Keep track of your physical movement at home, work, at the mall, or at the gym, each day, while reflecting on Scripture. If you are not mobile, prayers count for miles. Ministerio Hispano

Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía: la Eucaristía transfigura todo nuestro ser.

En la misa se hace Pascua. Nosotros, en la misa, estamos con Jesús, muerto y resucitado y Él nos lleva adelante, a la vida eterna. En la misa nos unimos a Él. Es más, Cristo vive en nosotros y nosotros vivimos en Él. Su sangre, de hecho, nos libera de la muerte y del miedo a la muerte. Nos libera no solo del dominio de la muerte física, sino de la muerte espiritual que es el mal, el pecado, que nos toma cada vez que caemos víctimas del pecado nuestro o de los demás. La Pascua de Cristo es la victoria definitiva sobre la muerte, porque Él transformó su muerte en un supremo acto de amor. ¡Murió por amor! Y en la eucaristía, Él quiere comunicarnos su amor pascual, victorioso. Si lo recibimos con fe, también nosotros podemos amar verdaderamente a Dios y al prójimo, podemos amar como Él nos ha amado, dando la vida. Si el amor de Cristo está en mí, puedo darme plenamente al otro, en la certeza interior de que si incluso el otro me hiriera, yo no moriría; de otro modo, debería defenderme. Esto es la misa: entrar en esta pasión, muerte, resurrección y ascensión de Jesús; cuando vamos a misa es si como fuéramos al calvario. Si nosotros en el momento de la misa vamos al calvario, y sabemos que aquel hombre allí es Jesús, seguramente estaremos en silencio, en el llanto y también en la alegría de ser salvados. Creo que hoy está más claro cómo la Pascua se hace presente y operante cada vez que celebramos la misa, es decir, el sentido del memorial. La misa es rehacer el calvario, no es un espectáculo.

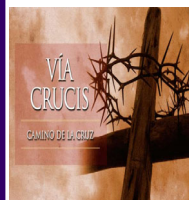
