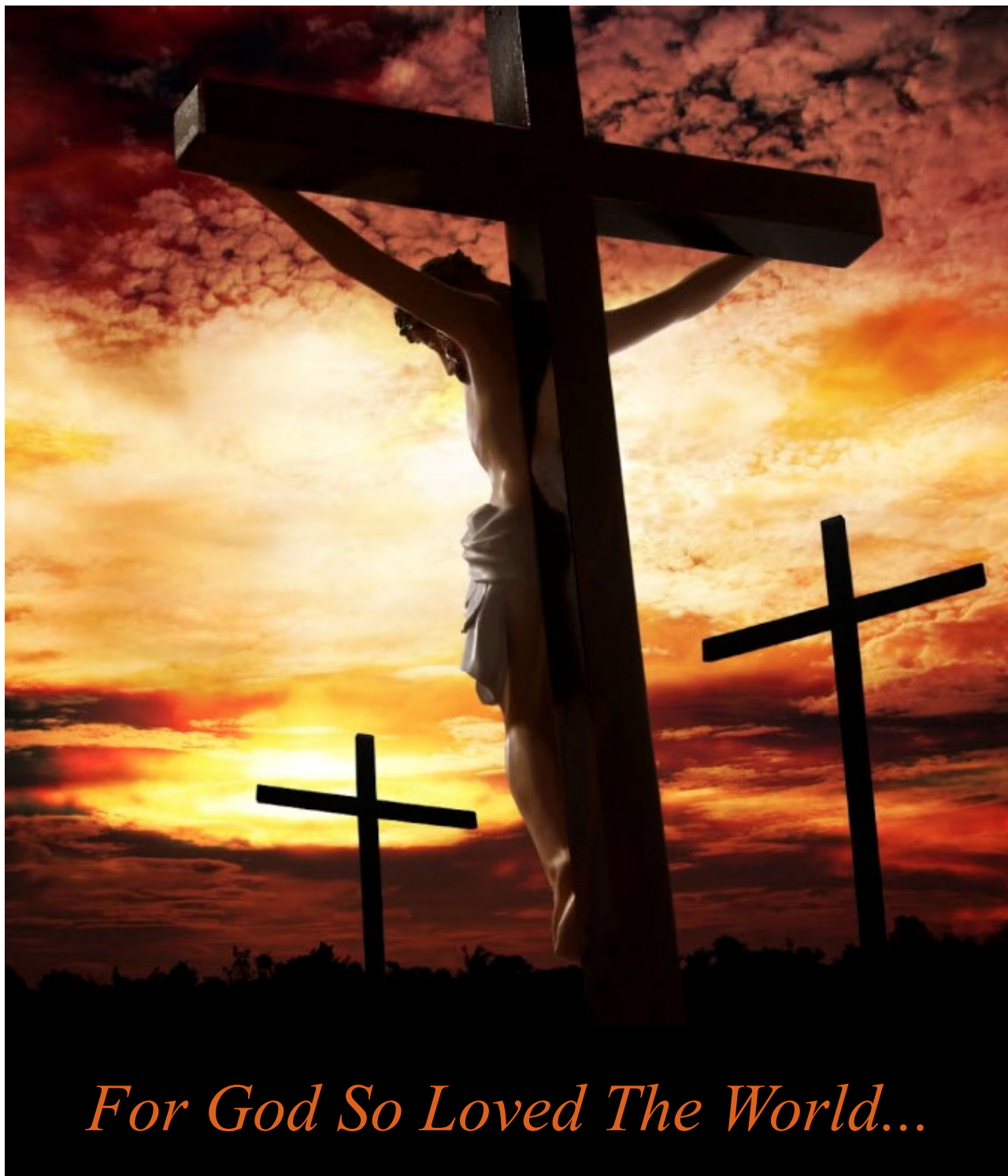

Deacon's Corner

Rejoice! God Loves You!

Today is rightly called “Rejoicing Sunday!” We rejoice because of God’s love for us. We rejoice that our Father sent his Son into the world to save us, that our God loves us so much that he died for us, that he paid the price for our sins. Our salvation comes through the greatest act of love in history, when Jesus Christ, Son of God, emptied himself, humbled himself, became man, and suffered and died for us. He paid the price for our sins and freed us from death. He opened the doors to his heavenly kingdom with the cross of salvation, and he did so simply because he loves us.

Anyone who is married, has children, or is deeply committed to someone else, understands that love and sacrifice go hand in hand. We sacrifice a lot in our relationships because of our love for each other, and true love is given without the thought of a return. Sacrifices are made in our relationships through giving, not receiving. They are not earned by the recipient of our love. They are freely given by us as an outward act of the loving relationship we have.

And so it is also true with God. We don’t deserve salvation. We haven’t earned it; we *can’t* earn it. A lifetime of great and holy works will never merit eternal life. It is only because of God’s grace and love for us that we are able to receive salvation through our faith – it is God’s gift to us given freely in love.

If you are ready to accept this gift, then allow the light of Christ to shine in your soul. Our Gospel today says, “The light came into the world, but people preferred darkness to light, because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come toward the light, so that his works might not be exposed. But whoever lives the truth comes to the light.” The truth is that we don’t work to achieve our salvation, but once we accept God’s gift to us, our works are transformed by the light of Christ. Our works become the works for Christ – we are his hands, his feet, his voice – we are his body, the Body of Christ. When we are in right relationship with God, when we are filled with his grace, we draw close to his light, and that light dispels and drives out all the darkness in our lives, so that we can grow in holiness and more perfectly imitate our Savior and Lord.

So, rejoice in the light of Christ. Rejoice that salvation is freely given to us. Rejoice in our God who loves us, and let us bring that joy, love, and sacrifice to our world by living lives supported by his grace and brightened by his light.

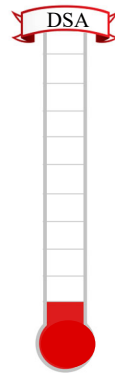

No podemos dejar de ver las cosas con nuestros ojos. Medimos y sopesamos las cosas y los acontecimientos considerando éxito o fracaso a lo que ocurre en función de los resultados aparentes. Pero la mirada de Dios es distinta. Por eso, el recuerdo de que Cristo triunfó cuando fracasaba y que en la Cruz fue cuando más atrayente se volvió, nos debe ayudar a considerar nuestras situaciones personales con otra óptica. Es fundamental saber perseverar, ser fieles a Cristo, a la Iglesia y a lo que nos dicta la conciencia. Si lo hacemos así estaremos ofreciendo a los que nos observan –y cuando sufrimos es cuando más nos observan– un ejemplo a seguir: Fidelidad a Cristo, interpretado por la Iglesia, con el eco que despierta en nuestra conciencia; unir nuestro sufrimiento al de Cristo en la cruz, ofreciéndoselo en el ofertorio mientras se celebra la Eucaristía. **Propósito:** Cuando tengas un problema, aceptalo sin desesperar, para ofrecer a los demás un ejemplo.
