


Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Deacon's Corner

"And at once his sight returned and he followed him along the road."

The last miracle Jesus works in the gospel of Mark is the one with Bartimaeus. The ideal miracle, it sums up all Mark wants to tell us about how Jesus relates to us and we to him. The story is simple. Bartimaeus is blind, sitting with cloak and stick on a street corner, begging. He hears that Jesus is coming and he calls out, "Son of David, have pity on me!" Those persons anxious that they are losing Jesus' attention tell Bartimaeus to be silent, but he keeps calling. Jesus stops in the street and calls for the blind man. "Call him here!"

Mark stresses this last point by repeating twice more in the text that Jesus is calling him: "So they called the blind man. "Courage," they said; "get up, he is calling you." Once healed, Bartimaeus starts following Jesus. Today's Gospel is the story of the ideal follower of Jesus. It combines being healed by Jesus and following Jesus. This is the miracle that should happen to all of us. It is the meeting of two energies: the one in us that reaches out to God, world and self; and the one coming from God through Jesus Christ reaching out to us.

Fr. Joseph Donder's in his book, "Heart on Fire," tells us that Robert Cole's book on children spirituality contains this quote by Junior, a boy of twelve: "You know, I guess the Lord and us, we're all in this together. Us hoping to be saved, and Him wanting to save us. " That is what this miracle with Bartimaeus is all about.

XXX Domingo: Huye de relativismo moral

El ciego Bartimeo era un enfermo que sufría y quería dejar de sufrir, quería recobrar la vista. Por eso se atrevió a molestar a Jesús. Llegó incluso a enfadar, con su insistencia, a los que acompañaban al Maestro. Bartimeo tenía, pues, tres características: Estaba ciego y lo sabía, le dolía estarlo y quería curarse, y puso los medios para conseguirlo. Si el caso de Bartimeo lo trasladamos a la ceguera moral, tan frecuente hoy, vemos que las características de aquel hombre no se suelen dar ahora. En primer lugar, la gente se niega a reconocer que está ciega, es decir que se niega a aceptar el criterio moral de la Iglesia y prefiere decir que lo que le conviene es bueno aunque en realidad sea malo. En segundo lugar, como no se quieren reconocer como ciegos, no les duele y no buscan curarse. Por eso precisamente no se curan. Se puede decir, por lo tanto, de muchos hombres y mujeres de nuestra época que no hay peor ciego que el que no quiere ver, a lo que habría que añadir que si no se quiere ver es porque no les conviene ver. Imitemos a Bartimeo. Reconozcamos nuestros pecados. No nos importe que sean abundantes o reiterativos. La misericordia de Dios es infinita y no hay culpa que no pueda ser perdonada. Dios está deseando curarnos las veces que haga falta. Sólo espera que se lo pidamos, con insistencia y con humildad.
