

Deacon's Corner

What is your God like? What is the character of your God? Is your God: Primarily concerned about personal virtue?...Primarily a lawgiver and judge, somebody you need to measure up to?...a God of requirements and rewards?...a God of compassion?...a God of social justice?

These questions contrast a God of requirements and rewards and a God of love and justice and lead to two very different versions of the Christian message. The version of imagining God's character as the God of requirements and rewards, referred by some as "the bad news," is that there will be a last judgment, either at the end of our lives or the end of history, and you better be ready or you'll be in deep trouble. This is a religion of threat, anxiety, and self-preservation.

The version of imaging God's character as a God of love and justice, referred by some as "the good news," is an invitation into a new life here and now, one that transforms us personally and seeks to transform life in the world. The "bad news" version is the saving of some of us from the devouring fire that will consume the rest. The "good news" version is a vision of transformed people and a transformed earth filled with the glory of God.

Both versions presented here of imaging God's character are found in the Scriptures and our choice of which we follow shapes our sense of what faithfulness to God means and what the Christian life is about.

The Christian life for me becomes: God loves each of us already and has from our very beginning. Our Christian life is not about believing or doing what we need to believe or do so that we can be saved. Rather, it's about seeing what is already true—that God loves us already—and then beginning to live in this relationship. It is about becoming conscious of and intentional about a deepening relationship with God.
