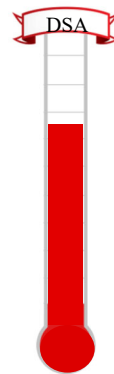

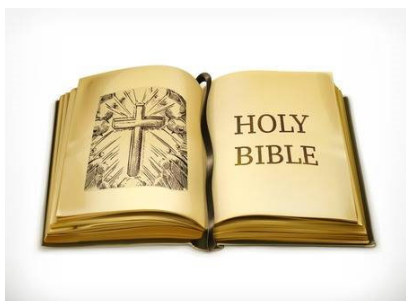

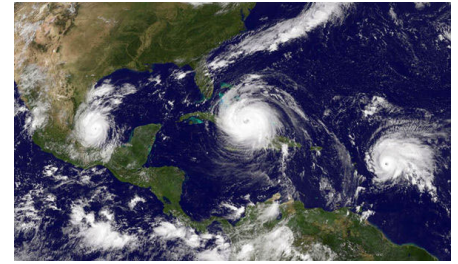

Check to see if you are in an evacuation area.

Have all of your documents in a waterproof container—Have cash on hand.

Special Medical Needs

Pre-register for a Special Care Shelter if you need oxygen, nebulizer treatments or are on a ventilator.
Go to readyabc.com and fill out the information or Call 561-712-6400. Shelters fill up fast!

Necessary Supplies—TWO WEEK Supply

Prescription medications/special dietary needs.
First aid kit and personal hygiene—toilet paper and hand sanitizer.
Portable radio, flashlight, clock— Cell phone (fully CHARGED) - Extra batteries.
Baby food, diapers, formula, etc.
Bottled water for drinking (1 gallon/person/day)—fill your bathtub before the storm hits for washing.
Pillows, blankets, sleeping bags, extra clothes.
Food supplies that do not require preparation—remember a can opener—Don't forget your pet food.
Mosquito repellent, disposable plates, cups, utensils, trash bags, dried fruits, nuts, crackers.
Tools, nails, duct tape—gasoline—fill your cars.

Ministerio Hispano

Catequesis del Papa Francisco sobre la Eucaristía: “La Palabra de Dios penetra en los corazones abiertos”

Después de habernos detenido en los ritos de introducción, consideramos ahora la Liturgia de la Palabra, que es una parte constitutiva porque nos reunimos precisamente para escuchar lo que Dios ha hecho y pretende hacer todavía por nosotros. Cuando se lee la Palabra de Dios en la Biblia —la primera Lectura, la segunda, el Salmo responsorial y el Evangelio— debemos escuchar, abrir el corazón, porque es Dios mismo que nos habla y no pensar en otras cosas o hablar de otras cosas. Os explicaré qué sucede en esta Liturgia de la Palabra. Las páginas de la Biblia cesan de ser un escrito para convertirse en palabra viva, pronunciada por Dios. Es Dios quien, a través de la persona que lee, nos habla e interpela para que escuchemos con fe. El Espíritu «que habló por medio de los profetas» (Credo) y ha inspirado a los autores sagrados, hace que «para que la Palabra de Dios actúe realmente en los corazones lo que hace es resonar en los oídos» Pero para escuchar la Palabra de Dios es necesario tener también el corazón abierto para recibir la palabra en el corazón. Dios habla y nosotros escuchamos, para después poner en práctica lo que hemos escuchado. Es muy importante escuchar. Algunas veces quizá no entendemos bien porque hay algunas lecturas un poco difíciles. Pero Dios nos habla igualmente de otra manera. [Es necesario estar] en silencio y escuchar la Palabra de Dios. No os olvidéis de esto. En la misa, cuando empiezan las lecturas, escuchamos la Palabra de Dios. ¡Necesitamos escucharlo!...
