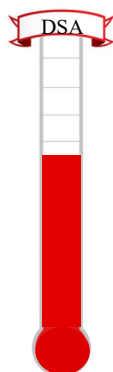

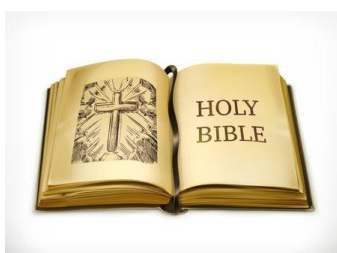

Increase in colorectal cancer in young adults

An American Cancer Society (ACS) study found increasing rates of colorectal cancer (CRC) in younger adults (< 55 years). Due to this the ACS recommends that CRC screening begin at age 45 (not the norm of 50). This increase in younger adults is due to the increase in obesity, sedentary lifestyles, and unhealthy diets. A major concern about the increase in CRC in young age groups is the risk of being diagnosed with later stage disease.

If you fall into this age group and have a family history of colorectal cancer or adenomas in an immediate family member, speak to your doctor about early screening. Colorectal cancer can be cured when diagnosed early.

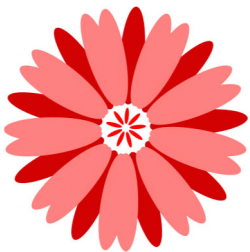

Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía: la misa nos ayuda a amar al prójimo

¿Por qué ir a misa el domingo? La celebración dominical de la eucaristía está en el centro de la vida de la Iglesia. Nosotros cristianos vamos a misa el domingo para encontrar al Señor resucitado, o mejor, para dejarnos encontrar por Él, escuchar su palabra, alimentarnos en su mesa y así convertirnos en Iglesia, es decir, en su Cuerpo místico viviente en el mundo. Lo entendieron, desde la primera hora, los discípulos de Jesús, los que celebraron el encuentro eucarístico con el Señor en el día de la semana que los hebreos llamaban «el primero de la semana» y los romanos «día del sol» porque en ese día Jesús había resucitado de entre los muertos y se había aparecido a los discípulos, hablando con ellos, comiendo con ellos y dándoles el Espíritu Santo. También la gran efusión del Espíritu Santo en Pentecostés sucede en domingo, el quincuagésimo día después de la resurrección de Jesús. Por estas razones, el domingo es un día santo para nosotros, santificado por la celebración eucarística, presencia viva del Señor entre nosotros y para nosotros. ¡Es la misa, por lo tanto, lo que hace el domingo cristiano! El domingo cristiano gira en torno a la misa. ¿Qué domingo es, para un cristiano, en el que falta el encuentro con el Señor? el Concilio Vaticano II quiso reafirmar que «el domingo es el día de fiesta primordial que debe ser propuesto e inculcado en la piedad de los fieles, de modo que se convierta también en día de alegría y abstención del trabajo (Const. Sacrosanctum Concilium, 106).....continua

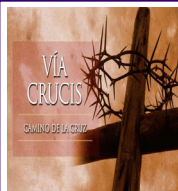
