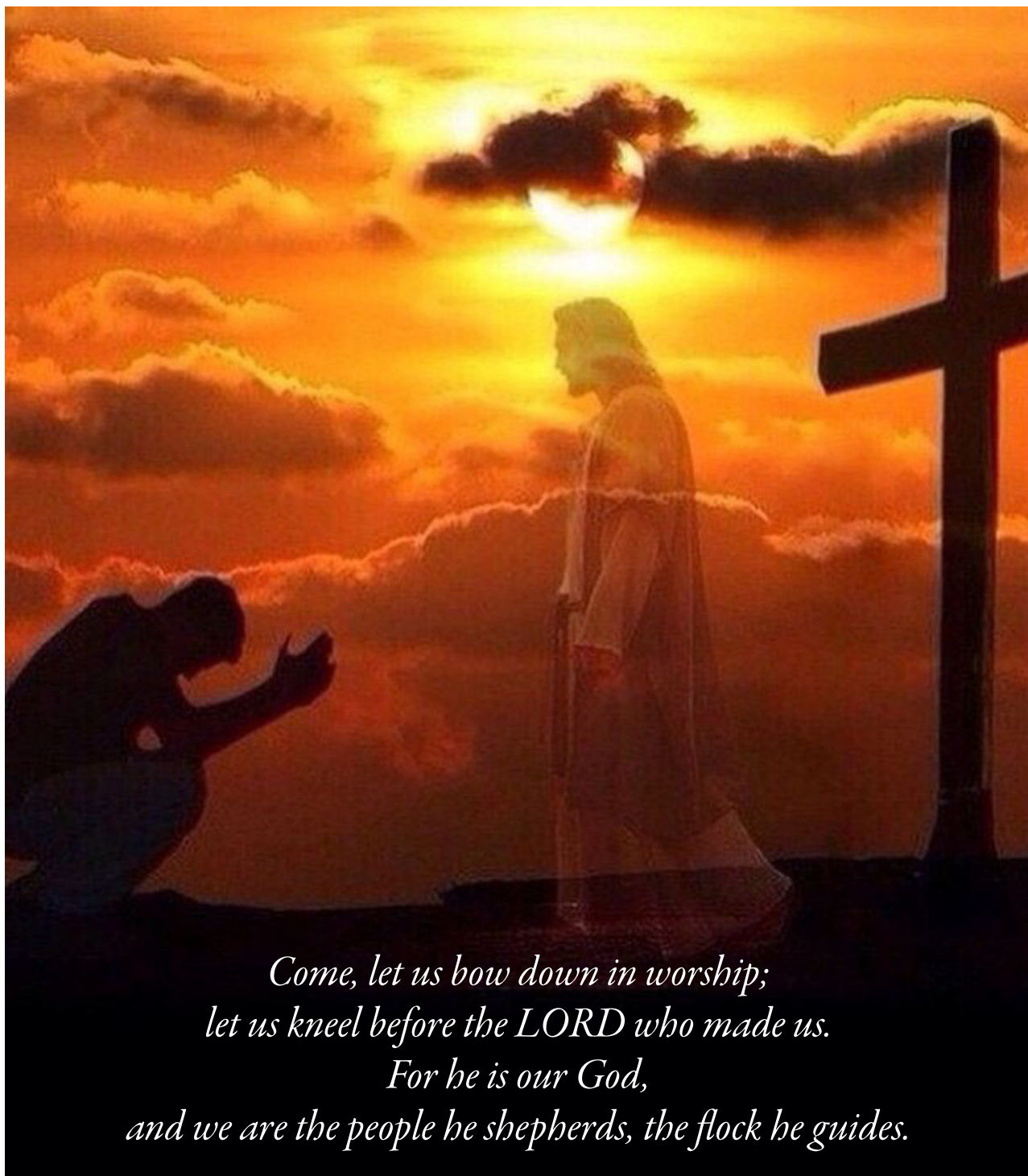

Deacon's Corner

Why are we worried?

Psychologists tell us that anxiety is the number one mental illness affecting Americans. There are more than 40 million adults who suffer from some type of anxiety – that's almost 20% of us, or 1 in 5!

In our Second Reading today, St. Paul addresses the issue of anxiety. He tells us, "An unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how he may please the Lord. But a married man is anxious about the things of the world, how he may please his wife, and he is divided. An unmarried woman or a virgin is anxious about the things of the Lord, so that she may be holy in both body and spirit. A married woman, on the other hand, is anxious about the things of the world, how she may please her husband."

The point is that it is hard for us to be righteous and true to our faith and balance that with our responsibilities in this world, and we all struggle with that. Whether we are still in school, in the workplace, or retired, there are so many things in our world that we seem to constantly be juggling, so many things that need to be done, and there doesn't seem to be enough time or energy to do it all. There doesn't seem to be enough of us to make it happen.

St. Paul is trying to encourage us not to fall into this trap. He's not telling us that we don't have to be concerned about our worldly responsibilities. No, quite the opposite. St. Paul knows that those obligations are real, but he also recognizes they oftentimes cause us to be divided, split between our commitment to them and our dedication to God. The reality is we can only do so much.

The key to resolving the conflict is found in our Gospel. Jesus repeatedly demonstrates by his actions that he has ultimate authority over our physical world as well as the spiritual realm. Jesus is the key to ridding ourselves of anxiety, and if we are able to live the Christ-centered life to which we are called, we will be able to put all of the worldly conflicts in perspective, a perspective based in love. Love and achievement, love and getting things done, love and the latest and greatest thing, are oftentimes not the same thing.

Some of our anxieties are perhaps because of perspective – maybe we're looking at the world from the world's view and not through the eyes of faith, through the eyes of Jesus. When anxiety rears its head in our lives, perhaps we can take a moment and think about why. Are we looking at our situation how Jesus would see it? Are we trusting in the promises of God? Are we faithful in the matters that God has given to us? Do we need a "reset", and perhaps need to go to Confession? Do we need to forgive someone else? Do we need to simply let God be God, and move out of the way?

Let nothing trouble you. Let nothing frighten you. All things are passing away: Only God never changes. Patience obtains all things. Whoever has God lacks nothing at all. God alone is enough and is sufficient. ~St. Teresa of Avila

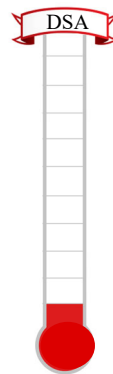
