Deacon's Corner

As a kid, as the end of summer approached, my dad would often take us out for a walk in the woods to pick wild blueberries. I remember that it took a long time to collect enough blueberries to fill our tin cans. I loved (and still do) to eat them. It wasn't until I grew older that I came across a blueberry bush cultivated in a home garden. I was amazed at the size of the bush and the number of huge blueberries that it had. It was nothing like the ones that I used to pick in the wild.

In this weekend's readings, the prophet Isaiah (5:1-7) and Matthew (21:33-43) caution us that if we don't use the gifts that God has provided to nurture and feed our spiritual life, then we're never going to develop into the fullness of maturity needed to produce abundant fruits from our spiritual works. Christ has provided us with His Church to watch over us, teach us, and administer His Sacraments which serve to feed, nourish and heal us. He provides all this to help us produce an abundance of fruit that will exceed the measure of the wine press; otherwise, our works will be greatly labored and bear little fruit, that is, you'll end up producing wild blueberries!

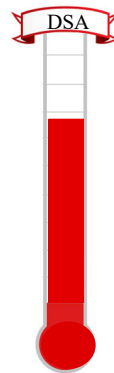

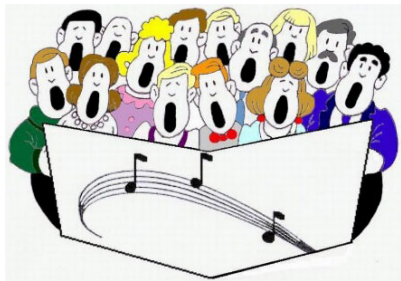
