Deacon's Corner

Our Perception Becomes Our Reality

As a carpenter, Jesus would have built and constructed many things. Using concepts, ideas, and plans from other people, Jesus would use the materials from the earth to build and create something real from what initially started as a mere thought or an image in the mind. Whether He was constructing farming tools, structures or household items, these products basically began as a thought in someone's mind. All Jesus had to do was take the image that their minds had created and bring it into a physical reality. But sometimes, it works the opposite. There are some things in the world that can change and greatly influence us and become the source and inspiration for our minds to plan, envision and create other things in their image. Aren't we all, to some degree, inspired by sports figures, beautiful homes, actors, and musicians and because of this, allow them to influence our thoughts and desires?

In the Gospel story, Mark (6:1-6) tells us that the people who knew Jesus could not see Him beyond what their minds had already envisioned. That is, those who had known Him since His early childhood (family and friends) were unable to see Jesus in any way other than how they already knew Him prior to His ministry. Their minds became closed, unable to reconstruct and reshape their concepts and thoughts of who He truly was. In other words, in their minds and hearts, they could not accept that the finished product of Jesus himself, did not match the image of their own well thought plans. They constructed Jesus in their own image rather than letting the image of Jesus serve as the source to enlighten and inspire them to produce good works. They were not allowing themselves to be moved and shaped by Jesus; on the contrary, they tried to make Him fit into their own design.

In this Gospel story, Jesus is telling us that we need to question if the source of our beliefs, desires, and deeds are rooted in our own minds or are found in Jesus, who inspires and empowers the hearts and souls of men to go forth and produce good works. We need to examine if our minds have falsely constructed a belief or perception because we did not allow the real truth to inspire, invigorate, and shape our hearts. Only when our minds can truly construct and see Jesus as He TRULY IS can we work alongside Him as laborers in building up His Kingdom on earth.

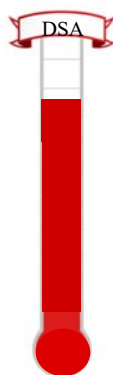
