

Deacon's Corner

Divided, A Cost Too High

Our country is divided! We are split along socially-determined factions, and fractured by many of our public institutions, including the media, celebrities, and our politicians, along with the utter and sickening lack of civility that seems to be on display each and every day. It seems that it doesn't matter if you look at our society or Holy Mother Church, divisions are everywhere, and it can be frightening and unsettling. We have demonized each other, and fallen prey to the Great Divider, the Great Deceiver, Satan himself, the very one who calls for us to treat each other as enemies, the one who rejoices in our divisions and lack of civility.

When we make attempts to "lord ourselves" over others, we cooperate with the demonic element that is present and palpable in our world. The desire, and most especially the actions, that we see today in our country, that attempt to use violence and intimidation to move forward personal political positions, opinions, and ideas, not only shut down and stifle wholesome conversations that seek the common good, but <u>these acts also degrade others and ourselves</u>. To do so is to reject God, to reject his creation, the woman and man made in his image and likeness. When we act in such a way toward one another, we see each other as enemies, and create self-satisfying identities that further this idea. This is in complete conflict to our Christian values and identity, and is entirely opposed to Christian discipleship.

Our Gospel today expresses this concern as Jesus described those who would "lord it over" the Gentiles and **make their presence and authority felt**. This is exactly what Jesus calls us **NOT** to do. Jesus says to his disciples, to his followers, and to us, "*But it shall not be so among you*." We know that Jesus calls us to love, to love God first, with our whole heart, our whole soul, and our whole mind, and to love our neighbor as our self. This love is incompatible with the hate and anger we see daily on our televisions and in our news. <u>We, as Catholics, may differ on policy, but never</u> <u>on purpose.</u>

We seek God first, and his glory, and his will. Our purpose is made clear by the Authoritative and Authentic Teachings of our Church, including our common prayer life (e.g., the Lord's Prayer and the Liturgy), as well as those truths which transcend and surpass all time. Nothing – no scandal, no sin, no persecution, and no satanic force – can ever destroy the Most Holy Catholic Church. She was founded and instituted by Jesus Christ, and although sin abounds in our world and in our Church, nothing can ever overcome her power or prevail against her. We must recognize, believe, and truly profess that we are "One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church," and that the artificial divisions created by man have no power over that unity. We are committed to love God and to love of our fellow brothers and sisters, and we must not tolerate the anger and hatred spewed forth by others in our world. We must seek solutions to the real economic, social, and political offenses against human dignity through civility, always recognizing the image and likeness of God in others, as we work out the best policies toward that end. We are free to disagree on these policies and the solutions to our problems, but we are not free to disagree on our common dignity given to us by Almighty God.

Our Second Reading emphasizes this solidarity, this commonality of purpose. In his Letter to the Hebrews, St. Paul calls us to "hold fast to our confession," to stick to our Christian beliefs, creed, and teachings. St. Paul then tells us that our unity in Christ is made perfect when we recognize that we are imperfect, that we have a "high priest" who is like us in all things but sin, and came to die for the forgiveness of that sin. If we are ready, if we are committed to our Catholic faith and to Jesus Christ as one of his disciples, then let us do what St. Paul says: "Let us confidently approach the Throne of Grace to receive mercy and to find grace for timely help." We are most certainly in need of such help now, perhaps more than ever. May God's will be done in our lives and in our world. Amen.

XXIX Domingo: Practica la humildad del servicio

Probablemente sea el instinto humano, deformado por el pecado original, el que nos lleva a pensar que el grande es el que manda y que el que sirve es inferior, es, de alguna manera, un pobre desgraciado. Por eso, porque el instinto está herido por el pecado, es por lo que huimos del servicio y procuramos ser servidos. Cristo, conocedor del alma humana, quiere salir al paso de esa desviación. Lo hace de dos maneras, con el ejemplo y con su enseñanza. Una y otra vez, y no sólo en aquella última cena en la que lavó los pies a los apóstoles, dio muestras de su actitud de servicio. En esta ocasión, tal y como cuenta el evangelista Marcos, lo guiso enseñar explícitamente, hablando de sí mismo ("el Hijo del hombre no ha venido para que le sirvan, sino para servir") y diciendo a sus seguidores que ellos debían imitarle y hacer lo mismo. Se tratará, pues, de llevar a la práctica lo que el Maestro hizo y enseñó, pues ninguno es tan grande como Él y por lo tanto ninguno tiene que abajarse tanto y humillarse tanto como hizo Él. Se trata de servir y de hacerlo con alegría, sin quejarse, sabiendo que así se imita al Señor y se le ama en los hermanos. Claro que ese servicio debe ser inteligente, sin que se preste a abusos o pueda ser empleado para maleducar. Pero dentro de estos márgenes, lo que hay que hacer es teorizar menos sobre el servicio y servir más. Por amor a Cristo, con la ayuda de Cristo y como hizo María, la esclava del Señor.
