

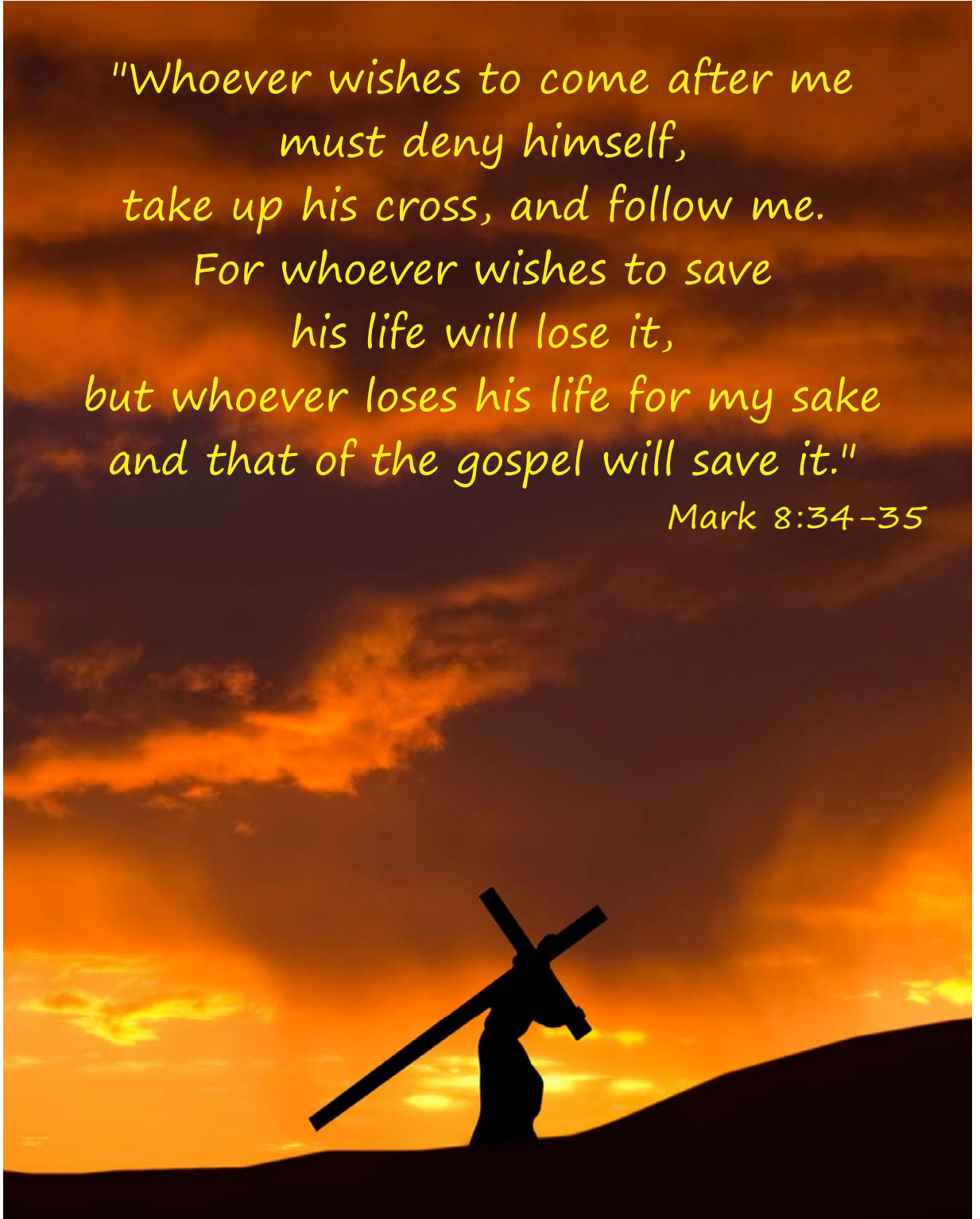

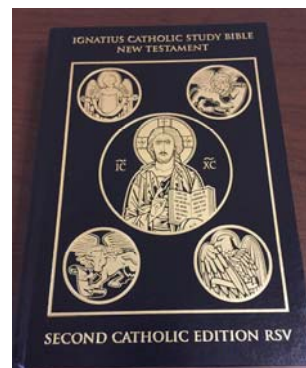
Sacramental Information

Baptisms: Congratulations on the decision to baptize your child in the Catholic Faith! We are here to help you with the process. Please call or stop by the parish office and we will be happy to get you started. Travel plans for out of town guests should not be made until a date for the baptism is confirmed by the parish staff. A meeting with a priest *may* be required. We look forward to hearing from you.

Marriages: Please come by the parish office to start your marriage paperwork. Please allow six months to complete the paperwork. A wedding date cannot be set until a priest has been consulted.

Deacon's Corner

Who do **YOU** say that I am?" Each of us must come to the moment of profession of our own personal faith in Jesus. It is no longer meaningful to process the faith of parents or priests or teachers. We must come to that holy time when we no longer profess other people's faith or liturgical creeds, but we must stand and speak on our own and profess: "I believe,"

Three new chair people signed up this past weekend so we only have two open positions. We need chair people for sausage and pepper booth and the wing booth. Interested?

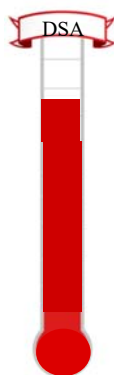

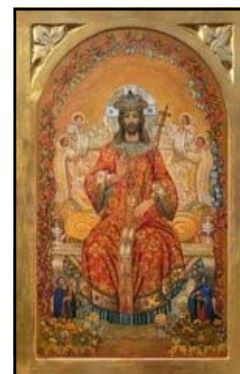

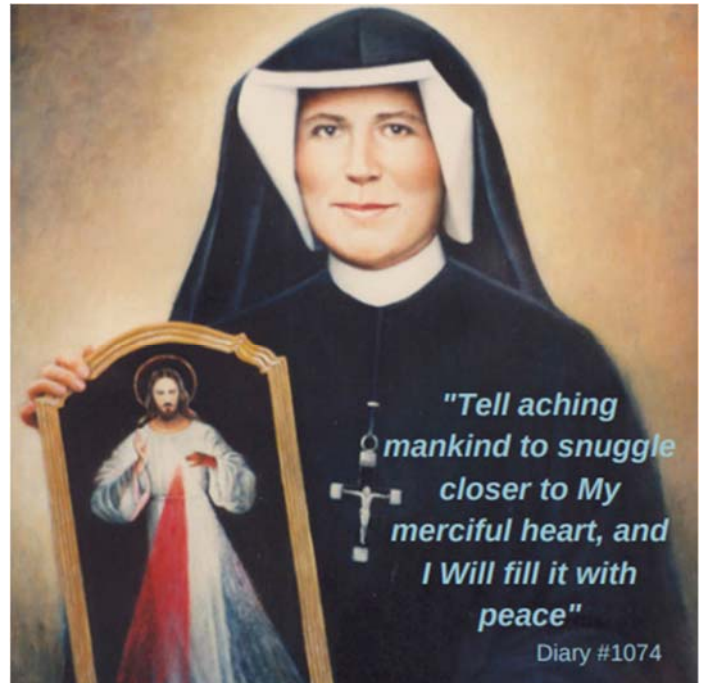

XXIV Domingo: No huir de la cruz ni perder la esperanza

Está de moda hablar de Dios como amor, lo cual es bueno, pues es un aspecto fundamental de la verdad revelada por Cristo acerca de Dios, aunque a veces se olviden otros aspectos de esa misma verdad -manifestada en el Antiguo Testamento y asumida por Jesús en sus enseñanzas-, como es el hecho de que Dios es Juez o Señor. En todo caso, lo que no está tan de moda es percatarse de que ese amor de Dios se puso de manifiesto sobre todo en Cristo, en la encarnación del Hijo de Dios, y muy especialmente en la muerte redentora de Cristo en la Cruz. La Cruz, pues, es la mayor prueba del amor de Dios hacia los hombres, la prueba definitiva. Pues bien, del mismo modo que Dios ha hecho con nosotros, así debemos hacer nosotros con Él. Nuestras cruces deben convertirse en la prueba de que nosotros le queremos a Él. Y para ello nada mejor que aceptar lo que Dios nos pide, tanto lo que es nuestra obligación como los imprevistos de la vida. Si somos capaces de no huir de la cruz por amor a Cristo, que por amor a nosotros no huyó de su Cruz, entonces le estaremos demostrando a Dios que le queremos de verdad. No hay que olvidar que en las enseñanzas del Señor a sus discípulos entra también el concepto de resurrección: la prueba pasa y lo que triunfa al final es la verdad y la justicia.
