

Deacon's Corner

Nativity of John the Baptist

Today we celebrate the birth of John the Baptist. In the second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Paul quotes from 1 Samuel: "I have found David, Son of Jesse, a man after my own heart." The Hebrew word for heart is *lebab*. It is not simply the home of emotions, love and valentines.

It's the center of everything. God's heart is God's being. When searching for the next king, God was looking for someone who would carry out the divine purpose and love with God's own heart. John the Baptist had a unique part in carrying out that purpose also, for he was called to go before the Lord and prepare the people to receive him.

John lived up to that call. After years in the desert listening and growing in the Spirit, he fearlessly witnessed to the greatest of God's favor: the coming of Jesus, the Servant-God. Jesus was not just close to God's heart. He was God's heart. And just as He shared it with his servant, with David and John, He shares it with us. And that spark of divinity is planted in each of us and gives us our name and mission.

Today, with our country and world torn by fear and division, we ask ourselves, "What can one person do?" Today's readings provide an answer. Listen deep within yourself and hear God speaking your name. Be faithful to it and be God's love in the world.

We may think that our efforts will be in vain. But like the servant in Isaiah, like John the Baptist, place your trust in God, for it is God's love shared that can transform the world.





Natividad de san Juan Bautista: Preparar el camino del Señor

Esto segundo es lo más importante, pues de poco valdrá hacer el bien si no conseguimos que la gente se fije en Aquel que nos da la fuerza para hacer ese bien. Que cada aplauso que nos dirijan, sea siempre remitido a Él, verdadera y única fuente de todo Bien.
