over 70½ years old to donate up to \$100,000 in IRA assets directly to charity¹ annually, without taking the distribution into taxable income.

However, remember that under the CARES Act an individual can elect to deduct 100 percent of their AGI for cash charitable contributions. This effectively affords individuals over 59½ years old the benefits similar to a QCD; they can take a cash distribution from their IRA, contribute the cash to charity, and may completely offset tax attributable to the distribution by taking a charitable deduction in an amount up to 100 percent of their AGI for the tax year.

Rules and regulations regarding tax deductions for charitable giving vary at the state level, and laws of a specific state or laws relevant to a particular situation may affect the applicability, accuracy, or completeness of the information provided. Always consult an attorney or tax professional regarding your specific legal or tax situation.

Safe and Secure Initiative

As you may remember, we created a Safe and Secure Ministry which is comprised of law enforcement officers, teacher, and others. Our goal is to build a plan to assist the parish in ensuring that our campus remains safe and secure and to deter crime. We requested a *Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design Security Assessment* which was completed and the results discussed with the Safe and Secure Ministry members. There are various recommendations that we have already begun to work on, but there are several that require additional funding .

If our Safe and Secure Initiative is one that is important to you and you have the means to financially assist us, we would certainly appreciate your support. These are troubling times and over the past few weeks there have been churches burned, statues destroyed and tabernacles broken and the Holy Eucharist stolen. We understand that security initiatives might not deter all crime, but it's important for us to protect our campus and especially the Eucharist to the best of our ability.  En el pobre está nuestro Señor y Rey. De esta manera habría interpretado probablemente san Francisco de Asís el texto evangélico en el que Jesús habla del servicio hecho a los que sufren como realizado a Él mismo, y que la Iglesia ha querido escoger para la solemnidad de Cristo Rey. San Francisco renunció a las glorias humanas que le daban las guerras cuando comprendió que las batallas que debía librar a favor de su Señor eran las de la lucha contra la pobreza, contra el sufrimiento, contra la soledad, contra la ingratitud. b.- La indulgencia plenaria del 2 de noviembre, para los que visiten piadosamente una iglesia u oratorio y reciten allí el "Padrenuestro" y el Credo puede ser transferida a otro día del mes de noviembre, libremente elegido por cada uno de los fieles.

Los ancianos, los enfermos podrán obtener la indulgencia plenaria siempre que se unan espiritualmente a todos los demás fieles, completamente desapegados del pecado y con la intención de cumplir cuanto antes las tres condiciones habituales.

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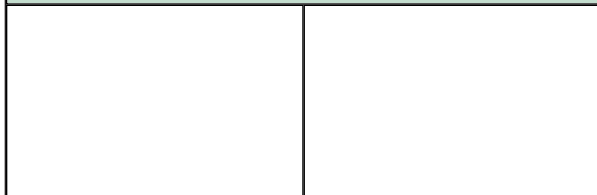
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
