

Deacon's Corner

Sometime, as a prayer, do this: Take a compass and draw a perfect circle. The center of the circle - the place where you pricked the paper to insert the compass point - is the same distance from any point on the circumference. Perfect.

Imagine that the circle you drew is the world and everyone in it, and that God is the center. Mark a point somewhere on the circle and write your name. Now mark another point on the circle and write the name of someone dear to you. At a third point on the circle, write the name of someone you're not fond of. Now draw a straight line from each of the points to the center point - the point that is God. As each line moves closer to God, you will see that each line moves closer to the others - until,

in God, they meet. As we move towards God, we move closer to one another - and as we move away from one another, we move away from God.

Jesus' image of the vine and branches reminds us that because we are one in Christ, we are one in one another - as a family and as a church. We are connected to one another, we belong to one another, we are branches of the same vine planted by God the vine-grower - we are all points on the same circle, making our way to God. In Christ, we are sustained in God's grace throughout time and space; despite our different races and creeds, our nationalities and cultures, we are branches that draw life from the same root. We should consider praying the "circle" during this Easter Season to realize the Risen Jesus' vision of a community that cherishes its unity in God's compassion and our common identity as his sons and daughters.



That in 1989 when Hugh Caulfield decided to make Royal Palm Beach his home, he also decided to make Our Lady Queen of the Apostles his parish. Back in those days, Sunday Mass was held at the Lions' Club in Royal Palm Beach. Hugh decided at that time to purchase for the church four (4) ciborium and dedicate them to each of the

four sides of his family through an inscription he placed on them.

Prior to Hugh's death in 2015, the ciborium were retired as they were pitted and needed to be gold plated. Hugh was a humble faithful servant of our parish, and out of respect for all that he did the Council of Catholic Women (CCW) at the request of Evelyn Barry decided to take on the initiative to have his ciborium gold plated.

After three long years, and with the assistance of the Knights of Columbus #12376 and anonymous donors, the ciborium were consecrated at Holy Thursday's 7:00 Mass.

Actividades de la Comunidad Hispana



Cuarto Domingo de Pascua: Domingo del Buen Pastor (Juan 10: 11-18)

Esta bella imagen de Jesús, Pastor bueno, es una llamada a la conversión, dirigida a quienes pueden reivindicar el título de «pastores» en la comunidad cristiana. El pastor que se parece a Jesús, sólo piensa en sus ovejas, no «huye» ante los prolemas, no las «abandona». Al contrario, está junto a ellas, las defiende, se desvive por ellas, «expone su vida» buscando su bien. Al mismo tiempo, esta imagen es una llamada a la comunión fraterna entre todos. El Buen Pastor «conoce» a sus ovejas y las ovejas le «conocen» a él. Sólo desde esta cercanía estrecha, desde este conocimiento mutuo y esta comunión de corazón, el Buen Pastor comparte su vida con las ovejas. Hacia esta comunión y mutuo conocimiento hemos de caminar también hoy en la Iglesia.

La Comunión Espiritual

No se prescribe ninguna fórmula determinada, ni es necesario recitar ninguna oración vocal. Basta un acto interior por el cual se desee recibir la Eucaristía. Es conveniente, sin embargo, que abarque tres actos distintos, aunque sea brevísimamente:

- a) Un acto de Fe, por el cual renovamos nuestra firme convicción de la presencia real de Cristo en la Eucaristía. Es excelente preparación para comulgar espiritual o sacramentalmente;
- b) Un acto de deseo de recibir sacramentalmente a Cristo y de unirse íntimamente con Él. En este deseo consiste formalmente la Comunión Espiritual;
- c) Una petición fervorosa, pidiendo al Señor que nos conceda espiritualmente los mismos frutos y gracias que nos otorgaría en la Eucaristía realmente recibida.
