Deacon's Corner

For this the last weekend in Ordinary Time, I would like to share with you an article by Fr. Ronald Rolheiser, OMI called God' Power as Power- lessness.

“When we examine the biblical account of Adam & Eve and original sin, we see that the primary motivation for eating the apple was their desire to somehow grasp at divinity, to become like God. They wanted godlike power. But they, like us, badly misunderstood what makes for genuine power.”

“ St. Paul writes in Philippians that Jesus did not deem equality with God something to be grasped at, but rather that he emptied himself of that power to become helpless, trusting that this emptying and helplessness would ultimately be the most transformative power of all. Jesus submitted to helplessness to become truly powerful.”

“That insight can shed light on how we understand God's apparent absence in our world. How might we comprehend what is often called ‘the silence of God’”? Where was God during the Holocaust? Where is God during natural disasters that kill thousands of people? Where is God when senseless accidents and illnesses take the lives of countless person? Why doesn't God forcefully intervene?”

“God is present and intervening in all these situation, but not in the way we ordinarily understand presence, power, and intervention. God is present the way beauty is present, in the way a helpless, innocent newborn is present, and in the way truth as a moral agent is always present.”

“God is never silent because beauty, innocence, helplessness and truth are never silent. They're always present and intervening, but unlike ordinary human power, they're present in a way that is completely non-manipulative and fully respectful of our freedom. God's power, like that of a newborn, like the power of beauty itself, fully respects you.”

“When we look at the struggles within our world and within our private lives, it often seems like divine power is forever being trumped by human power.”

“But like David standing with just a boy's slingshot before Goliath, a giant who looks overpowering in terms of muscle and iron, and like the apostles being asked to set five loaves of bread and two tiny fish before a crowd of 5,000, God always looks underwhelming in our world.”

“But we know how these stories end.”

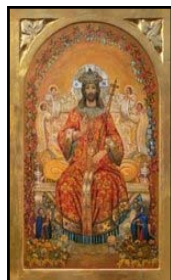
The Health and Wellness Ministry

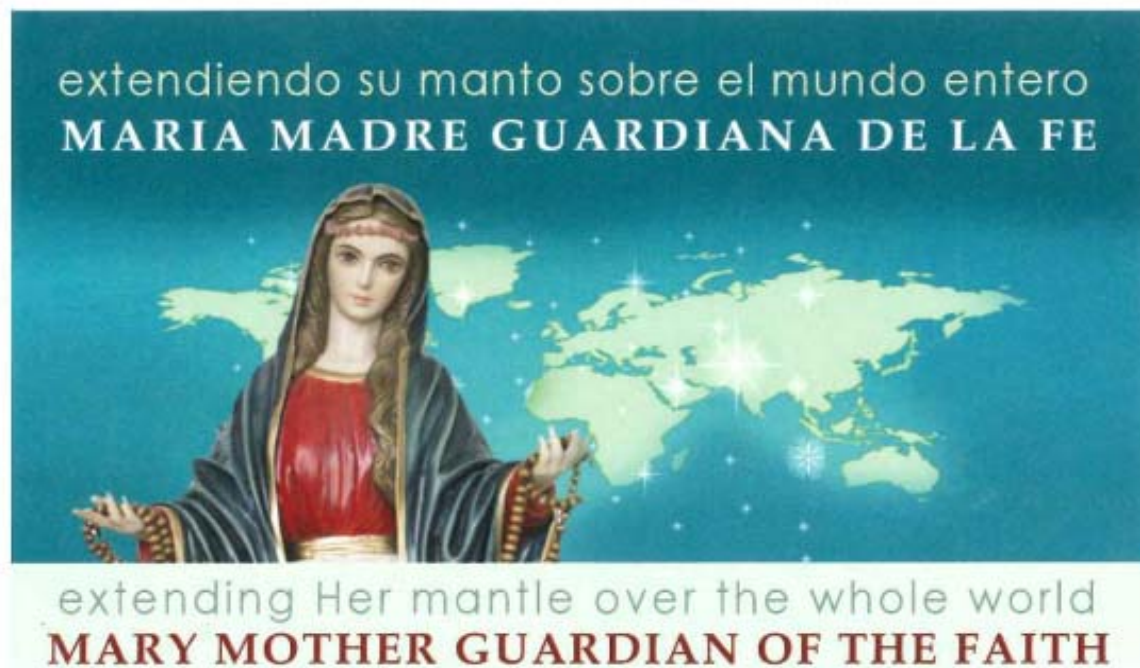

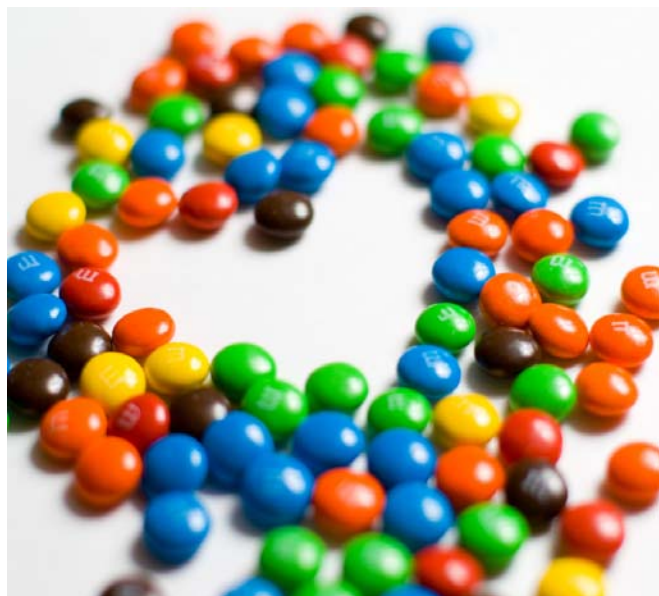

XXXII Domingo: La solidaridad como deber

El ejemplo de la viuda que pone en la colecta poca cantidad pero que es todo lo que tiene, es un punto de referencia para nuestro comportamiento. Es, a la vez, un caso práctico sobre la unión entre el amor a Dios y el amor al prójimo. Y es que para nosotros, los cristianos, no se puede estar junto a Dios si no se está junto al hombre y, a la vez, cuando estamos junto a Dios estamos más fácilmente al servicio del hombre. La solidaridad, la caridad, no es un asunto optativo para un seguidor de Cristo. No es algo que podamos hacer o dejar de hacer, sin que tenga consecuencia alguna el que se haga o no se haga. La caridad, el amor, es una obligación, es un deber. No podemos poner excusas para negarnos a amar. Podremos llevar a la práctica este mandamiento de una forma o de otra, y eso las circunstancias y el deber de nuestro estado nos lo indicarán. Pero en ningún caso podemos decir que hay circunstancias o problemas que nos impidan amar. Ni siquiera la pobreza -de tiempo o de dinero- es una excusa. Ahí está el ejemplo de la viuda y de su pequeña limosna. Todos tenemos algo que dar. Todos, incluso aquellos que también tienen que pedir, pueden dar algo a los que son más pobres que ellos o a los que, aunque sea de otra cosa, les necesita
