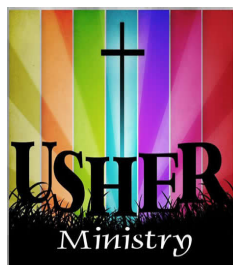

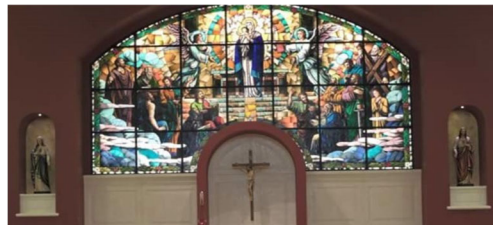

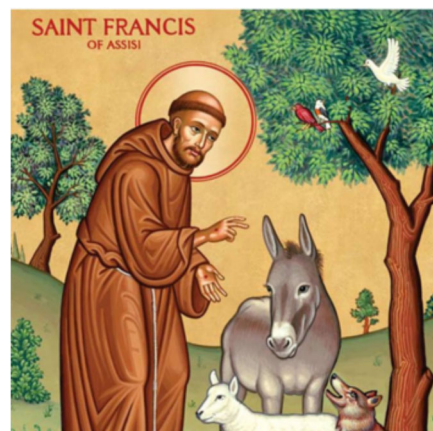

Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía: "Nadie es olvidado"

La Oración eucarística pide a Dios reunir a todos sus hijos en la perfección del amor, en unión con el Papa y el obispo, mencionados por su nombre, signo de que celebramos en comunión con la Iglesia universal y con la Iglesia particular. La súplica, como la ofrenda, es presentada a Dios por todos los miembros de la Iglesia, vivos y difuntos, en espera de la beata esperanza para compartir la herencia eterna del cielo, con la Virgen María. Nada ni nadie es olvidado en la Oración eucarística, sino que cada cosa es reconducida a Dios, como recuerda la doxología que la concluye. Y si tengo alguna persona, parientes, amigos, que están en necesidad o han pasado de este mundo al otro, puedo nominarlos en ese momento, interiormente y en silencio o hacer escribir que el nombre sea dicho. Esta fórmula codificada de oración, tal vez podemos sentirla un poco lejana, pero si comprendemos bien el significado, entonces seguramente participaremos mejor. Esta, de hecho, expresa todo lo que cumplimos en la celebración eucarística; y además nos enseña a cultivar tres actitudes que no deberían nunca faltar en los discípulos de Jesús: primera, aprender a «dar gracias, siempre y en cada lugar» y no solo en ciertas ocasiones, cuando todo va bien; segunda, hacer de nuestra vida un don de amor, libre y gratuito; tercera, construir una concreta comunión, en la Iglesia y con todos. Por lo tanto, esta oración central de la misa nos educa, poco a poco, en hacer de toda nuestra vida una «eucaristía», es decir, una acción de gracias.
