

# Deacon's Corner

The readings this weekend encourage digging at the roots of our problems and propose fundamental change. The reading from Baruch senses a radical shift in current events about to unfold, and exhorts the people of Israel to "Take off the garment of your sorrow and affliction," and "put on forever the beauty of the glory of God." Paul's letter to the Philippians encourages them to be "pure and blameless" in order that they may fully experience the "day of Christ." An old way of life is to be put aside in order to enjoy the "fruits of righteousness." John the Baptist appears in the gospel of Luke preaching a "baptism of repentance." Preparation for the coming of Christ would require a major change of heart.

Improvement always means change. If we hope for a more productive and happy life, some changes in our life patterns will have to occur. Generally, the deeper the change the better. Developing better relationships, for example, with one's family and friends, may result from being more pleasant, but also may demand spending more quality time with them by cutting down on other commitments. Improving physical health will not only require the avoidance of fattening foods, but a full commitment to proper nutrition and exercise. In terms of spiritual growth, change will often mean something more than cosmetic touch-ups. According to today's readings, growing in the way of the Lord does not discount developing a better prayer life, or performing works of charity, but points to something more radical: a fundamental change of heart. This means going beyond correcting petty faults and bothersome idiosyncrasies and looking at what <u>drives</u> us. Not only taking measure of bad language, but of bad attitudes. Not only examining problems, but our priorities. Not only evaluating behavior, but our hearts.

Make this Advent productive by giving serious reflection to important changes you might need to make in your life.



#### Ministerio Hispano

II Domingo de Adviento: predicar incluso en el desierto En castellano, predicar en el desierto es sinónimo de perder el tiempo intentando convencer a alguien que se niega a escuchar. Es posible que en el lenguaje bíblico no quisiera decir exactamente lo mismo, pues el desierto estaba habitado por los nómadas. En nuestra época, sin embargo, el concepto parece más actual que nunca. Con frecuencia nos sentimos rodeados de un desierto de soledad. A nuestro alrededor muchos, si no todos, dan la impresión de ignorar o despreciar la fe. A pesar de que las iglesias siguen congregando a mucha gente, tenemos la sensación de que somos una pequeña minoría en retroceso. Por eso la llegada de la Navidad que estamos preparando con el Adviento nos invita a vencer este sentimiento derrotista y a lanzarnos a la misión, comunicándoles a esos que nos rodean y hacen oídos sordos, la buena noticia del amor de Dios. Muchos se encogerán de hombros, otros se reirán de nosotros y nos dirán que cómo es posible seguir creyendo en estas cosas en el siglo XXI. Pero no faltarán quienes estén aguardando el mensaje y que, gracias a que se lo proclamamos, lo reciben y se adhieren a él. No debemos olvidar que cada persona tiene su momento y que incluso aquellos que un momento antes se han burlado, pueden estar receptivos debido a que el dolor ha pasado por su vida y les ha purificado. Prediquemos, pues, siempre. Prediquemos incluso en el desierto. Pero prediquemos sobre todo y ante todo en aquel sitio donde la responsabilidad es mayor: la propia familia.
