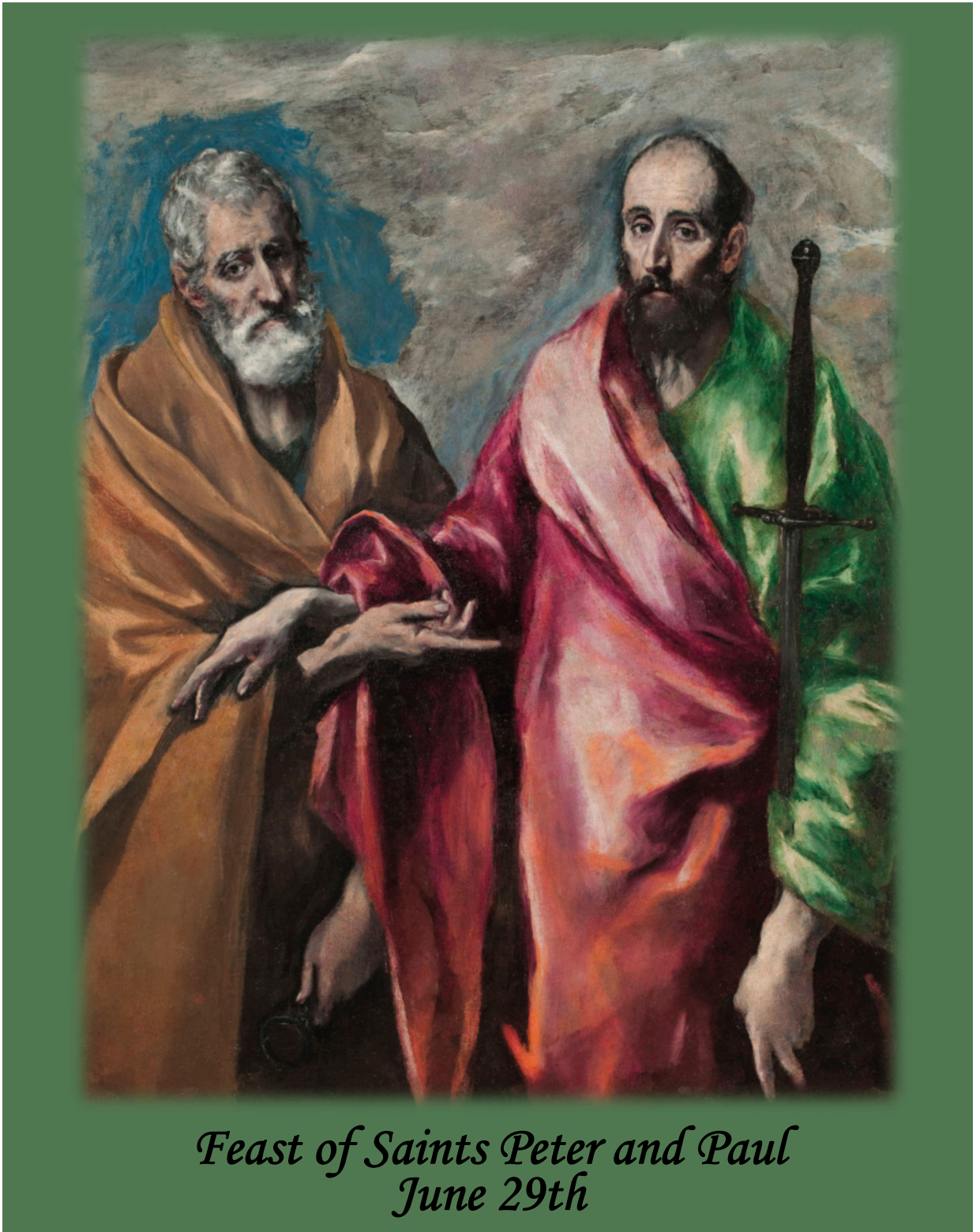

WANT TO LEARN MORE ABOUT YOUR CATHOLIC FAITH?

The School of Christian Formation for the Diocese of Palm Beach is offering a series of classes and programs for adult Catholics who wish to learn more about the rich traditions of their faith.

Each class meets from 7:15 to 9:15 on Wednesday evenings for a total of six classes (twelve hours) taught during the Fall and Spring Semesters. You may attend individual courses for credit or follow the entire three-year program which concludes with the granting of a certificate of completion awarded by Bishop Barbarito at the school's annual graduation ceremony. The Diocese strongly recommends these courses for all the faithful, especially those serving in liturgical, educational and spiritual ministries. The registration fee is \$10 and textbooks range from \$10 to \$20 per course.

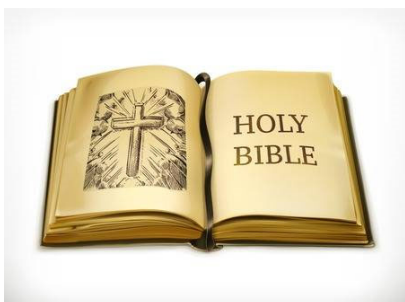

Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía:

“La Palabra de Jesús en el Evangelio está viva”

Continuamos con las catequesis sobre la santa misa. Habíamos llegado a las lecturas. El diálogo entre Dios y su pueblo, desarrollado en la Liturgia de la Palabra de la misa, alcanza el culmen en la proclamación del Evangelio. Lo precede el canto del Aleluya —o, en cuaresma, otra aclamación— con la que «la asamblea de los fieles acoge y saluda al Señor, quien hablará en el Evangelio». El Evangelio constituye la luz para comprender el sentido de los textos bíblicos que lo preceden, tanto del Antiguo Testamento como del Nuevo Testamento. Por eso, la misma liturgia distingue el Evangelio de las otras lecturas y lo rodea de particular honor y veneración. De hecho, su lectura está reservada al ministro ordenado, que termina besando el libro; se escucha de pie y se hace el signo de la cruz en la frente, sobre la boca y sobre el pecho; los cirios y el incienso honran a Cristo que, mediante la lectura evangélica, hace resonar su palabra eficaz. De estos siglos nos la asamblea reconoce la presencia de Cristo que le dirige la «buena noticia» que convierte y transforma. Es un discurso directo el que sucede, como prueban las aclamaciones con las que se responde a la proclamación: «Gloria a ti, Señor Jesús» o «Te alabamos Señor».
